RESIDENT MAGISTRATES: SALARIES AND ALLOWANCES

ORDER, DATED 28TH OCTOBER 1969, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS WITH THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MINISTER OF FINANCE, UNDER SECTION 12(1) OF THE MAGISTRATES' COURTS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1964.

I, The Right Honourable Robert Wilson Porter, Q.C., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by Section 12(1) of the Magistrates' Courts Act (Northern Ireland) 1964(a) do hereby make the following Order:—

Citation and Commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Resident Magistrates (Salaries and Allowances) Order (Northern Ireland) 1969 and shall have effect as from the 23rd July 1969.

Revocation

2. The Resident Magistrates (Salaries and Allowances) Order (Northern Ireland) 1967(b) is hereby revoked.

Salaries of Resident Magistrates

3.—(1) The annual salary payable to a Resident Magistrate appointed for the City of Belfast shall be £5550.

(2) The annual salary payable to every other Resident Magistrate shall be £5300.

Allowances of Resident Magistrates

4. In addition to the salary specified in Article 3 a Resident Magistrate shall be paid an allowance in respect of travelling, subsistence and incidental expenses at such rate and subject to such conditions as may from time to time be fixed by the Ministry of Home Affairs with the concurrence of the Ministry of Finance.

Salaries and Allowances of Deputy Resident Magistrates

5. The salary payable to a Deputy Resident Magistrate shall be at the rate of £18 for each day upon which he adjudicates, together with such allowances in respect of travelling, subsistence and incidental expenses as may from time to time be fixed by the Ministry of Home Affairs with the concurrence of the Ministry of Finance.
