Decimal Currency (Amendment of Enactments)

ORDER, DATED 23RD FEBRUARY 1971, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF DEVELOPMENT UNDER SECTION 11 OF THE DECIMAL CURRENCY ACT 1969.

The Ministry of Development, with the consent of the Ministry of Finance, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 11 of the Decimal Currency Act 1969(a) and of every other power it thereunto enabling, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This order may be cited as the Decimal Currency (Amendment of Enactments) Order (Northern Ireland) 1971, and shall come into operation on 1st April 1971.

2. In section 23 of the Bangor Urban District Council Harbour Order, as confirmed by the Pier and Harbour Orders Confirmation (No. 4) Act 1920(b) there shall be substituted for the words "threepence-halfpenny" the figures "1.5p".

3. In section 36 of the Carrickfergus Harbour Act (Northern Ireland) 1927(c) there shall be substituted for the words "fourpence-halfpenny" the figures "1.9p".

4. In section 28(3)(v) of the River Bann Navigation Act (Northern Ireland) 1927(d) there shall be substituted for the words "threepence and one halfpenny", wherever occurring, the figures "1.5p".
