The National Health Service (Pharmaceutical Services) (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2001

Made - - - - 8th March 2001

The Scottish Ministers, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 27(1) and (2), 105(7) and 108(1) of the National Health Service (Scotland) Act 1978(1) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Regulations:
