**The Kensington and Chelsea (Electoral Changes) Order 2014**

*Coming into force in accordance with article 1(2)*

Under section 58(4) of the Local Democracy, Economic Development and Construction Act 2009<sup>(1)</sup> (“the Act”) the Local Government Boundary Commission for England<sup>(2)</sup> published a report dated September 2013 stating its recommendations for changes to the electoral arrangements for the Royal borough of Kensington and Chelsea<sup>(3)</sup>. The Commission has decided to give effect to the recommendations.

A draft of the instrument has been laid before Parliament and a period of forty days has expired and neither House has resolved that the instrument be not made.

The Commission makes the following Order in exercise of the power conferred by section 59(1) of the Act:

(2) The Local Government Boundary Commission for England was established on 1st April 2010 by section 55(1) of the Local Democracy, Economic Development and Construction Act 2009 (c.20).  
(3) The London borough of Kensington and Chelsea has Royal borough status.
