## MARRIAGE

# The Marriage (Prescription of Forms) (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2015

Made---28th August 2015Laid before the Scottish Parliament31st August 2015Coming into force in accordance with regulation 1

The Registrar General makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by section 3(1) of the Marriage (Scotland) Act  $1977(\mathbf{a})$  and all other powers enabling him to do so.

In accordance with section  $25(1)(\mathbf{b})$  of the Marriage (Scotland) Act 1977 the Scottish Ministers have approved the making of these Regulations.

### Citation and commencement

**1.** These Regulations may be cited as the Marriage (Prescription of Forms) (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2015 and come into force on the same day as the Qualifying Civil Partnership Modification (Scotland) Order 2015(c).

### Amendment of the Marriage (Prescription of Forms) (Scotland) Regulations 1997

**2.**—(1) The Marriage (Prescription of Forms) (Scotland) Regulations 1997(**d**) are amended as follows.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

### (This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the Marriage (Prescription of Forms) (Scotland) Regulations 1997 to substitute a new Marriage Notice form (Form M10) into those Regulations.

The new form is amended to reflect that, in future, civil partnerships registered outwith Scotland may be changed into marriages in Scotland by virtue of the Qualifying Civil Partnership Modification (Scotland) Order 2015. The amendments relate to the information that is required to be provided where such a change is to take place.
