ROAD TRAFFIC

The A830 Trunk Road (Arisaig to Loch nan Uamh Improvement) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic, Temporary Prohibition of Overtaking and Temporary Speed Restriction) Order 2008

The Scottish Ministers make the following order, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 14(1) and (4), 2(1) and (2) and 4 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(**a**) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 14(1) of that Act, they are satisfied that the traffic on the length of road specified in the Schedule should be restricted or prohibited because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near that length of road.

In accordance with section 14(3) of that Act, they have had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A830 Trunk Road (Arisaig to Loch nan Uamh Improvement) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic, Temporary Prohibition of Overtaking and Temporary Speed Restriction) Order 2008, comes into force on 21 November 2008 and ceases to have effect at midnight on 20 November 2009.

Temporary prohibition on use of a road

2. Subject to Article 5, no person shall use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road specified in the Schedule when a prohibition is identified as applying to a part or parts of the length of road by means of one or more of the traffic signs prescribed in Diagram 7010.1 and 7105 of the Traffic Signs Regulations (**b**).

Temporary prohibition on overtaking

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this Article, no person shall use, or permit the use of, any vehicle in such a way that it overtakes any other moving vehicle on the length of road specified in the Schedule when a prohibition is identified as applying to that part or parts of the length of road by means of a traffic sign prescribed in Diagram 632 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002.

(2) Nothing in paragraph (1) of this Article shall prohibit any person from using, or permitting the use of, any vehicle in such a way that it overtakes a cycle, motor cycle, tricycle or any other vehicle not being a motor vehicle in accordance with section 140 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984^(a).

Temporary speed restriction

4. No person shall use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road specified in the Schedule at a speed exceeding 30mph when identified as applying to a part or parts of the length of road by means of a traffic sign prescribed in Diagram 670 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002.

Exemption for emergency and works vehicles

5. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall apply to a vehicle being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance, police or coastguard purposes or a vehicle while being used for carrying out the works.

SCHEDULE

That length of road on the A830 Fort William – Mallaig Trunk Road from the access road to the electricity substation on the eastern outskirts of Arisaig Village in a generally south easterly direction to the lay-by on the western carriageway by the Prince's Cairn, a distance of 8100 metres or thereby.
