Citation, commencement and extent

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Proceeds of Crime (Money Laundering) (Threshold Amount) Order 2022 and comes into force on the day which falls 21 days after the day on which it is made.
 - (2) This Order extends to England and Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland.

Variation of threshold amount

2. In section 339A(2) of the Proceeds of Crime Act 2002 (threshold amounts), for "250" substitute "1,000".

This Order increases from £250 to £1,000 the threshold amount specified in section 339A of the Proceeds of Crime Act 2002 (c. 29) ("POCA"). The threshold amount is the value of criminal property below which a bank or similar firm (a deposit-taking body, electronic money or payment

institution) can carry out a transaction, in operating an account for a customer, without committing one of the main money laundering offences in sections 327 to 329 of POCA.
