

EXECUTIVE NOTE

THE SCOTTISH ROAD WORKS REGISTER (PRESCRIBED FEES) REGULATIONS 2012

SSI 2012/11

1. The above instrument was made in exercise of powers conferred on the Scottish Ministers by Sections 112A of the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991 (c.22) and is subject to negative resolution procedure.

Background and Policy Objective

2. The Transport (Scotland) Act 2005, amongst other matters, aims to improve the co-ordination, planning and quality of road works carried out in Scotland. Part 2 of the Act, which included amendments to the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991 provided a framework for the appointment of the Scottish Road Works Commissioner, and subsequent provisions for the Commissioner to keep a register – *the Scottish Road Works Register* – and for the collection of prescribed fees from local authorities and utility companies as a condition of access to the Register.

3. Accordingly, this instrument exercises the powers to prescribe the fees payable for the 2012/13 financial year and will ultimately replace the Scottish Road Works Register (Prescribed Fees) Regulations 2011 (SSI 2011/43).

4. Regulation 3 prescribes the methodology and formula for calculating the fees payable by each road authority and utility company operating in Scotland. Careful consideration has been given to ensuring that the costs of keeping the register are balanced by the income received from users and this is reflected in the minimal increase for the year from 1 April 2012 (from £1,017,000 for 2010/11 to £1,024,000 for 2011/12).

Consultation

5. As required by Section 163A of the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991, the Scottish Government consulted all interested parties including road authorities and utility companies operating in Scotland. Of the responses received, all agreed with the proposal.

Financial Effects

6. The SSI will have no financial effect on the Scottish Government.
