# The Children's Hearings (Scotland) Act 2011 (Safeguarders Panel) Amendment Regulations 2023

Made	2nd March 2023
Laid before the Scottish Parliament	6th March 2023
Coming into force	1st May 2023

The Scottish Ministers make the following Regulations in exercise of the power conferred by section 32(2) of the Children's Hearings (Scotland) Act 2011(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

### Citation and commencement

**1.** These Regulations may be cited as the Children's Hearings (Scotland) Act 2011 (Safeguarders Panel) Amendment Regulations 2023 and come into force on 1 May 2023.

#### Amendment of the 2012 Regulations

**2.** In regulation 2 (interpretation) of the Children's Hearings (Scotland) Act 2011 (Safeguarders Panel) Regulations 2012(**b**), in the definition of "the Practice Standards" for "July 2015" substitute "February 2023(**c**)".
