**The Sea Fishing (Miscellaneous Revocations) (Scotland)
Regulations 2017**

The Scottish Ministers make the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 3, 5, 6, 8 and 18(1) of the Whaling Industry (Regulation) Act 1934^(a) and section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972^(b) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

Citation, commencement and extent

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Sea Fishing (Miscellaneous Revocations) (Scotland) Regulations 2017 and come into force on 1st December 2017.

(2) These Regulations extend to Scotland only.

The functions of the Secretary of State, insofar as within devolved competence, were transferred to the Scottish Ministers by virtue of section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998 (c.46).

The functions conferred on the Minister of the Crown under section 2(2), insofar as within devolved competence, were transferred to the Scottish Ministers by virtue of section 53 of the 1998 Act. The revocations of S.I. 1991/777, S.I. 1992/130, S.I. 1992/670, S.I. 1995/1576 and S.I. 1998/1365 in the schedule of these Regulations are made under section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972.
