These Regulations shall cease to have effect unless before the expiration of six months from the 4th day of April 1972 they have been approved by a resolution of each House of Parliament.

FAMILY INCOME SUPPLEMENTS

Computation

REGULATIONS, DATED 8TH FEBRUARY 1972, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER THE FAMILY INCOME SUPPLEMENTS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1971.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services, in exercise of powers conferred by sections 2(2) and 3(4) of the Family Income Supplements Act (Northern Ireland) 1971(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:

Citation, commencement and interpretation

- 1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Family Income Supplements (Computation) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1972 and shall come into operation on 4th April 1972.
- (2) In these regulations, "the Act" means the Family Income Supplements Act (Northern Ireland) 1971.

Amendment of section 2 of the Act

2. In section 2(1) of the Act (prescribed amount), as amended(b), for the references to "£18.00" there shall be substituted references to "£20.00".

Amendment of section 3 of the Act

3. In section 3(1) of the Act (amount of family income supplement), as amended(c), for the reference to "£4.00" there shall be substituted a reference to "£5.00"...

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These regulations amend the Family Income Supplements Act (Northern Ireland) 1971 by substituting for the amount of £18.00 referred to in section 2(1) (the prescribed amount) and the amount of £4.00 referred to in section 3(1) (the maximum amount payable by way of a family income supplement) the higher amounts of £20.00 and £5.00 respectively.
