HOUSING**Housing Subsidy Order**

ORDER, DATED 15TH JUNE 1970, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF DEVELOPMENT, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE, UNDER SECTION 1 OF THE HOUSING (NO. 2) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1946.

The Ministry of Development (in this Order referred to as "the Ministry") with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Ministry by section 1 of the Housing (No. 2) Act (Northern Ireland) 1946(a), and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Housing Subsidy (Variation) (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 1970 and shall be construed as one with the Housing Subsidy Order (Northern Ireland) 1962(b).

2. In its application to a housing scheme in respect of which the tender has been submitted for approval to the Ministry after 15th June 1970, the Housing Subsidy Order (Northern Ireland) 1962 shall be amended by substituting for the Schedule contained therein the Schedule to this Order.

SUPPLEMENTARY BENEFITS

Determination of Requirements

REGULATIONS, DATED 18TH JUNE 1970, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES, WITH THE CONSENT OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE, UNDER THE SUPPLEMENTARY BENEFITS &C. ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1966.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services, with the consent of the Ministry of Finance, in exercise of powers conferred by section 4 of the Supplementary Benefits &c. Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Supplementary Benefit (Determination of Requirements) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1970 and shall come into operation on 2nd November 1970.

Amendment of provisions for calculating requirements

2.—(1) Schedule 2 to the Supplementary Benefits &c. Act (Northern Ireland) 1966 shall be varied in accordance with the following provisions.

(2) For paragraph 9 (normal requirements) and paragraph 10 (blind persons' requirements) of that Schedule, as varied(b), there shall be substituted the following paragraphs:
