FIRE SERVICES**Firemen's Pension Scheme (Amending) (No. 2) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1972**

ORDER, DATED 29TH DECEMBER 1972, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION 17 OF THE FIRE SERVICES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1969.

The Ministry of Home Affairs, with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, on behalf of the Secretary of State in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 17 of the Fire Services Act (Northern Ireland) 1969(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Firemen's Pension Scheme (Amending) (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 1972.

Commencement

2. This Order shall come into operation on 29th December 1972 and shall have effect as from 1st January 1973.

Interpretation

3. In this Order any reference to the principal Scheme is a reference to the Firemen's Pension Scheme Order (Northern Ireland) 1971(b).

Commutation and allocation of pensions

4. The provisions of Articles 9, 26 and 27 of the principal Scheme (commutation and allocation of pensions) shall apply in relation to an ill-health pension payable to a retained fireman under Article 61 thereof and, accordingly, in paragraph (2) of the said Article 61 after the number "8" there shall be inserted the numbers "9, 26, 27":
