Housing Subsidy Order

ORDER, DATED 15TH MARCH 1973, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF DEVELOPMENT, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE, UNDER SECTION 1 OF THE HOUSING (NO. 2) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1946.

The Ministry of Development (in this Order referred to as "the Ministry") with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, and on behalf of the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Ministry by section 1 of the Housing (No. 2) Act (Northern Ireland) 1946(a), and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Housing Subsidy (Variation) Order (Northern Ireland) 1973 and shall be construed as one with the Housing Subsidy Order (Northern Ireland) 1962(b).

2. In its application to a housing scheme in respect of which the tender has been submitted for approval to the Ministry or accepted by the Northern Ireland Housing Executive or by a housing association after 15th March 1973, the Housing Subsidy Order (Northern Ireland) 1962 shall be amended by substituting for the Schedule contained therein the Schedule to this Order.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

Under this Order subsidies to the Northern Ireland Housing Executive and housing associations are revised in respect of houses for which tenders are accepted by the Executive or housing associations after 15th March 1973. These revised rates of subsidy also apply to houses built by new town commissions by virtue of section 21 of the New Towns Act (Northern Ireland) 1965.

By virtue of the Housing Executive Act (Northern Ireland) 1971 the Ministry will pay the local authority contribution shown in column 3.
