## GEORGII III. REGIS.

## Cap. 105.

An Act for ascertaining the Farms and Lands in the Parish of Inglishcombe in the County of Somerset, of which the Great Tythes shall be paid to or taken by the Vicar for the Time being of that Parish.

[3d July 1806.]

HEREAS the Reverend John Batchellor is the Vicar of the Vicarage of the Patish Church of Inglishcombe in the County of Somerset and Diocese of the Bishop of Bath and Wells, and as such Vicar the said John Batchellor claims to be entitled to all Small Tythes and to the Great Tythes of divers Parcels of Lands situate for the most Part dispersedly in the said Parish, containing Three hundred and twenty-six Acres, or thereaboute, and specified or enumerated in an ancient Terrier taken in the Year One thousand six hundred and twentysix, now remaining in the Registry of the Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells, and intituled, "A true Note or Terrier of all the Glebe Lands, Gardens, Orchards, Houses, and Portions of Tythes belonging to the Vicarage of the Parish Church of Inglishcombe in the County of Somerset, taken by those whose Names are hereunder written, in the Year of our Lord God One thousand six hundred and twenty-six:' And whereas there is no other Evidence of the Certainty of such Lands, and from the Lapse of Time, the Tythes not having been taken in Kind, and various other Caules, it is impossible to ascertain with Certainty the greater Part of the Lands enumerated in the said Terrier: And whereas John Merewether of Calne in the County of Wilts Gentleman is the Patron of the said [Loc. & Per.] 24 C-D Church

Church, and also the Rector of the impropriate Rectory of the said Parish, and as such is the Owner in Fee of all the Great or Rectorial Tythes arising in the said Parith, other than entrexe of a certain Farm called Haycombe Farm, and of the faid Parcels of Land and Hereditaments enumerated in the faid Terrier, and hable to the hyment of Great Tythes to the said Vicar for the Time being: And whereas it is attended with great Inconvenience to the fatel John Batsbellor, and also to the said John Merewether, and productive of Litigation, that the Lands hable to the Payment of Great Exthes to the Idd Vicar cannot be aftertained, and on Account of the Uncertainty attending such Lands neither the said Vicar or Rector is in a Situation to enforce his just Dues: And whereas the said John Batchellor and John Merewether are desirous that certain Lands, situate in the said Parish of Inglishcombe, shall be allotted as those which shall be liable to the Payment of Great Tythes to the Vicar for the Time being of the faid Parish, in lieu of the Lands and Hereditaments of which the Great Tythes belong to the said Vicar: And whereas Three several Farms situate in the said Parish of Inglishcombe, now or lately belonging to Brickdale, Attwood, and Read, and now or late in the Occupation of John Cottle, containing together Phree hundred and Thirty Acres or thereabours, being the Farms and Lands herein-after described and also specified in the Schedule to this Act, have been agreed and allotted by and between the said John Batchellor and John Merewether, as the Farms and Lands which should pay Great Tythes to the said John Batchellor and his Successors as Vicars for the Time being; and such Farms and Lands are considered as affording Great Tythes of a Value exceeding the probable Value of the Great Tythes of the Parcels of Land and Hereditaments enumerated in the said Terrier: And whereas the said John Batchellor and John Merewether are desirbus that the faid Farms and Lands shall continue for ever hereaster liabse to the Payment of Great Tythes to the faid John Batchellor and his Successors, Vicars for the Time being of the said Parish of Inglishiombe, in lieu of and as a Compensation for the Great Tythes of such of the said Parcels of Land and Hereditaments enumerated in the said Terrier as are not comprized in the same Farms and Lands; and the Right Reverend Richard Lord. Bishop of Bath and Wells, as Ordinary of the said Diocese, is consenting that the said Arrangement and Agreement shall be perpetuated and established: But, inasmuch as the same Agreement cannot, by reason of the Laws now in force restraining Alienations by Ecclesiastical Persons, be carried into complete Effect without the Aid and Authority of Parliaments Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the said John Batchellor. and John Mereweiber, do most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporalo and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Author rity, of the same, That henceforth, and from Time to Time and at all Limes for ever hereafter, the Great or Rectorial Tythes and Tenths yearly, arising, coming, encreasing, and renewing upon, from, and out of al those Three several Farms, and every of them, situate in the said Parish of Inglishcomke, now or lately belonging to Brickdale, Attrapped, and Read, and now or late in the Occupation of John Gottle, containing together Three hundred and thirty Acres or thereabout, and every Part and Parcel of the same with the Appurtenances, being th Farms and Lands of which a Particular is contained in a Schedule of this it. Itall be annexed to and be deemed Parcel of the laid Vicarage, and

be payable and paid, yielded and rendered to the said John Batchellor and his Successors for the Time being, Vicars of the said Parish of Inglishcombe, as and for the Great Tythes of those Pieces or Parcels of Lands and other Hereditaments which are enumerated in the said Terrier, as liable to the Payment of Great Tythes; and the same Tythes shall be in lieu of and as an Equivalent for the Great Tythes of the same Lands and Hereditaments so enumerated in the said Terrier, and shall or may be recovered' and receivable by the laid Vicar and his Successors for the Time being, in the same or the like Manner as if the faid Three several Farms and Lands herein-before described were, in fact, the Pieces or Parcels of Land and Hereditaments in respect of which the Great Tythes were due and of Right payable to the said Vicar for the Time-being.

II. And be it further enacted, That henceforth, and from Time to The Great Time and at all Times for ever hereafter, the Great Tythes of such and other Lands so many and such Parts of the said Pieces or Parcels of Land and other to become Hereditaments, described in the said Terrier, and containing Three hun-Part of the dred and twenty fix Acres or thereabout, with the Appurtenances, as Rectory of are not Parcel of the said. Three several Farms and Lands, nor of the Inglisheombe. said Farm called Haycombe Farm, shall become and be Parcel of the impropriate Rectory of the said Parish of Inglishcombe, and be payable and paid, yielded and rendered to the said John Merewether, his Heirs, Appointees, and Assigns, and shall be vested in him, his Heirs, and Trustees, for the same or the like Estates, and pass and be transferrable in the same or the like Manner as if the same Tythes had been and had continued Parcel of the impropriate Rectory of the said Parish of Inglishcombe.

III. Saving always unto the King's most Excellent Majesty, His Heirs General and Successors, and to all and every other Person and Persons, Bodies Saving. Politick and Corporate, his, her, and their Heirs, Successors, Executors, and Administrators, (other than and except to the said John Batchellor and his Successfors, Vicars for the Time being of the said Parish Church of Inglishcombe, and the said John Merewether, his Heirs, Appointees, and Assigns, and all Persons claiming or to claim any Estate, Right, Title, or Interest under him or them,) all such Estate, Right, Title, Interest, Claim, and Demand whatsoever, of, in, to, and out of the said Tythes, which are ascertained and settled by this Act, as they, every, or any of them had before the passing-of this Act, or could or might have had, held, or enjoyed, in case this Act had not been passed.

IV. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be printed by the Evidence. Printer to the King's most Excellent Majesty; and a Copy thereof so printed shall be admitted as Evidence thereof by all Judges, Justices, and others.
