ROAD TRAFFIC

The A9 Trunk Road (Highland Lights, Kessock Bridge) (Special Event) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2007

Made
Coming into force

21st December 2007 9th January 2008

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and of all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 16A(2) of that Act, they are satisfied that the traffic on the length of road specified in the Schedule should be restricted and or prohibited for the purpose of facilitating a firework display on the Kessock Bridge.

In accordance with section 16A(3) of that Act, they are satisfied that it is not reasonably practicable for such an event to be held otherwise than on that length of road.

In accordance with section 16A(8) of that Act, they have had regard to the safety and convenience of an alternative route suitable for traffic which will be affected by this Order.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A9 Trunk Road (Highland Lights, Kessock Bridge) (Special Event) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2007, shall come into force at 00.01 hours on 9th January 2008 and shall cease to have effect at midnight on 14th January 2008.

Prohibition of use of vehicles

2. Subject to Article 3 of this Order, no person shall use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road specified in the Schedule when such prohibition is identified as applying to any part or parts of the said length of road by means of traffic signs as prescribed by the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(a).

Exemption for emergency and works vehicles

3. No provision of this Order shall apply to a vehicle while being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes or a vehicle being used in connection with the facilitating of the firework display on the Kessock Bridge.
