Temporary Speed Limits

ORDER, DATED 14TH OCTOBER 1970, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION 44(4) OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1970.

The Ministry of Home Affairs in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 44(4) of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970(a) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders and directs as follows:—

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Roads (Temporary Speed Limit) (No. 3) Order (Northern Ireland) 1970 and shall come into operation on 15th October 1970.

Application and duration of speed limit

2. The length of road specified in the Schedule of the Roads (Temporary Speed Limit) (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 1970(b) shall be subject to a speed limit of thirty miles per hour for a period of four months.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

The 30 m.p.h. speed limit introduced on the Tobermore Road, Maghera, for 1,400 yards on 15th June 1970 for four months is by this Order continued in force for a further period of four months to enable construction work on the new fly-over across the A.29 route to be completed.
