An Act for the Preservation of Salmon and other Fish in the Rivers in the County of Carmarthen, and County of the Borough of Carmarthen.

[17th May 1805.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the Thirteenth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King Edward the First, intituled, A. 13 Rich. 2. Penalty for taking of Salmons at certain Times of the Year, whereby it was provided, that the Waters of Humber, Ouse, Trent, Done, Arre, Derwent, Whuse, Nidyore, Swale, Tese, and all other Waters (wherein Salmon be taken within the Kingdom) should be in Desence for taking Salmon from the Nativity of our Lady unto Saint Martin's Day; which Act was confirmed, and surther Provision made relating thereto by an Act, passed in the Thirteenth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King Richard the Second, intituled, A Confirmation of Thirteenth Edward First, Statute One Chapter Forty-seven, touching taking Salmons: And whereas the periods limited by the said Acts are not suited to the Fisheries for Salmon, Salmon Peal, or Salmon Kind, Sewen Bouges otherwise Sea Trout, or to the Protection of the Spawn or Fry of Salmon in the River or Water of Towy or Tewy, in the County of Carmarthen, and [Loc. & Per.]

County of the Borough of Carmarthen, and also in the Rivers or Waters

of Tivi, Tave, Cowin, Mydrim, Gwili, Cothy, Gwendracth Fawr, Gwn. draeth Fach, Pibror Sarodd, Clydach, Branc Lash, Twech, Twelly, Lougher, Ammon, Dulas, Gwetherich, Cwmdwr, Doithie. Pyscotdwr, Gwenfleod, Gwernlas Dwmnant, Marlefs, Garthgenning, and Conwill, or by what. soever other Name or Names the same are called or known; and all other the Rivers or Waters in the faid County of Carmarthen, and County of the Borough of Carmarthen, and have been found very prejudicial to the Owners and Proprietors of the Fisheries in such Rivers, and to the Pub. lick: And whereas it is necessary that Provision should be made for the better Preservation of Salmon, and the Spawn, Fry, or young Brood of Salmon, Salmon Peal, Salmon Kind, Sewen Louges or Sea Trout, in the faid Rivers or Waters, and in the feveral Rivulets or Streams of Water communicating therewith; May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That it shall be lawful for the respective Owners and Proprietors, and Persons legally entitled, and their respective Agents and Servants, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to fish in the said respective Rivers or Waters, commonly called, known, or distinguished by the Names of the Toroy or Terry, in the County of Carmarthen, and in the said County of the Borough of Carmarthen, and also in the Tivy, Tave, Cowin, Gwili, Cothy, Gwendraeth Fawr, Gwendraeth Fach, Pibrur, Sarudd Clydach, Brane Lash, Twech, Twelly, Lougher, Ammon, Dulas, Gwetherich, Cromdwr, Doithie, Pyscotdwr, Gwensleed, Gwenlas Dromnant, Marlefs, Garthgenning, and Convoill, or by whatfoever other Name or Names the same are called or known, and in all or any other Rivers in the said County of Carmarthen, and County of the Borough of Carmarthen, or in any of the Streams of Water communicating therewith respectively, at any Time or Times in the Year, after the pasting of this Act, until the First Day of November One thousand eight hundred and five, and in every subsequent Year between the First Day of April and the First Day of November, with legal and proper Nets, or Hooks and Lines, to take, kill, or destroy any Salmon, Salmon Peal, or Salmon Kind, Sewen Bouges or Sea Trout, and to offer to Sale any of fuch Fish so taken between the said last-mentioned Periods; and that all fuch Fish so taken within the said respective Rivers and Waters, and within the respective Periods asorchid, shall be deemed and considered to be in Season, and proper to be killed; the said recited Acts, or either of them, or any other Act or Acts, Law, Statute, Ordinance, or Custom, to the contrary notwithstanding.

Power for legal Owners, &c. to take Salmon, &c. with legal Nets, at certain Times.

For restraining Persons taking Salmons, etc. or pursuing or injuring the same. II. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That no Person shall at any Time hereafter, pursue, take, kill, or destroy, or seek or endeavour to take, kill, or destroy, pursue, hurt, or injure any such Fish, by Means of any Weapon called a Spear or by laying or using any hot Lime or Filth, or by Means of any Fire or Light, or white Object, nor lay or draw any Kind of Net, Engine, or Device, or wilfully do or commit, or cause to be done or committed, any Act whatsoever (except angling or sishing with Rods, Hooks, or Lines) in the said Rivers, or any of them, or any

Waters, Rivulets, Streams, Mill Dams, Mill Leads, Sluices, Cuts, Pools, or Ponds communicating therewith, whereby the Spawn or fmall Fry of Salmon therein, or any Kepper or Shedder Salmon, not being in Length Sixteen Inches or more, stiall be taken, killed, or destroyed, or shall Thereafter make, erect, or set any Bank, Dam, Hedge, or Stank, Net or Nets, across the said Rivers, Waters, or Rivulets, or any Part thereof, whereby the Salmon therein may be hindered from palling or going up to spawn, or the young Fry or young Salmon from going down the faid Rivers, Rivulets, or other Waters communicating therewith as aforefaid; nor shall at any Time or Times hereafter fish therein for Salmon with any other Net or Nets than such as is or are allowed by an Act passed in the First Year of the Reign of Queen Elizabeth, intituled, An Act for the Preferention of the Spanon and Fry of Fish; and no Owner, Proprietor, Servant, or Agent, or any other Person whomsoever, shall or may at any Time or Times hereafter between the First Day of November, and the First Day of April in any Year, take, kill, or destroy, pursue, hurt, or injure, or attempt or endeavour by any Art, Means, Contrivance, or Device, of what Kind foever, to feek, take, kill, or destroy, or to pursue, hurt, or injure any Salmon, Salmon Peal, or Salmon Kind, or any of the Spawn, Brood, or Fry of Salmon, or any Kepper or Shedder Salmon, or any Sewen Bouges or Sea Trout within the faid Rivers or any Waters, Rivulets, Streams, Mill Dams, Mill Leads, Sluices, Cuts, Pools, or Ponds communicating therewith, or offer to Sale or dispose, or buy or purchase, any Fish, Spawn, Brood, or Fry so taken in the said Rivers, or any Waters, Rivulets, Streams, Mill Dams, Mill Leads, Sluices, Cuts, Pools, or Ponds aforefaid, on pain of forfeiting for every such First Offence any Sum not exceeding Ten Pounds nor less than Twenty Shillings, and for every Second and subsequnet Ossence, any Sum not exceeding Twenty Pounds nor less than Forty Shillings, at the Discretion of the Mayor, or Justice or Justices before whom the Ossender or Ossenders shall be convicted, as herein-after mentioned, together with the Fish, Spawn, Brood, or Fry so taken, and all the Nets, Weapons, Lines, Instruments, Boats, Coracles, Devices, or Things, used in the taking thereof, or in the committing of any Offence against the Provisions of this Act.

III. And be it further enacted, That all the Penalties and Forfeitures For Recovery by this Act imposed, so far as the same relate to any Offences committed of Penalties. Within the said County of the Borough of Carmarthen, or any of the Liberthes thereof, shall and may be recovered before the Mayor, or any Justice of the Peace within the said County of the Borough; and all such Penalties and Forfeitures arising on any Ossence committed within any Part of the Port, River, and Water of Towy or Towy, between Carmarthen Bridge and the Bar of the same Port, or any of the Banks thereof (not being within the said County of the Borough of Carmarthen, or the Liberties thereof) shall and may be recovered before the said Mayor, or any Justice of the Peace within the said County of the Borough of Carmarthen, or before any Justice of the Peace of the said County of Carmarthen; and all Penalties and Forfeitures arising on any Offences committed in any Other Part of the said County of Carmarthen, shall and may be recovered before any Justice of the Peace of the said County; and every Person of fending against this Act may be convicted either upon View of any such

Mayor or Justices of the Peace, or by Confession of any such Ossender or Offenders, or by the Oath of One or more credible Witness or Witnesses, or by the Oath of any Owner, Proprietor, or other such Person legally entitled to fish as aforesaid, or of his, her, or their Agents or Servants, who are hereby respectively declared to be competent, good, and sufficient Witnesses in that Behalf, and which Oath any such Mayor or Justice of the said Borough or County is hereby authorized to administer; and every fuch Penalty may and shall be levied, by Distress and Sale of the Goods and Chattels of such Osfender, by Warrant under the Hand and Seal or Hands and Seals of any fuch Mayor, or Justice or Justices of the Peace, returning the Overplus (if any) after deducting and retaining thereout the Costs and Charges of such Distress and Sale, or otherwise relating to the Premises, to the Person so distrained on; and for want of such Distress, or in case the Ossender shall upon Demand neglect or refuse, or shall not be able to pay any fuch Penalty, then fuch Offenders shall for every such Offence be fent by such Mayor or Justices of the Peace, before whom such Conviction shall be made as aforesaid, to the Common Gaol or House of Correction of the said County or County of the Borough of Carmarthen, where such Offender shall be taken, in their respective Jurisdictions, there to be kept to hard Labour for any Time not exceeding Six Calendar Months, nor less than One Calendar Month; and the said Mayor or Justice of the Peace, either in the said County of the Borough, or County, before whom the Person or Persons offending shall be convicted, shall order fuch Nets, Engines, Instruments, and other Devices, kept or made use of for taking such Fish, to be seized, and immediately cut in pieces or otherwise destroyed, or disposed of in such Manner as he or they may think proper; and all fuch Penalties shall go and be distributed in the Manner following, that is to fay; One Half of all such Penalties as shall be recovered before the Mayor or any Justice of the Peace within the said County of the Borough of Carmarthen to the Person informing, and the other Half to the Poor of the Parish of Saint Peters, in the said County of the Borough; and One Half of all fuch Penalties as shall be recovered before any Justice of the Peace of the said County to the Person informing, and the other Half to the Poor of the Parish where the Ossence shall be committed.

Form of Conviction.

IV. And be it further enacted, That every Conviction under this Act shall be certified by the Mayor or Justice of the Peace by or before whom the same shall be made, to the General Sessions of the Peace to be held in and for the said County of the Borough, or to the Justices assembled at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the said County of Carmarthen where the Ossender or Ossenders shall be convicted, and shall be there siled amongst the Records of the said Sessions; and every such Conviction shall be in the Form of Words or to the Essect following; (that is to say),

BE it remembered, That on the Day of the Year A. B. was convicted before mc C. D.
Mayor of the County of the Borough of Carmarthen, [or E. F. one of

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i Act this being the First Offence [Second, or, Third Offence, as the " Case may be] and I [or, We] do hereby adjudge him sher, or, them; to pay and forfeit for the said Offence the Sum of lawful Money of Great Britain. Given under my Hand and Scal at in the County of the Day and · C. D. . Year above written.

Which said Conviction and Adjudication shall be good and valid in Law, to all Intents and Purposes, and shall not be quashed, set aside, or judged void or insufficient for want of Form only, and shall not be liable to be removed by Certiorari or otherwise into His Majesty's Court of King's Bench, or any of His Majesty's Courts of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Great Sessions in Wales.

V. And be it further enacted, That every Person who shall think him-Allowing to self or herself aggrieved by the Judgement of the said Mayor, or any Justice of the Peace, in any of the Cases aforesaid, may, if convicted of any Ossence committed within the faid County of the Borough, or any of the Liberties thereof, appeal to the Justices of the Peace for the County of the said Borough of Carmarthen, at their next General Sessions of the Peace to be held for the said County of the Borough of Carmarthen; or if convicted in any Part of the said County of Carmarthen, out of the said County of the Borough, or any of the Liberties thereof, to the Justices of the Peace of the County of Carmarthen, at their next General Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be held for the said County, who are hereby empowered to hear and finally determine the fame, so that the Person so appealing shall enter into a Recognizance before fuch Mayor or Justice, with sufficient Sureties, to be approved of by fuch Mayor or Justice, to abide the Event of fuch Appeal, and the Determination thereon to be made, and so that such Person so appealing shall, by himself or his Agent, give Ten Days previous Notice in Writing of such Appeal to the Party or Parties against whose Act or Acts such Appeal shall be made; and the Justices at such Sessions, in their respective Jurisdictions, are hereby required to hear and determine the Matter of every such Appeal, and make such Order therein, and award fuch Costs, as to them in their Discretion shall seem reasonable, and by their Order and Warrant to levy the Costs which shall be so awarded, by Distress and Sale of the Goods and Chattels of the Party or Parties liable to pay the same, rendering the Overplus (if any) to the Owner or Owners of fuch Goods and Chattels, after deducting the reasonable Charges of such Distress and Sale; which Determination of the said Justices in their respective Jurisdictions, shall be final and conclusive to all Parties concerned, and shall not be removed by Certiorari or any other Writ or Process whatsoever, into any of His Majesty's Courts of Record at Westminster, or Court of Great Session for the County and County of

the Borough of Carmarthen. VI. And whereas the Mayor, Burgesles, and Commonalty of the County Half of the Borough of Carmarthen, in order to promote the good Ends and Purposes the Actagreed propoled by this Act, have confented and agreed that Half the Charges to be paid by and Expences of obtaining this ASt shall be paid and defrayed by and out tion. of the Income or Monies belonging to the faid Corporation of the Borough

of Carmarthen, be it therefore enacted, That Half the Charges and Ex-[Luc. & Per.]

pences of obtaining this Act shall be paid and defrayed by the said Mayor, Burgesses, and Commonalty of the said County Borough of Carmarthen; and the said Corporation of the Borough of Carmarthen is hereby made liable and answerable for such Charges and Expences as aforesaid, and shall be and is hereby indemnished in the Payment thereof, and for such Application of the Money of the said Corporation.

Publick Act. VII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Publick Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others without being specially pleaded.

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
