ORDER, DATED 26TH AUGUST 1969, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE CONSTABULARY AND POLICE (IRELAND) ACT 1919 AND SECTION 2 OF THE CONSTABULARY ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1922.

I, the Right Honourable Robert W. Porter, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by Section 4 of the Constabulary and Police (Ireland) Act 1919(a) and Section 2 of the Constabulary Act (Northern Ireland) 1922(b) and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf do hereby order as follows:—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Royal Ulster Constabulary Pay (Amendment) (No. 3) Order 1969.

Amendments

2. The Royal Ulster Constabulary Pay Order 1967(c) (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order") shall be amended in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.

3. In Article 4(2) of the principal Order for the words "Schedule I shall have effect from 1st July 1967" there shall be substituted the words "Table 1 of Schedule I shall have effect from 1st August 1968 until 30th June 1969. Table 2 of Schedule I shall have effect from 1st July 1969".

4. For Schedule I of the principal Order there shall be substituted the following Schedule:—

(a) 9 & 10 Geo. 5. c. 68.
(b) 12 & 13 Geo. 5. c. 8 (N.I.).

This Order provides for an increase in the scales of pay for the Inspector General, the Deputy Inspector General and the Commissioner, Belfast, with effect from 1st August 1968.

A further change is made with effect from 1st July 1969, from which date the Inspector General is placed on a fixed salary instead of a scale.
