SUPPLEMENTARY BENEFITS

Claims and Payments

REGULATIONS, DATED 3RD APRIL 1969, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER THE SUPPLEMENTARY BENEFITS ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1966 AND 1969.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services, in exercise of powers conferred by section 18(1)(e) of the Supplementary Benefits &c. Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(a) and section 2(4) of the National Insurance &c. Act (Northern Ireland) 1969(b), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations, which may be cited as the Supplementary Benefit (Claims and Payments) Amendment Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1969, shall be read as one with the Supplementary Benefit (Claims and Payments) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1966(c) (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations") and shall come into operation on 7th April 1969.

Regulation substituted for regulation 9 of the principal regulations

2. For the heading of regulation 9 of the principal regulations and for that regulation there shall be substituted respectively the following heading and regulation:

"Extinguishment of right to payment of sums by way of benefit where payment is not obtained within the prescribed period"

9.—(1) The right to payment of any sum by way of benefit shall, subject to paragraph (2), be extinguished where payment thereof is not obtained within the period of 12 months from the date on which the right is to be treated as having arisen; and for the purposes of this regulation the right shall be treated as having arisen—

- (a) in relation to any such sum contained in a serial order or draft which has been given or sent, for the purpose of making payment thereof, to the beneficiary or to a paying office for collection by him (whether or not received or collected as the case may be), notwithstanding that that sum is greater or less than the sum to which the beneficiary has the right to payment—
 - (i) on the date on the said serial order or draft; or
 - (ii) if a further order or draft has been so given or sent as a replacement for an order or draft previously given or sent, on the date on the last such order or draft;
- (b) in relation to any such sum to which sub-paragraph (a) does not apply, but where notice is given (whether orally or in writing) or is sent that the sum contained in the notice is available for collection, notwithstanding that that sum is greater or less than the sum to which the beneficiary has the right to payment—

- (i) if written notice is sent through the post, on the date on which it would be delivered in the ordinary course of post; and
 - (ii) in any other case, on the date of the notice; and if more than one such notice is given or sent, on the date determined by reference to the first such notice.
- (2) Where a question arises whether the right to payment of any sum by way of benefit has been extinguished by the operation of paragraph (1) and
- (a) after the expiration of the said period of 12 months the Ministry has received a request in writing for payment of that sum; and
 - (b) it is determined in accordance with the provisions of the Act that throughout a period commencing within the said period of 12 months and continuing up to the day on which the said request was made there was good cause for not making that request;

the right to payment of that sum shall, notwithstanding the provisions of that paragraph, be treated as having arisen on the date on which it is so determined.

(3) This regulation shall apply to a person authorised or appointed to act on behalf of a beneficiary as it applies to a beneficiary."

Amendment of regulation 13 of the principal regulations:

3. Regulation 13 of the principal regulations (payments on death) shall be amended as follows:

- (i) in paragraph (3) for the proviso there shall be substituted the following proviso:

"Provided that, for the purposes of the said regulation 9, the period of 12 months shall be calculated from the date on which the right to payment of any sum is treated as having arisen in relation to any such person and not from the date on which that right is treated as having arisen in relation to the deceased."

- (ii) in paragraph (4) for "six months" there shall be substituted "12 months".

Revival of right to payment of benefit

4. Where the right to payment of any sum by way of benefit fell to be extinguished on or after 6th March 1969 (being the date of the passing of the National Insurance &c. Act 1969(d)) and before the coming into operation of these regulations the right to payment of that sum shall be revived and any question arising with respect to that right shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of regulation 9 of the principal regulations as substituted by these regulations.

Transitional provisions

5. The provisions of regulation 9 of the principal regulations as substituted by these regulations shall apply to any right to a sum by way of benefit accruing before the coming into operation of these regulations except in the case of a right where—

- (a) the right became an accrued right more than 6 months before 6th March 1969; and
- (b) the application of the provisions of that regulation as in force before the coming into operation of these regulations has or would have resulted in that right being extinguished before 6th March 1969.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to
indicate their general purport.)*

These regulations extend from 6 months to 12 months the period after which the right to benefit is extinguished if payment has not been obtained. They also contain consequential and transitional provisions.

ROAD TRAFFIC: HIGHWAY CODE

ORDER*, DATED 7TH MARCH 1969, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION 64(3) OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1955 AS AMENDED BY SECTION 46 OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1964.

The Ministry of Home Affairs, in exercise of the powers vested in it by Section 64(3) of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1955(a) as amended by Section 46 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1964(b) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Road Traffic (Highway Code) (Increase in Price) Order (Northern Ireland) 1969 and shall come into operation on 8th April 1969.

2. Section 64(3) of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1955 shall have effect as though for the word "sixpence" there were substituted the words "one shilling and three pence".
