## CLEAN AIR

### Smoke Control Areas—Exempted Fireplaces

Regulations, dated 7th August 1972, made by the Ministry of Development under Section 11(7) of the Clean Air Act (Northern Ireland) 1964.

The Ministry of Development on behalf of the Secretary of State and in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by Section 11(7) of the Clean Air Act (Northern Ireland) 1964(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:—

#### Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Smoke Control Areas (Exempted Fireplaces) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1972 and shall come into operation on 1st September 1972.

#### Exempted fireplaces

2. The classes of fireplaces described in column (1) of the Schedule shall, subject to the conditions specified in column (2), be exempted from the provisions of Section 11 of the Clean Air Act (Northern Ireland) 1964.

# EXPLANATORY NOTE

# (This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

Section 11 of the Clean Air Act (Northern Ireland) 1964 empowers local authorities to declare the whole or any part of their district to be a smoke control area in which the emission of smoke is, generally, prohibited. These Regulations exempt the Parkray Coalmaster and the Trianco TGB 17 fireplaces from the provisions of that section, upon certain conditions as to proper operation.
