WEIGHTS AND MEASURES

REGULATIONS, DATED 8TH APRIL 1971, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE UNDER SECTIONS 5 AND 8 OF THE WEIGHTS AND MEASURES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1967.

The Ministry of Commerce, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 5(1)(3) and 8(1) of the Weights and Measures Act (Northern Ireland) 1967(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations: -

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Weights and Measures (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1971 and shall come into operation on 8th April 1971.
- 2. The Weights and Measures Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1967(b), as amended(c), shall have effect subject to the amendments set out in paragraphs 2 and 3 of the Schedule.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These Regulations amend the Weights and Measures Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1967.

The principal changes are that limits of error are prescribed for certain new metric measures the use of which is made lawful by the Weights and Measures (Amendment to Schedule 1) Order (Northern Ireland) 1970 and that uniform limits of error are now prescribed for all measures of the same length irrespective of the material or form of the measure.
