Rainbow Trout Waters

Bye-laws, dated 30th June 1969, made by the Fisheries Conservancy Board for Northern Ireland with the approval of the Ministry of Agriculture under Section 26 of the Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1966.

The Fisheries Conservancy Board for Northern Ireland in exercise of its powers under Section 26 of the Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, with the approval of the Ministry of Agriculture hereby makes the following Bye-laws:—

- 1. These Bye-laws may be cited as the Rainbow Trout Waters Bye-laws (Northern Ireland) 1969.
 - 2. These Bye-laws shall come into effect on 4th July 1969.
- 3. The undernamed waters are hereby designated as Rainbow Trout Waters and there shall be no close season for angling for rainbow trout thereon:—

Screeby Lake, Co. Tyrone.
Tullynawood, Co. Armagh.
Darkley Lake, Co. Armagh.
Kernan Lake, Co. Armagh.
Castledillon Lake, Co. Armagh.

Mossley Mill Pond, Co. Antrim.
Ballymartin Lough, Co. Down.
Ballymacashon Lough, Co. Down.
Holybank Bleachworks Dam, Belfast.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Bye-laws but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These Bye-laws designate a number of waters as rainbow trout waters and provide that there shall be no close season for angling for rainbow trout in those waters.
