INDUSTRIAL TRAINING**Distributive Industry Training Board**

ORDER, DATED 16TH MAY 1969, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER THE INDUSTRIAL TRAINING ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1964.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") after consultation with organisations and associations of organisations appearing to it to be representative respectively of substantial numbers of employers engaging in the activities hereinafter mentioned and of substantial numbers of persons employed in those activities and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 1 of, and paragraphs 1 and 7 of Schedule 1 to, the Industrial Training Act (Northern Ireland) 1964(a) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Industrial Training (Distributive Board) Order (Northern Ireland) 1969.

Establishment of Industrial Training Board

2. An industrial training board to be known as the Distributive Industry Training Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") is hereby established to exercise in relation to the activities specified in Schedule 1 as the activities of the distributive industry the functions conferred on industrial training boards by the Act.

Membership and proceedings of the Board

3. The Provisions of Schedule 2 shall have effect in relation to the Board.

SCHEDULE 1

The Distributive Industry

1. Subject to the provisions of this Schedule, the activities of the distributive industry are the following activities in so far as they are carried out in Northern Ireland:—

- (a) dealing in goods;
- (b) operating a broadcast relay station;
- (c) letting out on hire audio or video receiving apparatus;
- (d) the installation, testing, inspection or repair of audio or video receiving apparatus or of transmission lines connected with such apparatus, being operations carried out in furtherance of an agreement made between a person carrying on the business of selling or hiring out such apparatus or of operating a broadcast relay station and a person to whom such apparatus has been sold or hired or who is a subscriber to the service provided from such a station;
- (e) operating a trading stamp scheme;
- (f) operating a business of check trading;
- (g) any activities (other than those above mentioned), being—
 - (i) related activities incidental or ancillary to principal activities of the distributive industry; or
 - (ii) activities undertaken in the administration, control or direction of one or more establishments, being establishments engaged wholly or mainly in principal activities of that industry, in related activities incidental or ancillary thereto, or in the administration, control or direction of one or more other establishments engaged in such principal or related activities; and carried out, in either case, by the employer engaged in those principal activities or, where that employer is a company, by the company or by an associated company of the company;
- (h) any activities of industry or commerce (other than distributive activities) carried out at or from an establishment mainly engaged—
 - (i) in distributive activities; or
 - (ii) in distributive activities and in activities described in the Appendix, but to a greater extent in distributive activities than in activities described in that Appendix in relation to any one industry.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Schedule, there shall not be included in the activities of the distributive industry:—

- (a) the activities of any establishment engaged—
 - (i) mainly in activities not being distributive activities or activities described in the Appendix; or
 - (ii) to a lesser extent in distributive activities than in activities described in that Appendix in relation to any one industry;
- (b) the activities of any establishment engaged wholly or mainly in related activities, being activities—
 - (i) incidental or ancillary to the activities of one or more establishments (in this sub-paragraph hereinafter referred to as "the principal establishment") engaged wholly or mainly in any activities not being principal activities of the distributive industry; and
 - (ii) carried out by the employer carrying on the principal establishment or, where that employer is a company, by the company or by an associated company of the company;
- (c) the activities of any establishment engaged wholly or mainly in—
 - (i) any activities of a kind specified in an entry (not being item No. 21) in the second column of the next following Table (being activities undertaken

- in relation to all or any of the goods specified in the corresponding entry in the third column of that Table) or in two or more of such entries; or
- (ii) any activities of a kind specified in item No. 21 in the second column of the said Table, being activities undertaken in relation to any goods comprised in one or two (but not more than two) of the categories specified in the corresponding entry in the third column thereof;

(d) the activities of any establishment engaged wholly or mainly in business as follows—

- (i) in banking, finance or insurance, not being activities specified in sub-paragraphs (e) or (f) of paragraph 1;
- (ii) as exporters, not being activities to which sub-paragraph (g)(i) of the said paragraph 1 applies;
- (iii) as futures brokers; or
- (iv) as shipping and forwarding agents;

(e) the activities of—

- (i) an Air Corporation or the British Airports Authority;
- (ii) the British Broadcasting Corporation;
- (iii) any body or person authorised by or under any enactment to construct, work, maintain or carry on any undertaking for the supply of electricity, gas or water;
- (iv) the Independent Television Authority;
- (v) the Northern Ireland Tourist Board;
- (vi) a local authority; or
- (vii) a marketing board;

(f) the activities of any company, association or body that is required by its constitution to apply its profits, if any, or other income in promoting its objects and is prohibited thereby from paying any dividend to its members, and that has for its sole or principal object or among its principal objects the provision of facilities for any of the purposes mentioned in section 15(1) of the Disabled Persons (Employment) Act (Northern Ireland) 1945(b) (which relates to the provision for registered persons who are seriously disabled of employment or work on their own account under special conditions and of training for such employment or work);

(g) the activities of any local authority in the provision of sheltered employment carried on in accordance with arrangements under section 3 of the Disabled Persons (Employment) Act (Northern Ireland) 1960(c), or any other enactment that authorises or requires the provision of arrangements

for persons suffering from illness, severe physical defect or disability or from mental disorder, or for persons who have been suffering from illness or whose care is undertaken with a view to preventing them from becoming ill, or for old people;

(h) the activities following—

- (i) any activities undertaken personally in the exercise of his profession as such by an individual who is a registered pharmacist or a registered optician;
- (ii) any operations when carried out by a member of the crew of an aircraft, by the master or a member of the crew of a ship or by a person ordinarily employed as a seaman who is employed in or about a ship in port by the owner or charterer thereof on work of a kind ordinarily done by a seaman on a ship while it is in port; or
- (iii) dock work performed by a dock worker; or
- (i) the supply of food or drink to persons being a supply—
 - (i) for immediate consumption;
 - (ii) of hot fried fish or hot chipped potatoes; or
 - (iii) by means of an automatic vending machine at or in connection with a restaurant, café, snack bar, canteen, mess room or similar place of refreshment.

3. In this Schedule—

“agricultural and horticultural machinery or equipment” means any machinery, plant, equipment or appliance designed primarily or adapted for use in agriculture or horticulture;

“Air Corporation” means the British Overseas Airways Corporation or the British European Airways Corporation, and includes B.O.A.C. Associated Companies Limited and B.E.A. Helicopters Limited;

“animals” includes birds, fishes and reptiles;

“architectural and builders’ ironmongery” means fittings or attachments to doors or windows or the frames thereof, being fittings or attachments constructed wholly or mainly of metal or of metal and plastics material;

“audio or video receiving apparatus” does not include apparatus used or intended for use on a ship;

“bread” includes rolls, baps, fancy loaves, milk loaves, malt loaves and fruit loaves;

“broadcast relay station” means a station for the re-transmission by cable or wire, to the customers of the persons operating the station, of broadcast radio or television programmes which those persons receive either by cable or wire or by wireless from the persons who broadcast the programmes;

“business” means a trade or business carried on for the purposes of gain;

“business of check trading” means a business carried on by any person in the course whereof financial facilities are provided in relation to the acquisition of goods from that or any other person and, in connection with the provision of those facilities, there are supplied, for a consideration payable in a lump sum or by instalments or in some other manner, any checks, orders, vouchers, tallies or similar documents or things issued to facilitate the acquisition of goods;

“company” includes any body corporate, and “subsidiary” has the same meaning as by virtue of section 148 of the Companies Act (Northern Ireland) 1960 (a) it has for the purposes of that Act;

“dealing” means by way of business and in the capacity of principal, agent or broker—

(i) in relation to goods situate in Northern Ireland, buying or selling such goods;

(ii) in relation to goods situate elsewhere, importing such goods into Northern Ireland;

but does not include any transaction in the nature of an auction;

“distributive activities” means any one or more of the principal activities of the distributive industry and the activities included in that industry by virtue of paragraph 1(g);

- "dock worker" has the same meaning as in section 6(8) of the Contracts of Employment and Redundancy Payments Act (Northern Ireland) 1965(e);
- "drug or medicine" means any substance or article which is used wholly or mainly by being administered to human beings or animals for one or more of the purposes following, that is to say—
- (i) treating or preventing disease;
 - (ii) diagnosing disease or ascertaining the existence, degree or extent of a physiological condition;
 - (iii) contraception;
 - (iv) inducing anaesthesia;
 - (v) otherwise preventing or interfering with the normal operation of a physiological function, whether permanently or temporarily, and whether by way of terminating, reducing or postponing, or increasing or accelerating, the operation of that function or in any other way;
- and for the purpose of this definition "disease" includes any injury, ailment or adverse condition, whether of body or mind;
- "fish" includes freshwater fish, sea fish, shell fish, crustaceans and molluscs of any kind and any parts of fish as so defined, but does not include any product that is bottled or canned or that is frozen and packed in printed cartons or in printed wrappers;
- "flour confectionery" includes cakes, oatcakes, shortbread, biscuits and articles of food made wholly or partly of pastry, but does not include any product that is frozen and packed in printed cartons or in printed wrappers;
- "glasses" means any appliances designed to correct, remedy or relieve any defect of sight, and includes spectacles of the kind known as sunglasses;
- "goods" includes all chattels personal other than things in action and money, but does not include emblements, industrial growing crops or things attached to or forming part of the land;
- "hearing aids" means appliances designed to correct, remedy or relieve, any defect of hearing;
- "horticultural produce" includes fruit, nuts, hops, potatoes, vegetables, water-cress, fungi, bulbs, corms, rhizomes, tubers, flowers, pot, bedding or herbaceous plants, decorative foliage, herbs, shrubs and trees, but does not include fruit or vegetables that are bottled or canned or that are frozen and packed in printed cartons or in printed wrappers;
- "intoxicating liquor" has the same meaning as in section 307(1) of the Customs and Excise Act 1952(f);
- "iron" and "steel" include respectively alloy iron and alloy steel containing in each case more than 55 per cent. of pure iron by weight;
- "local authority" means the council of a county, county or other borough, or of an urban or rural district;
- "marketing board" means the British Egg Marketing Board, the British Wool Marketing Board, the Seed Potato Marketing Board for Northern Ireland, the Pigs Marketing Board for Northern Ireland, or the Milk Marketing Board for Northern Ireland;
- "meat" means the flesh (including edible offal and fat) of animals or birds that is intended for human or animal consumption and includes sausages and sausage meat, but does not include bacon; ham, meat paste, poultry paste, sausage casings or any products that are canned or that are frozen and packed in printed cartons or in printed wrappers;
- "milk" includes cream and separated milk, but does not include condensed, evaporated or dried milk or canned cream;
- "motor vehicles" means mechanically propelled vehicles intended or adapted for use on roads, and includes tram-cars and trolley vehicles, but does not include implements for cutting grass that are not capable of being used or adapted for any other purpose, or contractors' plant; and for the purposes of this definition "contractors' plant" means machinery, plant or equipment of a kind intended for use in operations on the site of any building work or civil engineering work, but does not include lorries, ready-mixed concrete vehicles or other mechanically propelled vehicles mainly used for the carriage of goods on roads;

“office premises” has the same meaning as in section 1(2) of the Office and Shop Premises Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(g);

“principal activities of the distributive industry” means activities which, subject to the provisions of paragraph 2, are specified in paragraph 1, other than sub-paragraphs (g) and (h) thereof, as activities of the distributive industry;

“publishing” in relation to any publication of a kind referred to in item No. 16 of the Table in paragraph 2(c) means, by way of business, issuing the same for sale or distribution to the public;

“related activities” means any of the following activities, that is to say—

- (i) research, development, design or drawing;
- (ii) buying, selling, letting out on hire, testing, advertising, packing, distribution, transport or any similar operations;
- (iii) operations of a kind performed at office premises or laboratories;
- (iv) operations of a kind performed at stores, warehouses or similar places;
- (v) cleaning, washing or garaging vehicles or carrying out running repairs or minor adjustments thereto;
- (vi) training of employees or apprentices;

“seeds” includes agricultural or horticultural seeds, cereal seeds, vegetable seeds, flower seeds, seeds of grasses whether used for agricultural, horticultural or other purposes, seeds of trees and seed potatoes, but does not include oilseeds;

“selling by retail” in relation to any goods means selling such goods by way of business to a person buying otherwise than for the purpose of re-sale, use in manufacture or processing, and includes in relation to any article of food or drink selling the same to a person for use in connection with an establishment carried on by him in the catering industry or for use in connection with the supply to persons in his employment of food or drink for immediate consumption, when such selling takes place at or in connection with a shop engaged in the sale by retail of articles of food or drink to the general public;

“ship” includes any description of ship, vessel, boat or other floating craft, but does not include a hovercraft or any article that is inflatable by air, gas or liquid;

“soft drink” has the same meaning as in Regulation 2(1) of the Soft Drinks Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1964(h);

“textile fibres” means any fibres consisting, or including more than 15 per cent. by weight, of animal fibres of any kind or mixture, and includes any other fibres or continuous filaments when used or intended for use in a textile factory for the production of yarns or fabrics by a system of manufacture similar to one commonly employed in the production of woollen or worsted yarns or fabrics;

“trade mark” includes a registered trade mark and an unregistered trade mark, but does not include a certification trade mark, and for the purposes of this definition “certification trade mark” has the same meaning as in section 37 of the Trade Marks Act 1938(i);

“trading stamp scheme” has the meaning assigned to that expression by section 9 of the Trading Stamps Act (Northern Ireland) 1965(j);

“trailers” means trailers drawn by motor vehicles;

“transport service equipment” means plant or equipment of a kind used in the testing or analysis of performance of motor vehicles or trailers, in their repair or in their recovery when damaged;

“yarn” means yarn consisting of textile fibres.

4. For the purposes of this Schedule, two companies shall be taken to be associated companies if one is a subsidiary of the other or both are subsidiaries of a third company, and “associated company” shall be construed accordingly.

SCHEDULE 2

Membership

1. A casual vacancy occurring in the membership of the Board shall be filled by a person who shall be appointed or appointed after consultation in like manner as the person whom he replaces was appointed.

2. The term of office of members of the Board shall be three years or such other period as may be determined by the Ministry at the time the appointments are made but a person appointed to fill a casual vacancy shall hold office only for the remainder of the term for which the member he replaces was appointed.

3. If a member of the Board—

(a) is absent from meetings of the Board for more than six months consecutively, unless his absence is due to illness or some other reason approved by the Ministry; or

(b) becomes in the opinion of the Ministry unfit to continue in office or incapable of performing his duties;

the Ministry may declare the office of that member to be vacant and shall notify the fact in such manner as it shall think fit, and thereupon the office of the member shall become vacant.

4. A member of the Board may at any time resign from the Board by giving to the Ministry a notice in writing signed by him of his resignation.

5. A person who has held office as a member of the Board shall be eligible for reappointment.

Proceedings and Meetings

6. At a meeting of the Board one half of the members shall be the quorum and if the number so ascertained includes a fraction the nearest higher whole number of members but at any meeting at which it is resolved to impose a levy the said quorum of one half shall include one half of the members appointed as mentioned in paragraph 3(1)(a) of Schedule 1 to the Act.

7. The chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Board at which he shall be present, but if at any meeting the said chairman be not present within 5 minutes of the time appointed for holding the meeting the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of the meeting.

8. At a meeting of the Board a resolution put to the vote on any matter not relating to the imposition of a levy shall be decided on a show of hands of the members present and voting; each member shall have one vote and if the votes are equally divided the chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote.

9.—(1) If at a meeting of the Board a resolution relating to the imposition of a levy is put to the vote of the members appointed as mentioned in paragraph 3(1)(a) of Schedule 1 to the Act, each such member shall have one vote, and the resolution shall be decided by a show of hands of those members present and voting unless a poll is demanded by any such member (before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands) in which case the poll shall be taken forthwith and the votes may be given either personally or by proxy.

(2) The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointer, and the proxy shall be a member of the Board appointed as mentioned in paragraph 3(1)(a) of Schedule 1 to the Act.

(3) An instrument appointing a proxy shall be in the following form or a form as near thereto as circumstances admit:—

(4) A vote given in accordance with the terms of an instrument of proxy shall be valid notwithstanding the previous death or insanity of the principal or revocation of the proxy, provided that no intimation in writing of any such death, insanity or revocation shall have been received by the Board at its office before the commencement of the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the proxy is used.

10. Minutes shall be kept of the proceedings of the Board and any such minutes shall, if signed by any person purporting to have acted as chairman of the meeting or at a meeting at which they were read, be evidence of the proceedings at the first-mentioned meeting, and a meeting to which any such minutes relate shall, unless the contrary is proved, be taken to have been regularly convened and constituted.

11. The Board shall have an office at which communications and notices will at all times be received.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order, which is made under the Industrial Training Act (Northern Ireland) 1964, establishes an industrial training board to be known as the Distributive Industry Training Board, and defines the industry to which it relates. Provision is made as to the membership of the Board and its meetings and proceedings.
