# The Criminal Legal Assistance (Duty Solicitors) (Scotland) Regulations 2011

#### Duty solicitors: advice for suspects

[<sup>F1</sup>3. In the circumstances where the Board has arranged, in accordance with section 31(8) of the Act, that a solicitor is to be available for the purpose of providing advice and assistance to any person to whom section 32 (right to have a solicitor present) of the Criminal Justice (Scotland) Act 2016 [<sup>F2</sup>, paragraph 16(6) of schedule 8 of the Terrorism Act 2000 (entitlement to consult a solicitor), <sup>F3</sup>... paragraph 37(6) of schedule 3 of the Counter-Terrorism and Border Security Act 2019 (entitlement to consult a solicitor)][<sup>F4</sup>, or paragraph 15(6) of schedule 6 of the National Security Act 2023 (entitlement to consult a solicitor)] applies—

- (a) section 31(1) of the Act does not apply; and
- (b) the advice and assistance referred to must only be provided by the solicitor so made available.]
