**WAGES COUNCILS****Wages Regulation (Shirtmaking)**

ORDER, DATED 4TH JANUARY 1971, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1945.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland) 1945(a), hereby makes the following Order to give effect to wages regulation proposals received from the Shirtmaking Wages Council (Northern Ireland):—

*Citation*

1. This Order may be cited as the Shirtmaking Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1971.

*Commencement*

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date.

*Interpretation*

3. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 26th day of January 1971, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

## SCHEDULE

## Statutory Minimum Remuneration

The Shirtmaking Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland) 1970(b) (Order N.I.S. (79)) shall have effect as if in the Schedule thereto—

1.—for paragraphs 1, 3, 4, 6 and 7 there were substituted the following paragraphs:—

## “GENERAL MINIMUM TIME RATES

## MALE WORKERS

## Paragraph 1.

Special or Measure Cutters (as defined in paragraph 2) or Pattern Cutters or Pattern Takers, who are employed as such during the whole or a substantial part of their time and who have not less than five years' experience after 19 years of age

Provided that the experience of Special or Measure Cutters shall include three years' experience in measure cutting.

## Paragraph 3.

Male Cutters (other than special or measure cutters, pattern cutters or pattern takers), 21 years of age or over, who are employed during the whole or a substantial part of their time in cutting and who have had not less than five years experience in cutting in the Shirtmaking trade, as defined in paragraph 23

The term “cutting” includes the operations of hooking-up, folding, marking-in, marking-out and dividing.

## Paragraph 4.

Male workers (including apprentice cutters, as defined in paragraph 5) other than male workers to whom the minimum rates set out in paragraphs 1 and 3 apply:—

## FEMALE WORKERS

2. —in the heading to paragraphs 14 to 16 for the words “with the addition of 60 per cent. or 12s. in the £” there were substituted the words “with the addition of 75 per cent. or 15s. in the £, up to and including 14th February 1971, and £75, on and after 15th February 1971.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)*

This Order, which comes into operation on 26th January 1971, amends the Shirtmaking Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland) 1970 (Order N.I.S. (79)) by increasing the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by that Order.

New provisions in the Schedule are printed in italics.
