**Dundrum Inner Bay (Prohibition of Netting for Salmon) Bye-Laws 1972**

BYE-LAWS, DATED 13TH NOVEMBER 1972, MADE BY THE FISHERIES CONSERVANCY BOARD FOR NORTHERN IRELAND WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION 26 OF THE FISHERIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1966.

The Fisheries Conservancy Board for Northern Ireland in exercise of its powers under section 26 of the Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf with the approval of the Ministry of Agriculture hereby makes the following Bye-laws.

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as the Dundrum Inner Bay (Prohibition of Netting for Salmon) Bye-laws (Northern Ireland) 1972, and shall come into operation on 1st January 1973.

2. No person (other than the owner of a several fishery within the limits thereof) shall use for the purpose of taking or with intent to take salmon any net within or upstream of the defined mouth of the Dundrum River or in Dundrum Inner Bay.
