In accordance with section 123(4)(a) of that Act, a draft of this Order has been laid before and approved by resolution of each House of Parliament.

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Terrorism Act 2000 (Proscribed Organisations) (Amendment) Order 2005 and shall come into force on the day after the day on which it is made.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Part 2 of the Terrorism Act 2000 makes provision about proscribed organisations (including setting out offences in relation to such organisations in sections 11 to 13). An organisation is proscribed if it is listed in Schedule 2 to that Act or operates under the same name as an organisation so listed (section 3(1)). This Order adds the organisations listed in article 2 to the list in that Schedule.
