### LOCAL ELECTIONS-OASUAL VACANCIES

ORDER IN COUNCIL, DATED 2ND OCTOBER 1969, MADE UNDER THE ELECTORAL LAW ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1962.

BY THE GOVERNOR IN THE PRIVY COUNCIL OF NORTHERN IRELAND,

#### GREY OF NAUNTON

Whereas by Section 13(5)(a) of the Electoral Law (Northern Ireland) Act 1962(a) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1962") it is provided that a casual vacancy occurring in a Local Authority at any time after the election day in any local election year and before the first day of January in the next succeeding election year shall, if a vacancy for any member other than an alderman, be filled in accordance with the Local Elections Rules contained in Schedule 5 to the Act of 1962.

And whereas Rule 50 of the said Local Elections Rules provides in effect that where a casual vacancy exists among the councillors of a county borough or borough a bye-election shall be held if more than one candidate stands validly nominated.

And whereas under Section 57(3) of the Act of 1962 the provisions of the Local Elections Rules may be varied by an Order in Council.\*

And whereas the Minister of Home Affairs, by reason of the unrest and tension at present existing among certain sections of the community, made an Order dated 25th September 1969, prohibiting the holding of all public processions and outdoor meetings (other than a procession or meeting held by the Salvation Army) in any public place in Northern Ireland for the period from 1st October 1969, to 31st December 1969.

And whereas by reason of the aforesaid Order it is expedient to postpone the holding of bye-elections to fill casual vacancies in any Local Authority, being a county borough during the aforesaid period.

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Now therefore, I, Ralph Francis Alnwick, Baron Grey of Naunton, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the said Section 57(3) and of all other powers me thereunto enabling do hereby order as follows:—

# Citation and Commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Electoral Law (Local Bye-Elections in County Boroughs (Postponement)) Order (Northern Ireland) 1969.

#### Variation of Time-Table 1

2. For the purposes of filling a casual vacancy existing or occurring among the councillors of a county borough between the date of this Order and the 31st December 1969, Time-table I of the Local Elections Rules set out in Schedule 5 to the Electoral Law Act (Northern Ireland) 1962 shall have effect as if in column (4) of Proceeding 1 for the reference "not later than seven days before the nomination day" there were substituted a reference to "not earlier than the first day of January 1970" and in column (4) of Proceeding 2 for the reference to "not later than twenty-one days after the date of the occurrence of the vacancy, as the returning officer shall fix" there were substituted a reference to "not later than twenty-one days after the first day of January 1970, as the returning officer shall fix".

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note does not form part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order varies the Local Elections Rules contained in Schedule 5 to the Electoral Law Act (Northern Ireland) 1962 so as to provide that byeelections to fill casual vacancies existing or occurring among Councillors of a county borough shall not take place until after the 1st January 1970.
