Rules, dated 30th May 1972, made by the Ministry of Education under the Teachers (Superannuation) Acts (Northern Ireland) 1950 to 1967 with the approval of the Ministry of Finance.

The Ministry of Education in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 22 of the Teachers (Superannuation) (Amendment) Act (Northern Ireland) 1956(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf and with consent of the Ministry of Finance hereby makes the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Teachers (Superannuation) (Approved External Service) (Amending) Rules (Northern Ireland) 1972.

2. The existing Rules hereby amended are the Teachers (Superannuation) (Approved External Service) Rules (Northern Ireland) 1961(b).

3. To Rule 2 of the existing Rules there shall be added after paragraph (g) the following paragraph—

- "(h) Employment in the Northern Ireland School of Physiotherapy in respect of which contributions are payable under the Federated Superannuation Scheme for Nurses and Hospital Officers."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Rules, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These Rules amend the Teachers (Superannuation) (Approved External Service) Rules (Northern Ireland) 1961 by including as approved external service employment in the Northern Ireland School of Physiotherapy. This is to enable service of this kind to be taken into account in deciding the eligibility of a teacher for pension in respect of his contributory service under the Teachers (Superannuation) Acts (Northern Ireland) 1950 to 1967.
