An Act for enabling the Keepers and Governors of the Possessions, Revenues, and Goods of the Free Grammar School of John Lyon, within the Town of Harrow on the Hill, in the County of Middlesex, to pay the Rents and Prosits of certain Lands bequeathed by the said John Lyon, for repairing the Road from Harrow on the Hill to London, to the Trustees acting in Execution of the several Acts for keeping the said Road in Repair.

C.110. the Seventh Year of King George the First, and the Eighth Year of King George the Second, for repairing the Road from Saint Giles's Pound to Kilburne Bridge, and for paving Oxford Road; and also of an Act, made in the Twenty-ninth Year of King George the Second, to enable the respective Trustees of the Turnpike Roads leading to Highgate Gatekouse and Hampstead, and from Saint Giles's Pound to Kilbourne, to make a new Road from the great Northern Road at Islington to the Edgware Read near Paddington, so far as the same is by the said Act directed to be under the Management of the Trustees of the said Two first-mentioned Acts; certain Persons were appointed Trustees for repairing the said several Roads: And whereas so much of the Road by the said recited Act made in the Twenty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, directed to be amended and kept in Repair, as leads from the Place where Saint Giles's Pound formerly stood, to the Red Lyon at Paddington, lies between the said Town of Harrow upon the Hill and the said City of London, and is Part of the Highway directed to be repaired and amended by the said Keepers and Governors by the said recited Indenture bearing Date on or about the Nineteenth Day of December in the Twenty-lifth Year of the Reign of Queen Flizabeth; and luch Part of the said Road is of the Length of One Mile and Seven Furlongs and Fourteen Poles, or thereabout. And whereas by an Act, made in the Forty-fiest Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Ast for amending, widen- 41 G. 3. c. 129. ing, improving, and keeping in Repair, the Road leading from Padwington to Harrow on the Hill in the County of Middlesex, certain Persons were nominated and appointed Trustees for amending, widening, altering, improving, and keeping in Repair the faid Road, and for otherwife carrying the faid Act into Execution; it was by the said last recited Act (amongst other Things) enacled, That where any particular Part of the said Road, or any Bridge, Drain, or Sewer, being in and upon the said Road, which had been accustomed or ought to be repaired and maintained by any particular Per'on or Perfens, Body Politick or Corporate, by reason of the Tenure of any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, or otherwile, or by any County, or any Parish, I ownship, or Place therein, every such Part of the said Road, Bridge, Drain, or Sewer, should from

Time to Time be maintained and kept in Repair by such Person or Person sons, Body Corporate or Politick, County, Parish, Township, or Place, and in Juch. Mannerias, the same were respectively maintained and kept in, Repair, before the passing the said Act: And it was further enacted, that all Lands, Tenements, or Elereditaments, which then were or there. after should be liable to the amending any Part of the said Road, and all Owners, Occupiers, Grantees, Trustees, Feosffees, and Committees of any Lands, Tenements, Rents, and Annuities, or of any Sum or Sums of Money which had been given or were liable to the amending or maintaining any Part of the laid Road, or any Bridge or Bridges, Cauleway or Causeways, Sewer or Sewers, Drain or Drains therein, should still remain liable and chargeable to the Repairs thereof, in such Manner as they were before the passing of this Act: And whereas so much of the Road by the faid recited Act made in the Forty-first Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, directed to be amended and kept in Repair, as lies between the Red Lyon at Paddington aforelaid, and the Church at the said Town of Harrow upon the Hill, is the remaining Part of the Highway, directed to be repaired and amended by the faid Keepers and Governors by the faid recited Indenture bearing Date on or about the Nine-.... teenth Day of December in the Twenty-fifth Year of the Reign of Queen Elizabeth, and is of the Length of Nine Miles and Three Furlongs Twenty-one Poles and Five Yards and One Half, or thereabouts: And where is it would enable the faid Keepers and Governors to carry the Inten is and Purposes of the said recited Act, made in the Forty-third Year of the Reign of Elis present Majesty, into better Esfect, if they were enabled to hay the Rents and Profits of the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaingits, demiled and leased by them by virtue of the said recited Acts, in certain Proportions, to the said respective Trustees, to be by them applied in like, Manner and with the like Powers as the Tolls granted and made payable by virtue of the laid several recited Acts made in the Seventh Year of the Reign of King George the First, and in the Eighth and Twenty-ninth Years of the Reign of King George the Second, and in the Forty-field Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, are directed to be applied; and if the Plans of the Buildings to be erected on such Lands and Grounds, and the Leales thereof, were submitted to the Inspection and Approbation of the faid respective Trustees: But as such several Purposes cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament, May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament affembled, and by the Authority of the same, That, for and during the Continuance of the said recited Acts made in the Seventh Year of the Reign of King George the First, and in the Eighth and Twenty-ninth Years of the Reign of King George the Second, and in the Twenty-third Year of the Reign of his prefent Majesty, no such Lease of any such Lands and Premiles shall be made or granted by the said Keepers and Governors, or their Successors, until a Plan or Scheme of the Building or Buildings intended to be erected on the faid Lands and Premises shall have been prepared and laid before the Truffees appointed by or acting under and by virtue of the faid recited Acts made in the Seventh Year of the Reign of King George the First, and in the Eighth and Twenty-ninth Years of the Reign of King George the Second, and in the Twenty-third Year of the Reign of His pretent Majelly, at tome one of their Meetings to be holden

Provided always, and be it enacted, That all the Costs, Charges, For paying and Expences incident to and attending the applying for and obtaining and the Colls of the Act. passing this Act, and of carrying the same into Execution, as well on the Part of the said Keepers and Governors as of the said Trustees, shall in the first Place be paid, defrayed, and discharged by the said Keepers and Governors out of the Rents and Profits of luch Lands and Premiles received or to be received by the laid Keepers and Governors; and the Rents and Remainder of such Rents and Profits shall from Time to Time be ac- Profits to be counted for and paid over by the faid Keepers and Governors, to the Timbees in respective Trustees acting under the said recited Acts, or their respective certain Pro-Treasurers for the Time being, in the Proportions following; (that is to say), Two full and equal Eleventh Parts thereof, to the Trustees of the Roads from Saint Gites's Pound to Kilbourn, and Nine full and equal Eleyearth Parts thereof, to the Trustees of the said Roads from Paddington to Harrow, to be by them from Time to Time applied in making, repairing, widening, altering improving, and keeping in Repair, the faid Road leading from Harrow to London, and other the Purposes, Matters, and Things necellary to be done in the Execution of the said recited Acts, and in paying the Interest and Principal of any Money borrowed or to be borrowed by virtue thereof, and the Costs and Charges of making fuch Securities, and in all Respects in like Manner as the Tolls and Duties payable under and by virtie of the said Acts, are or may be liable to be paid and applied, and to no other Use or Purpose whatsoever.

VI. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be printed by the Printer to the King's most Excellent Majesty, and when so printed may be given in Evidence in all Courts of Justice, and before all Justices and Judges whomsoever, who shall take judicial Notice thereof in like Manner as if the same had been declared to be a Publick Act.
