PLANT HEALTH**Importation of Plants, Plant Produce and Trees**

ORDER, DATED 10TH JUNE 1969, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER THE PLANT HEALTH ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1967.

The Ministry of Agriculture in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 2 of the Plant Health Act (Northern Ireland) 1967(a), and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation and Commencement

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Importation of Plants, Plant Produce and Trees (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1969.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on the 10th June 1969.

Amendment of Principal Order

2. Schedule 1 to the Importation of Plants, Plant Produce and Trees Order (Northern Ireland) 1967(b) is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) In place of the words in the second column describing item (1) in Part IA there shall be substituted the words “Annual and biennial plants grown in any place outside Europe and beet, mangold, fodder beet and sugar beet (*Beta* spp.) and spinach (*Spinacia* spp.) grown in Europe”.

(b) In place of the words in the second column describing item (3) in Part IA there shall be substituted the words “Sloe, bullace, cherry plum, plum, apricot, peach (*Prunus spinosa* L., *P. insititia* L., *P. cerasifera* Ehrh., *P. domestica* L., *P. salicina* Lindl., *P. armeniaca* L., *P. persica* (L.) Batsch, *P. tribola* Lindl., *P. tomentosa* Thunb.) grown in Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Poland, Rumania or Yugoslavia”.

(c) For the figure “(3)” appearing in the entry relating to *Prunus* L. in the second column in the description of item (6) in Part IC there shall be substituted the figure “(12)”.

(d) In place of the words in the second column describing item (11) in Part IC there shall be substituted the words “Sloe, bullace, cherry plum, plum, apricot, peach (*Prunus spinosa* L., *P. insititia* L., *P. cerasifera* Ehrh., *P. domestica* L., *P. salicina* Lindl., *P. armeniaca* L., *P. persica* (L.) Batsch, *P. tribola* Lindl., *P. tomentosa* Thunb.) grown in any country in Europe other than those named in item (3) of this Schedule or grown in any country outside Europe in which the virus disease Sharka (Plum Pox) is known to occur”.

(e) In place of the words in the second column describing item (12) in Part IC there shall be substituted the words “*Prunus* L. (including *Amygdalus* L., *Armeniaca* Mill., *Cerasus* Adan., *Laurocerasus* Roem., *Padus* Mill. and *Prunophora* Neck.) spp. plants grown in any country in which the disease Bacterial Spot (*Xanthomonas pruni* (E. F. Smith) Dowson) is known to occur”.

(f) Item (13) in Part IC described in the second column together with the words in the third column opposite thereto shall be omitted.

- (g) In place of the words in the second column describing item (22) in Part IIIA there shall be substituted the words "Raw cherries grown in Italy, Portugal or Spain".
- (h) In place of the words in the second column describing item (23) in Part IIIA there shall be substituted the words "Raw cherries grown in Austria, Bulgaria, that part of France which is south of latitude 46° North, Hungary or Yugoslavia".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order amends Schedule 1 to the Importation of Plants, Plant Produce and Trees Order (Northern Ireland) 1967.

Article 5 of that Order imposes prohibitions and restrictions on the landing in Northern Ireland of plants, certain seeds, raw fruit, raw vegetables and forest trees described in the First Schedule. The present Order removes one item from that Schedule and amends the description of a number of others.
