

CHAPTER lxix

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order under the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1936 relating to Millport Piers (Amendment). [2nd August 1956.]

HEREAS the Provisional Order set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed has been made by the Secretary of State under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1936 and it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

- 1. The Provisional Order contained in the schedule hereunto Confirmation annexed is hereby confirmed.

- 2. This Act may be cited as the Millport Piers (Amendment) Short title. Order Confirmation Act 1956.

SCHEDULE

MILLPORT PIERS (AMENDMENT)

Provisional Order to amend the provisions of the Millport Piers and Burgh Extension Order 1905 relating to the charges rates and dues for the use of each of Millport Pier and Harbour and Keppel Pier to authorise the Town Council of Millport to borrow further moneys, for the general purposes of their undertaking and for other purposes.

Whereas by the Millport Piers and Burgh Extension Order 1905 the provost magistrates and councillors (hereinafter called "the Town Council") of the burgh of Millport in the county of Bute were authorised to acquire and maintain the Pier and Harbour of Millport and Keppel Pier:

And whereas the rates authorised to be levied by the Town Council under the Millport Piers and Burgh Extension Order 1905 have proved insufficient for them to maintain their undertaking in a state of efficiency and it is expedient that they should be increased or revised and that the Town Council be authorised to demand and recover the rates and dues as provided in this Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the Town Council should be authorised to borrow further moneys for the maintenance improvement and general purposes of their undertaking:

And whereas it is expedient that the further powers mentioned in this Order should be conferred upon the Town Council:

And whereas the purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without an Order confirmed by Parliament under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1936:

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers contained in the last-mentioned Act the Secretary of State orders as follows:—

PART I

PRELIMINARY

Short title and citation.

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Millport Piers (Amendment) Order 1956.
- (2) The Millport Piers and Burgh Extension Order 1905 and this Order may be cited together as the Millport Piers Orders 1905 and 1956.

Commencement of Order.

2. This Order shall commence and have effect on and from the date of the passing of the Act confirming the same which date is hereinafter referred to as the commencement of this Order.

Interpretation.

- 3. In this Order unless there be something in the subject or context inconsistent with or repugnant to such construction—
 - (a) the several words and expressions to which meanings are assigned by the Millport Piers and Burgh Extension Order 1905 shall subject to the provisions of this Order have the same respective meanings; and

- (b) the following words and expressions shall have the meanings assigned to them in this section (that is to say):—
 - "the Minister" means the Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation:
 - "the Order of 1905" means the Millport Piers and Burgh Extension Order 1905;
 - "the Secretary of State" means the Secretary of State for Scotland:
 - "the undertaking" means the Millport Pier and Harbour and Keppel Pier and the offices works conveniences and accesses of or to the same within the limits. respectively prescribed by the Order of 1905 and all future additions thereto and extensions thereof together with the powers rights authorities and privileges relating thereto conferred on and transferred to the Town Council by the said Order and by this Order.

PART II

RATES

4. As from the commencement of this Order the rates and Rates and charges specified in the Second Schedule of the Order of 1905 charges. shall be and are hereby repealed and the schedule to this Order is hereby substituted in place thereof and the Town Council may subject to the provisions of the Order of 1905 and this Order levy demand and recover rates and charges not exceeding the rates and charges in the schedule to this Order or from the persons liable in payment of the same:

Provided that the rates set forth in paragraphs (a) and (b) of Part V of the schedule to this Order authorised to be charged on passengers at Millport Pier (as the said pier presently exists or as it may be extended) shall not commence to be charged at that pier until the Town Council receive the written consent thereto of the Marquess of Bute for the time being:

Provided further that the rates and dues payable at and for the use of the old or inner harbour at Millport by fishermen resident in Great Cumbrae Island shall not exceed the sums leviable thereat from such fishermen at the date of the commencement of this Order.

5. Section 28 of the Harbours Docks and Piers Clauses Act 1847 For protection (as incorporated with the Order of 1905) shall have effect in relation of Postmasterto the rates and charges authorised to be levied by this Order as if General. in the said section for the words from "or any packet boat" to "any such packet boat or packet" there were substituted the words " or any vessel employed by or under the authority of the Postmaster-General for the conveyance under contract of postal packets as defined by the Post Office Act 1953 not being a vessel also conveying passengers or goods for hire or reward or any mail bag as so defined conveyed by any such vessel".

Recovery of rates due before repeal.

6. All rates and charges which immediately before the commencement of this Order were due or payable to the Town Council under the Order of 1905 may be levied collected sued for and recovered by the Town Council in the same manner as if this Order had not been confirmed.

PART III VESSENCED OF "

FINANCE

Power to borrow money.

- 7.—(1) The Town Council may borrow on the security of their undertaking and on the security of the piers and harbour rates and charges and the special pier and harbour rate leviable by them under the authority of the Order of 1905 and this Order—
 - (a) any sums of money not exceeding in the whole thirty thousand pounds in addition to the sums which they are authorised to borrow by the Order of 1905; and
 - (b) with the consent of the Secretary of State such further sums as may from time to time be required for the purposes of the harbour undertaking.
- (2) (a) If after having borrowed the said sum of thirty thousand pounds or any part thereof the Town Council pay off the same otherwise than by instalments or annual payments or by means of the sinking fund or the proceeds of the sale of any land or any grassum or premium taken on any lease or feu disposition they may again borrow the like sum on the same security.
- (b) Moneys so reborrowed shall for the purposes of repayment be deemed to form part of the original loan and shall be repaid within that portion of the fixed period which remains unexpired and the provisions for the time being applicable to the original loan shall apply to the moneys so reborrowed.

Periods for repayment of borrowed money.

- 8. The Town Council shall pay off all moneys borrowed by them under this Order within the respective periods following that is to say:
 - as to money borrowed for the purposes of carrying out works of deferred maintenance involving the demolition and replacement of the existing pier offices waiting room and lavatory accommodation within fifty years of borrowing the same;
 - as to money borrowed for the purposes of carrying out works of deferred maintenance in concrete to the south and west main walls of the pier within thirty years of borrowing the same;
 - as to money borrowed for the purposes of carrying out works of deferred maintenance to the piles and ancillary timbers within twenty-five years of borrowing the same;
 - as to money borrowed for payment of the costs of this Order within five years from the commencement of this Order; and

- as to money borrowed under paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 7 of this Order within such period from the date or dates of borrowing the same as the Secretary of State may prescribe.
- 9. Sections 43 to 48 inclusive of the Order of 1905 as amended Application of by the following section of this Order shall extend and apply to the sections 43 to money authorised to be borrowed by this Order as if such money 48 of Order of had formed part of the money authorised to be borrowed by the Order of 1905.
- 10.—(1) In paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 44 (Sinking Amendment of fund) of the Order of 1905 for the words "at a rate not exceeding sections 44 and three per centum per annum" there shall be substituted the words of 1905. "at such rate as the Secretary of State may approve" and in subsection (12) of the said section the words from "but it shall not be necessary" to the end of the subsection shall be deleted.

- (2) In subsection (2) of section 45 (For appointment of a judicial factor) of the Order of 1905 for the words "two thousand" there shall be substituted the words "five thousand".
- 11. Section 50 (Application of rates) of the Order of 1905 shall Application of apply and have effect as if the expression "this Order" wheresoever section 50 of Order of 1905. the same occurs therein includes this Order.
- 12. It shall not be lawful to exercise the powers of borrowing Saving for conferred by this Order otherwise than in compliance with the powers of Treasury. provisions of any order for the time being in force made under section 1 of the Borrowing (Control and Guarantees) Act 1946.

All costs charges and expenses of and incident to the pre- Costs of Order, paring for obtaining and confirming of this Order or otherwise in relation thereto shall be paid by the Town Council out of the revenues of the undertaking or out of money to be borrowed for that purpose which they are hereby authorised to borrow.
