An Act for further continuing the Duties, and altering the Powers, granted by Four Acts, made in the Fifthand Twenty-fifth Years of His late Majesty King George the Second, and in the Third and Eighteenth Years of His present Majesty's Reign, for enlarging the Pier and Harbour of Scarborough, in the County of York. [20th June 1801.]

HEREAS an Act was made in the Fifth Year of the Reign of Preamble.

His late Majesty King George the Second intimed Act Act To Preamble. His late Majesty King George the Second, intituled, An Act Act Act 5 Geo. 11 to enlarge the Pier and Harbour of Scarborough, in the County of York, whereby there were given and granted a Duty of One Halfpenny for every Chaldron of Coals laden on board any Vessel at or in the Port of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, or at Sunderland, or any other Port or Place reputed a Member of the said Port of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, to be payable until the Twenty-fourth Day of June One thousand seven hundred and fixty-three; and also several other Duties in the said. Act mentioned, upon certain Goods, Wares, and Merchandize landed in or shipped off from the faid Port of Scarborough, which were to have Continuance until the Twenty-fourth Day of June One thousand seven hundred and eightythree; all which Duties the said Act directed to be paid to the Bailiffs and Burgesses of Scarborough, to be applied for the Purpose of enlarging, [Loc. & Per.] extending,

The Duties granted by the faid Acts further continued for Twenty Years.

For altering the Time of producing the Treasurer's

extending, improving, and repairing the said Pier and Harbour: And whereas an Act was made in the Twenty-fifth Year of the Reign of His faid late Majesty to explain, amend, and make more effectual the said former Act, whereby Provision was made for taking the Lowers created by the said former Act out of the Hands of the said Builles and Burgelles, and vesting the same in Trustees, named therein and to be appointed in pursuance thereof: And whereas an Act was made in the Third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty for continuing the Duties and enlarging the Powers granted by the said Two former Acts, whereby the aforesaid Duty upon Coals was continued from and after the Expiration of the then existing Term thereof, for and during the further Term of Twenty Years: And whereas an Act was made in the Eighteenth Year of the Reign of His said present Majesty for continuing the Duties and enlarging the Powers granted by the said Three former Acts, whereby the aforefaid Duty upon Coals, and also the said Duty upon certain Goods. Wares, and Merchandize as aforesaid, were continued from and after the Expiration of the then existing Term thereof, for and during the further Term of Twenty Years: And whereas the Term for which the said several Duties are payable will expire on the Twenty-fourth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and three: And whereas the said Harbour hath been greatly improved, and for enlarging and making the same extensively useful a new Pier was begun and is now carrying on at a very large Annual Expence, which Pier when finished will render the said Harbour more safe and commodious than it now is, and will be of the greatest Advantage and Security to Trade, and of publick Utility; but for as much as the faid new Pier cannot be completed, and the other Works done which from Time to Time must become necessary to keep the said Harbour in sufficient Repair for the suture, unless the said Duties be continued for a further Term of Years, may it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the said Duty on Coals, and also the said Duty upon Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, as the same are now respectively payable, shall be, and the same are hereby declared to be continued from and after the said Twenty fourth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and three, for and during the further Term of Twenty Years; and that so much and such Part of the aforesaid Four several recited Acts, and all and fingular the Powers and Authorities thereby respectively given, and all and every the Clauses, Provisoes, Matters, and Things therein respectively contained as is or are now in Force, shall, for collecting, levying, recovering, managing, disposing of, securing, and accounting for the Duties hereby granted or continued, and the Duties which may be in Arrear under the said former Acts, or any of them, and for the managing, enlarging, improving, and repairing the said Pier and Harbour, and to that End, for levying and recovering the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned in the said recited Acts, or any of them, and for other the Purposes of this Act, be continued and be in full Force during the said extended Term, as fully and effectually, to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever, as if the same were particularly and at large repeated and re-enacted in the Body of this present Act: And whereas by the said Act passed in the Eighteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty it is directed that all Accounts, stated and signed by the Commissioners at their

their publick Meetings, shall, at every Quarter Sessions to be holden for the Accounts to North Riding of the County of York next after Christmas or Michaelmas, be the Quarter produced to His Majesty's Justices of the Peace then and there present, Sessions. for their Inspection and Allowance: And whereas it may be convenient that the same should be done at the Easter Sessions, be it therefore further enacted, That the said Accounts shall and may be produced and allowed either at the Christmas, Easter, or Michaelmas Quarter Sessions, as shall be most convenient for the Treasurer or other proper Officer; any Thing in the said recited Acts, or either of them, contained to the contrary thereof in anywise not withstanding.

II. And be it further enacted, That the Charges and Expences in and For paying the about obtaining and passing this Act, shall, as soon as the same can be the Act. conveniently done, be paid out of any Monies already ar sen by virtue of the said former Acts, or out of the first Monies to arise by virtue thereof, or of this Act.

III. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed, adjudged, and taken to be a Publick Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as fuch by all Judges, Justices, and other Persons whatsoever, without specially pleading the same.
