ROYAL ULSTER CONSTABULARY

Pay

ORDER, DATED 12TH NOVEMBER 1968, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE CONSTABULARY AND POLICE (IRELAND) ACT 1919 AND SECTION 2 OF THE CONSTABULARY ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1922.

I, The Right Honourable William Craig, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 4 of the Constabulary and Police (Ireland) Act 1919(a) and section 2 of the Constabulary Act (Northern Ireland) 1922(b), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby order as follows:—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Royal Ulster Constabulary Pay (Amendment) Order 1968.

Commencement and Duration

2. This Order shall have effect only for the period from the 1st July 1967, until the 31st January 1969.

Amendment

3. In Schedule I of the Royal Ulster Constabulary Pay Order 1967(c) for the rates of annual pay after 4 years' service, the amounts shown in the following table shall be substituted:—

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Order provides as an interim measure for increases in the maximum points of the pay scales of the Inspector General, the Deputy Inspector General and the Commissioner, Belfast for the period from 1st July 1967 (when the pay of other ranks was revised) to 31st January 1969.
