Wages Regulation (Boot and Shoe Repairing)

ORDER, DATED 12TH MARCH 1968, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1945.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland) 1945(a), hereby makes the following Order to give effect to wages regulation proposals received from the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Council (Northern Ireland): —

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1968.

Commencement

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date and on the day immediately preceding that date the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1967(b) shall cease to have effect.

Interpretation

(L.S.)

3. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 26th day of March 1968, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order, which comes into operation on 26th March 1968, amends the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland) 1960 (Order N.I.B.S. (85)), as amended by the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1967 (Order N.I.B.S. (102)), by increasing the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by those Orders.

Order N.I.B.S. (102) is revoked.

New provisions in the Schedule are printed in italics.
