# DISEASES OF ANIMALS

### Scheduled Diseases

Order, dated 15th December 1972, made by the Ministry of Agriculture under sections 1 and 10 of the Diseases of Animals Act (Northern Ireland) 1958.

The Ministry of Agriculture, on behalf of the Secretary of State and in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 1 and 10 of the Diseases of Animals Act (Northern Ireland) 1958(a) (hereinafter called "the Act") and of every other power enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

#### Citation and commencement

1. This Order which may be cited as the Scheduled Diseases (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1972 shall come into operation on 15th December 1972.

## Amendment of the First Schedule of the Act

2. Part III of the First Schedule of the Act shall be amended by adding at the end thereof—

"17. Swine Vesicular disease."

### Amendment of the Second Schedule of the Act

3.—(1) In Part I of the Second Schedule of the Act after paragraph 10 "Brucellosis" there shall be inserted the following paragraph—

"11. Swine Vesicular disease: The Ministry may, if it thinks fit, in any case cause to be slaughtered—

- (a) any animals affected with Swine Vesicular disease, or suspected of being so affected; and
- (b) any animals which are or have been in contact with animals affected with Swine Vesicular disease, or which appear to the Ministry to have been in any way exposed to the infection of Swine Vesicular disease."

(2) In Part II of the Second Schedule of the Act after paragraph 10 "Brucellosis" there shall be inserted the following paragraph—

"11. Swine Vesicular disease: The compensation shall—

- (a) where the animal slaughtered was affected with Swine Vesicular disease, be the value of the animal immediately before it became so affected; and
- (b) in every other case, be the value of the animal immediately before it was slaughtered."
