Executive summary	These legal aid provisions will require the Scottish Legal Aid Board (SLAB) to disregard Carer's Allowance Supplement and Care-Experienced Students Bursary payments when calculating financial eligibility for publicly funded legal assistance.				
Background	Carer's Allowance Supplement				
	Carer's Allowance Supplement is an extra payment for people in Scotland who get Carer Support Payment or Carer's Allowance on a particular date. It was introduced by s.81 of the Social Security (Scotland) Act 2018. It is paid twice a year as a lump sum to carers in receipt of Carer Support Payment or Carer's Allowance in Scotland. The amount to be paid by way of Carer's Allowance Supplement is calculated according to a formula set out in the 2018 Act; it is currently £288.60.				
	Carer Support Payment is currently disregarded when the Scottish Legal Aid Board (SLAB) calculates financial eligibility for legal assistance, but Carer's Allowance Supplement is not. This SSI will provide for Carer's Allowance Supplement to be disregarded by SLAB when calculating financial eligibility for legal assistance.				
	Care-Experienced Students Bursary				
	The Care-Experienced Student's Bursary is a non-repayable bursary of £9000 which is paid to those completing an eligible course of higher education who have been looked after before they were 18 by a local authority in the UK. This SSI will provide for the Care-Experienced Students Bursary to be disregarded by SLAB when calculating financial eligibility for legal assistance.

The amendments will have a positive impact on access to justice as it will ensure individuals in receipt of Carer's Allowance Supplement or Care-Experienced Students Bursary are not at risk of becoming ineligible for any publicly funded legal assistance by virtue of them receiving such payments.
