**HEALTH SERVICES****General Dental Services**

REGULATIONS, DATED 19TH SEPTEMBER 1972, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER THE HEALTH SERVICES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1971.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services, on behalf of the Secretary of State, and in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Sections 13, 64 and 87 of the Health Services Act (Northern Ireland) 1971(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf and in conjunction with the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following regulations:—

*Citation and commencement*

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Health Services (General Dental Services) (Amendment No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1972 and shall come into operation on 1st October 1972.

*Interpretation*

2. In these regulations

“the principal regulations” means the Health Services (General Dental Services) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1964(b); and

“regulation 18” means regulation 18 of the principal regulations as amended by regulation 2(4) of the Health Services (General Dental Services) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1972(c) (which provided for a new scale of fees for treatment).

*Amendment*

3. The principal regulations shall be further amended as follows:—

(1) In paragraph 8(2)(d) of Schedule 1 Part I (which deals with “emergency treatment”) for the amount of £2·30 there shall be substituted the amount £2·60.

(2) For Parts I to VI of Schedule 6 (which set out the scale of fees for dental treatment) there shall be substituted the following:—

Provided that—

- (1) only one fee shall be payable during a course of treatment;
- (2) no fee shall be payable for—
  - (a) an examination in respect of repairs to dentures for edentulous patients,
  - (b) a group examination in schools or institutions,
  - (c) an examination of a person aged 21 years or over if the same practitioner† has been paid or is entitled to be paid for an examination and report on that person made at any time during any of the 5 months preceding the month during which a further examination is made,
  - (d) an examination of a person under 21 years of age if the same practitioner† has been paid or is entitled to be paid for an examination and report on that person made on or after the preceding 1st February, 1st June or 1st October, whichever of these dates last occurred;
- (3) in the case of a woman who is, or has been, pregnant and who is not edentulous, in addition to the examinations for which payment may otherwise be made under this item, a fee shall be payable for one examination during the antenatal and postnatal period and all such examinations may be carried out at any time during that period‡.

## 2. Radiological examination and report:

‡The antenatal and postnatal period is the period of pregnancy and the 12 months subsequent to the date of confinement.

## PART II

## CONSERVATIVE TREATMENT

A. *Periodontal Treatment*

3. Scaling, including the removal of calculus and other deposits from the teeth, the provision of prophylactic or other necessary treatment for all ordinary or simple disorders of the gums and any necessary oral hygiene instruction for persons aged 16 or over at the beginning of a course of treatment:—

(a) Scaling and gum treatment (except under (b)) £1.10

\* (b) Scaling and gum treatment to be followed by extraction of the teeth charted for scaling, gum treatment and extraction during the same course of treatment. Such fee as the Committee may approve not exceeding £0.90.

\*Provided that no fee shall be payable where the last course of treatment in respect of which provision was made for payment under item 3(a) or (b) to the same practitioner† commenced at any time during any of the 5 months preceding the month in which the further treatment is to be done, unless the prior approval of the Committee has been obtained.

4. Treatment urgently required for acute infective conditions of the gingivae/oral mucosa, including any necessary oral hygiene instruction:

Fee per course of treatment £0.58

\*5. Other periodontal treatment including any necessary oral hygiene instruction, periodontal surgery and protracted scaling (estimates to include an outline of proposed treatment):

(a) with periodontal surgery Such fee as the Committee may approve.

(b) without periodontal surgery Such fee as the Committee may approve up to a maximum of £6.50.

B. *Restorative Treatment*

6. Fillings (including any dressings, pulp capping and other necessary preparatory treatment), except fillings in deciduous teeth of children under 16 years. The fillings to which this scale applies shall be permanent in character.

\*See Schedule 2 for treatment requiring prior approval.

†Reference in this scale of fees to dental treatment by the same practitioner shall include also dental treatment by his principal or the partner of either, or by the assistant of any of them.

## Fee per filling:—

## (a) amalgam filling in:

(i) a single surface cavity

£0.94 with a maximum of £0.94 for 2 or more such fillings in any one surface of a tooth and a maximum of £1.30 for 2 or more such fillings per tooth not all in one surface.

(ii) a mesial-occlusal-distal cavity inclusive of any extension of such a cavity in a molar or pre-molar tooth

£2.00

(iii) a mesial-occlusal or distal-occlusal cavity inclusive of any extension of such a cavity into the lingual or buccal surfaces or both in a molar or pre-molar tooth

£1.60 with a maximum for a combination of such fillings of £2.00 per tooth.

(iv) a compound cavity other than a cavity covered by (ii) or (iii) above

£1.30 with a maximum of £1.70 for 2 or more such fillings per tooth.

\*(v) additional fee for pin or screw retention

(b) (i) silicate, silico-phosphate or synthetic resin filling

£1.22 with a maximum for 2 or more such fillings per tooth of £1.76.

\*(ii) additional fee for pin or screw retention

## Provided that—

(a) for combinations of the types of fillings set out below in the same tooth no fee shall be payable in excess of the amount shown opposite—

1 or more of (a)(i) with 1 of (a)(iii)

7. Root treatment of permanent teeth, including all attention in connection therewith except for the provision of X-rays or the insertion of any filling in the crown of the tooth:—

(a) treatment comprising either the devitalisation of the pulp of the tooth and the subsequent removal of the pulp followed by the necessary treatment and filling of each root canal of the tooth, or the treatment of septic root canals and the subsequent filling of each canal—

(i) root filling following extirpation of vital pulp in a single rooted tooth

(b) vital pulpotomy consisting of removal of the coronal portion of the pulp, including any necessary dressing—

- \*(j) Renewal by a similar type of  
 crown The fee for a new crown of  
 the type being provided.
- \*(k) Replacement by a different type  
 of crown The fee for a new crown of  
 the type being provided.

Provided that, where the Committee approve the use of a special bonding  
 technique in connection with a porcelain crown, the Committee may  
 increase the fee by an amount not exceeding £7.30.

## SURGICAL TREATMENT

## \*11. Extractions:

Such fee as the Committee may approve up to a maximum of £5.50 (or such higher fee as they may in special circumstances approve).

## (b) Removal of cyst, buried root, impacted tooth or grossly exostosed tooth, or other similar operation, including all necessary attention in connection therewith other than abnormal post-operative haemorrhage necessitating an additional visit other than for the removal of sutures

Such fee as the Committee may approve up to a maximum of £11.50 (or such higher fee as they may in special circumstances approve).

## (c) Surgery on soft tissue, other than periodontal surgery appropriate to item 5

Such fee as the Committee may approve up to a maximum of £2.50 (or such higher fee as they may in special circumstances approve).

## 13. Administration of a general anaesthetic—

## (a) In connection with treatment under item 11:

## (i) where a doctor or dentist other than the dentist carrying out the extraction administers the anaesthetic:

Provided that no fee exceeding £2·90 per course of treatment shall be payable under (i) or under (i) and (ii) combined, and no fee exceeding £7·30 per course of treatment shall be payable for any combination of (iii) with (i), or with both (i) and (ii).

* (b) In connection with treatment under items 5, 7(c) and 12 where a doctor or dentist other than the dentist carrying out the treatment administers the anaesthetic	Such fee as the Committee may approve not exceeding £2·90.
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Provided that in cases presenting special clinical difficulty the fee will be such fee as the Committee may approve not exceeding £6·20.

#### PART IV

#### DENTURES, BRIDGES AND SPECIAL APPLIANCES OTHER THAN ORTHODONTIC APPLIANCES

Fees for the provision of dentures cover the provision of all necessary clasps, rests and strengtheners and all adjustments needed within a reasonable period of time after completion.

- (a) relining or rebasing a denture
- (i) not accompanied by repairs and/or additions £3.60 per denture.
- \* (ii) accompanied by repairs and/or additions Such fee per denture as the Committee may approve.
- \*(b) provision or renewal of soft lining or soft partial lining to an existing denture where it is required on account of the abnormal anatomical condition of the patient's alveolus
- (i) not accompanied by repairs and/or additions £4.30 per denture.
- (ii) accompanied by repairs and/or additions Such fee per denture as the Committee may approve.
16. Repairs (except repairs which are appropriate to item 15(a)(ii) or item 15(b)(ii)):
- (a) (i) repairing a crack or fracture (including provision of any strengthener) £1.00
- (ii) refixing a tooth, or providing and fixing a replacement tooth (including any gum associated therewith) £0.94
- (iii) refixing a clasp (including any gum associated therewith) £0.94
- (iv) providing and fixing a replacement clasp (including any gum associated therewith) £1.70
- (v) covering exposed pins £0.50
- (b) each additional repair under (a)(i)-(v) £0.32
- (c) renewal of gum not associated with repair under (a) £1.00
- Provided that no fee in excess of £2.60 per denture shall be payable under item 16.
17. Additions (except additions which are appropriate to item 15(a)(ii) or item 15(b)(ii)):
- (a) addition of a clasp or tooth (including any gum associated therewith) £2.60
- (b) addition of new gum not associated with addition under item 17(a) £2.60 per denture.

TREATMENT SPECIAL TO CHILDREN

*Additional payments*

4.—(1) Subject to the following provisions of this regulation, these regulations shall not apply to general dental services provided under a contract or arrangement entered into or made before 1st October 1972 and such services shall continue to be subject to the provisions of the regulations in force immediately before that date other than the provisions thereof ceasing to have effect by virtue of regulation 5 hereof.

(2) In respect of an advice of payment from the Committee to the Board dated during the period beginning with 1st April 1972 and ending with 30th September 1972, the Board shall pay to a practitioner an additional sum equal to 10.8 per cent. of the amounts authorised for payment.

(3) Where an advice of payment from the Committee to the Board dated on or after 1st October 1972 is in respect of a contract or arrangement entered into or made on or after 1st March 1972 and before 1st October 1972 the Board shall pay to a practitioner in addition to the fees authorised under regulation 18 a sum equal to 10.8 per cent. of the amount of these fees.

(4) Where an advice of payment from the Committee to the Board dated on or after 1st October 1972 is in respect of a contract or arrangement entered into or made on or after 1st October 1970 and before 1st March 1972 the Board shall pay to a practitioner in addition to the fees authorised under regulation 18 a sum equal to 17.2 per cent. of the amount of these fees.

(5) Where an advice of payment from the Committee to the Board dated on or after 1st October 1972 is in respect of a contract or arrangement entered into or made before 1st October 1970 the Board shall pay to a practitioner in addition to the fees authorised under regulation 18 a sum equal to 40.5 per cent. of the amount of these fees.

*Revocation*

5. Regulation 3 of the Health Services (General Dental Services) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1972 shall cease to have effect.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)*

These regulations further amend the Health Services (General Dental Services) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1964 by providing for a new scale of fees and for certain additional payments for practitioners providing general dental services, other than salaried practitioners. The regulations also provide for a new scale of remuneration for salaried practitioners, i.e., dentists employed by the Board at health centres.
