SUMMARY JURISDICTION

Petty Sessions Districts and Times

Order, dated 10th February 1972, made by the Ministry of Home Afrairs under Section 21(3)(f) of the Magistrates' Courts Act (Northern Ireland) 1964.

The Ministry of Home Affairs in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 21(3)(f) of the Magistrates' Courts Act (Northern Ireland) 1964(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, after consultation with the County Court Judge and Resident Magistrate concerned, hereby orders and directs as follows:—

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Petty Sessions Districts and Times (Dunmurry) Order (Northern Ireland) 1972 and shall come into operation on the 14th day of February 1972.

Place for holding Dunmurry Petty Sessions

2. Petty Sessions for the Petty Sessions District of Dunmurry shall be held at Lisburn in the Assembly Hall, Lisburn, a place outside the Petty Sessions District of Dunmurry, but not more than six miles from the boundary of the said District and at the times specified in the Petty Sessions Districts and Times (General) Order (Northern Ireland) 1967(b).

Revocation

3. The Petty Sessions Districts and Times (Dunmurry) Order (Northern Ireland) 1971(c) is hereby revoked.
