An Act to enable the Corporation of The Royal Exchange Assurance, to assure Vessels, Barges, Keels, Boats, and other Craft employed in Inland Navigation, and the Goods, Merchandizes, and Effects laden therein. [20th June 1801.]

HEREAS by virtue of an Act of Parliament, passed in the Sixth Year of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Act of the First, intituled, An Act for better securing certain Powers and 6th Geo. I, Privileges intended to be granted, by his Majesty, by Two Charters for Assurance of Ships and Merchandizes at Sea, and for lending Money upon Bottomry, and for restraining several extravagant and unreasonable Practices therein named, his said Majesty did, by his Letters Patent under the Great The Royal Seal of Great Britain, bearing date at Westminster the Twenty-second Day of June One thousand ven hundred and twenty, incodrporate divers insuring Ships Persons therein named, to bese a Corporation in Deed and in Name, an to have a perpetual Succession and a Common Seal, by the Name of The to Sea, and Royal Exchange Assurance for insuring Ships and Goods at Sea, or going for lending to Sea, and for lending Money upon Bottomry: And whereas, since the Bottomry. granting the said Charter, a very considerable and beneficial Trade has Inland Navibeen entered into and carried on, in the United Kingdom of Great Bri- gation fince tain and Ireland, by means of Canals, in which are employed Vessels, Barges, Keels, Boats, and other Craft; and it would be a great Benefit Doubts have to the Publick if the said Corporation were enabled to assure the same, arisen whether the Corporaand the Goods, Merchandizes, and Effects laden therein; but Doubts tion can in-[Loc. & Per.]

have arisen whether the said Corporation have Power so to do; may it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authorized and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authorized Enchange Assurance, and their Successors, from and after the passing of this Act, and for ever thereaster, and they are hereby surhorized and empowered, to assure Vessels, Barges, Keels, Boats, and all other Crast employed in any Inland Navigation in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Goods, Merchandizes, and Effects laden therein, from all and every Risk which may arise from and during the said Navigation.

General Issue to be pleaded.

II. And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That if any Action or Suit shall be commenced, brought, or prosecuted against the said Corporation of The Royal Enchange Assurance for insuring Ships at Sea, or going to Sea, and for lending Money upon Bottomry, by any Person or Persons, Bodies Politick or Corporate, for or concerning any Assurance or Assurances hereby authorized to be made, or relating to the Powers hereby granted, the said Corporation and their Successors may, in such Action or Suit, plead the General Issue, and give the special Matter in Evidence.

Publick Act.

III. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Publick Act, and all Judges, Justices, and other Persons, are hereby required to take Notice of this Act as such, without specially pleading the same.
