# GEORGI II. REGIS.

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## *Cap. 38.*

An Act for building a new Gaol for the County of the City of *Cork*, and for supplying the said Gaol with Water. [23d May 1806.]

**W**HEREAS the present Gaol of the County of the City of *Cork* is narrow and inconvenient, and not sufficiently large for the Reception and Keeping of the Number of Prisoners usually confined therein, and is situated in a close unhealthy Spot; and the Removal thereof will be conducive not only to the Accommodation of the Inhabitants residing in the Neighbourhood thereof, but also to the Security and Health of the Prisoners confined therein: And whereas a Piece or Pieces of Ground in a more healthful and convenient Situation may be had in the Suburbs or Liberties of the City of *Cork*, for the Purpose of erecting a new Gaol upon, if Powers were given to proper Persons for making Purchases, and to contract and agree for the building such new Gaol, with suitable Conveniencies thereto, and for supplying the same with good and wholesome Water: but as such Purposes cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament; May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, [Loc. & Per.] 8 H by

by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the Right Worshipful the Mayor of the City of *Cork* for the Time being, *Michael Busted, Richard Lane, Thomas Waggett, Charles Evanson, Rowland Morrison, William Lumley, John Forster, Thomas Gibbings, Robert Harding, John Cuthbert the Younger, Abraham Lane, Thomas Dunscombe, Christopher Cole, John Cotter the Younger, William Busted, Peter Besnard, George Knapp, Charles Henry Leslie, Bernard Shaw, William Beamish, William Connor, William Jones, John Moore Travers, Thomas Cuthbert, George Stevelly, Charles Cole, and Thomas Walker,* together with the Medical Attendant of the Gaol of the City of *Cork* for the Time being, and their Successors, to be elected in Manner herein mentioned, shall be and are hereby appointed Commissioners, with full Power and Authority for laying out, designing, making, building, and erecting a proper Gaol or Prison of and for the said City of *Cork*, with proper and sufficient Yards, Courts, Guard Houses, Out Offices, and Conveniencies, Passages, and Avenues for the same; and for supplying the said Gaol or Prison at all Times with a Sufficiency of good and wholesome Water for the Use of the said Gaol, and for the Construction of Sewers to carry off the Filth and Dirt of the said Gaol; and for making Reservoirs, Trenches, Watercourses, and Sewers, for the carrying a constant and sufficient Supply of Water for the Use of the said Gaol, and cleansing the same, and for repairing the said Reservoirs, Trenches, Watercourses, and Sewers, and for fixing and laying Pipes in, over, upon, or through any of the Lands and Grounds to be purchased or used by virtue of this Act; and for effecting the said several Purposes, it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Commissioners and their Successors to enter into and upon any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments within the said County of the City of *Cork*, and to agree and treat for the Purchase thereof or Use of the same for such Purposes, paying or tendering to the Owner or Owners, and Occupier or Occupiers thereof respectively, full and ample Satisfaction and Compensation for the Purchase thereof, and Damage done thereby, in manner herein mentioned; and it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Commissioners or their Successors to lay out, design, assign, and appoint how and in what Manner the said Gaol, and the Yards, Courts, Guard Houses, Out Offices, Conveniencies, Passages, and Avenues of the same shall be built, erected, and made, and with what Materials, and in what particular Scite and Situation the same shall be built, and how and in what Manner the same shall be supplied with Water; and how the said Gaol, and the several Buildings, Courts, Out Offices, Conveniencies, Passages, and Avenues of the same respectively, may and shall from Time to Time be preserved and kept in good Repair and Order, and to make Contracts and Agreements for and concerning the same, and to do all other Matters and Things requisite for carrying on and effecting the Purposes directed by this Act to be done, and to cause the same to be effectually perfected, as to them shall seem meet.

II. Provided always, and be it enacted, That nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, so as to empower the said Commissioners or their Successors, or any Person or Persons acting by or under their Authority, to take, use, injure, or Damage any House or other Building, or any Garden, Orchard, Yard, Park, Paddock, planted Walk

of Avenue to a House, without the Consent of the Owner or Owners thereof respectively.

III. And be it further enacted, That the said Commissioners shall meet Meetings at the Tholfell of the said City of *Cork*, on the Third Monday after the passing of this Act, between the Hours of Eleven in the Forenoon and Five in the Afternoon, and shall then and there proceed to carry this Act into Execution, and shall and may at such Meeting, and at their several Meetings to be holden for the Purpose of carrying this Act into Execution, from Time to Time adjourn themselves, and appoint their next Meeting to be holden at such Place in the said City of *Cork*, or in the County of the City of *Cork*, and at such Time, as to them shall seem proper; and if it shall so happen that there shall not appear at any such Meeting a sufficient Number of Commissioners to act in the Execution of this Act, the Commissioner or Commissioners then present, or the Clerk to the said Commissioners, shall from Time to Time, as often as such Case shall happen, adjourn such Meeting to some other Day, within Fourteen Days from the Day on which such Adjournment shall be made.

IV. And be it further enacted, That if after any Adjournment of any Meeting as aforesaid, it shall at any Time or Times be thought necessary Meetings on Emergencies that a Meeting of the Commissioners should be holden on an earlier Day than the Day to which such Meeting shall have been adjourned, then and in every such Case the Clerk to the said Commissioners (an Order in Writing, signed by Five or more of the said Commissioners, mentioning the Time and Place and Purpose of such earlier Meeting, being given to him, or left at his last or usual Place of Abode) shall forthwith give Notice of such earlier Meeting, and of the Time and Place which shall be mentioned in the Order of the said Commissioners, in Writing, by affixing the same to the Tholfell of the said City of *Cork* (such Time not being less than Six Days after such Notice); and all Proceedings of the said Commissioners at such earlier Meeting, shall be as good and valid as they would have been in case such Commissioners had met in pursuance of any Adjournment.

V. And be it further enacted, That no Act of the said Commissioners shall be or be deemed to be good, valid, or effectual, unless the same be done at some Meeting to be holden in pursuance of this Act (except as may be herein excepted); and that all the Powers and Authorities by this Act granted to the said Commissioners, shall and may be exercised from Time to Time by the major Part of them who shall attend at any Meeting to be holden in pursuance of this Act, the Number of such Commissioners present at such Meeting not being less than Five; and all the Orders and Proceedings of the major Part of such Commissioners present at such their several Meetings, shall have the same Force and Effect as if the same were made or done by all such Commissioners for the Time being (save and except as may be herein excepted); and at every Meeting of the said Commissioners a Chairman shall and may be appointed; and when and as often as it shall so happen, that there shall be an Equality of Votes at any such Meeting upon any Question (including the Vote of the Chairman) then and in such Case it shall and may be lawful to and for the Chairman to give the decisive or Casting Vote: Provided always, that no Person holding any Place or Office of Profit under the said Commissioners, shall act

act as a Commissioner during the Time that he shall hold any such Place or Office of Profit.

VI. And be it further enacted, That upon the Death, Refusal, or Disability to act of any of the said Commissioners hereby appointed, or of their Successors, to be elected in Manner herein mentioned, to act in the Execution of this Act, it shall and may be lawful to and for the surviving or remaining Commissioners, from Time to Time to elect and appoint one other Person to be a Commissioner in the room of each Commissioner so dying, refusing, or being incapable of acting; and every Person so elected a new Commissioner shall be and he is hereby empowered to act in the Execution of this Act to all Intents and Purposes, in as full and ample a Manner as the Commissioner in whose room or stead he shall have been so elected.

VII. And be it further enacted, That *William Phillips* Esquire, Treasurer of the City of *Cork*, and his Successor or Successors in the said Office, shall be deemed and taken to be the Treasurer for the Purpose of receiving and paying the Monies from Time to Time to be raised and paid pursuant hereto.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That the said Commissioners may and they are hereby empowered by Writing under their Hands, to appoint such Person as Clerk for the Execution of this Act as the said Commissioners shall think proper, and from Time to Time to remove such Clerk as they shall see Occasion; and out of the Monies to be received by virtue of this Act, to allow and pay such Salaries, Wages, and Allowances to such Treasurer and Clerk, as the said Commissioners shall think reasonable, not exceeding the Sum of Sixty Pounds each *per Annum*; and the said Commissioners shall and they are hereby authorized and required to take such sufficient Security from such Treasurer and Clerk, for the due Execution of their respective Offices, as they the said Commissioners shall think proper; and such Treasurer and Clerk shall, under their Hands respectively, at such Time or Times, and in such Manner as the said Commissioners shall direct, deliver to the said Commissioners, or to such Person or Persons as they shall appoint, true and perfect Accounts in Writing of all Matters and Things committed to their Charge by virtue of this Act, and also of all the Monies which shall have been by them received by virtue of and for the Purposes of this Act, and how much thereof hath been expended and disbursed, and for what Purpose, together with proper Vouchers for such Payments; and shall pay all such Monies as shall remain due from them to the said Commissioners, or to such Person or Persons as they shall appoint to receive the same; and every such Treasurer and Clerk shall, on the First *Monday* in the Month of *October* yearly, or at the First Meeting of the said Commissioners then next following, (although not thereunto required by the said Commissioners), lay their Accounts before the said Commissioners, in order that the same may be audited, passed, and allowed by them, if approved of; and the said Treasurer and Clerk so accounting, as aforesaid, shall upon Oath (which Oath any one of the said Commissioners is hereby empowered to administer) verify their said Accounts; and if any such Treasurer or Clerk shall refuse or neglect to make and render, or to verify upon Oath any such Account, or to produce

produce and deliver up the Vouchers relating to the same, or to make Payment as aforesaid; or shall refuse or wilfully neglect to deliver to the said Commissioners, or to such Person or Persons as they shall appoint to receive the same, within Six Days next after being thereunto required by the said Commissioners, by Notice in Writing given to or left at the last or usual Place of Abode of such Treasurer or Clerk, all Books, Papers, and Writings in his Custody or Power, relating to the Execution of this Act, or give Satisfaction to the said Commissioners respecting the same; and if Complaint shall be made by the said Commissioners, or by such Person or Persons as they shall appoint for that Purpose, of any such Refusal or Neglect as aforesaid, to any Justice of the Peace for the City, County, or Place wherein such Treasurer or Clerk so refusing or neglecting shall be or reside, such Justice may and he is hereby authorized and required to issue a Warrant under his Hand and Seal for the Treasurer or Clerk, so refusing or neglecting, to appear before him; and upon his appearing or not being to be found, to hear and determine the Matter in a summary way; and if upon the Confession of the Party, or by the Testimony of any credible Witness or Witnesses upon Oath (which Oath such Justice is hereby empowered to administer) it shall appear to such Justice that any of the Monies that shall have been received by virtue of this Act, shall remain due from such Treasurer or Clerk, such Justice may and he is hereby authorized and required, upon Nonpayment thereof, by Warrant under his Hand and Seal, to cause such Money to be levied by Distress and Sale of the Goods and Chattels of such Treasurer or Clerk; and if no Goods or Chattels of such Treasurer or Clerk can be found sufficient to answer and satisfy the said Money, and the Charges of distraining and selling the said Goods and Chattels, or if it shall appear to such Justice that such Treasurer or Clerk shall have refused or neglected to render and give such Account, or to verify the same as aforesaid, or to produce the Vouchers relating thereto, or that any Books, Papers, or Writings relating to the Execution of this Act, shall be in the Custody or Power of such Treasurer or Clerk, and such Treasurer or Clerk shall have refused or neglected to deliver or give Satisfaction respecting the same as aforesaid, then and in each and every such Case such Justice shall commit such Offender to the Common Gaol or House of Correction for the City, County, or Place where such Offender shall be or reside, there to remain, without Bail or Mainprize, until he shall give and make a true and perfect Account and Payment as aforesaid, or until he shall compound with the said Commissioners for such Money, and shall have paid such Composition in such Manner as they shall appoint (which Composition the said Commissioners are hereby empowered to make and receive) and until he shall deliver up such Books, Papers, and Writings, or give Satisfaction in respect thereof to the said Commissioners: Provided always, that no such Treasurer or Clerk shall be detained in Prison for want of sufficient Distress, by virtue of this Act, for any longer Space of Time than Twelve Calendar Months:

IX. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That if it shall happen that the Treasurer of the said County of the City of *Cork* shall at any Time hereafter be disabled by Sickness from attending the Duty of his Office at any Assizes, that then and in such Case the Attendance of his chief and principal Clerk shall be accepted and taken in his room, such chief Clerk doing and performing all Things requisite and necessary to be done and

performed by such Treasurer at the said Assizes relative to the Duty of his said Office; provided that it shall appear to the Satisfaction of the Judge and Grand Jury at the said Assizes, by the Affidavit of the said Treasurer, and also by Affidavit of a Physician, to be respectively sworn before Two of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the said County, that the said Treasurer is really sick, and unable with Safety to himself to attend the Duty of his said Office at the said Assizes.

X. And be it further enacted, That the said Commissioners shall cause to be provided and kept a proper Book or Books, and fair and regular Entries to be made therein of all their Acts, Orders, and Proceedings relative to the Execution of this Act, and of the Names of all such Commissioners as shall be present at their several Meetings; and all Entries in such Book or Books, being signed by the Chairman and Clerk then present or either of them, shall be deemed Originals, and shall be allowed to be read as Evidence in all Cases, Suits, and Actions, touching or concerning any Thing done in pursuance of this Act.

XI. And be it further enacted, That whenever any Action shall be brought by the Order of the said Commissioners, against any Person or Persons by virtue or in pursuance of this Act, the same may be brought in the Name of their Clerk, or in the Name of any one of the said Commissioners, on Behalf of the said Commissioners; and no such Action shall abate or be discontinued by the Death or Removal of the Person in whose Name the same shall be brought; but no such Clerk or Commissioner, or any or either of them, shall be subject to the Payment of any Costs or Expences on Account thereof, but all such Costs and Expences shall be defrayed out of the Money received by virtue of this Act.

XII. And be it further enacted, That the said Commissioners shall and they are hereby authorized and required, when and as soon as the said new Gaol shall be built and finished proper for the Reception of Prisoners, and the Prisoners confined in the present Gaol shall have been committed and removed to the new Gaol, to take and pull down or cause to be taken or pulled down the present Gaol, and to sell and dispose of the Timber, Stones, Bricks, Tiles, Slates, Planks, Iron, Lead, Glass, and all Materials of which the present Gaol consists, to any Person or Persons whomsoever; and the Money arising by such Sale or Sales shall be applied by the said Commissioners towards discharging the Costs, Charges, and Expences incurred in obtaining and passing this Act, and of carrying the same into Execution; and the present Gaol, and all the Timber, Stones, Bricks, Tiles, Slates, Planks, Iron, Lead, Glass, and all the Materials of which the present Gaol consists, and also the Gaol to be built by virtue of this Act, and all the Timber, Stones, Bricks, Tiles, Slates, Planks, Iron, Lead, Glass, and all other Articles and Things bought or procured for the Purposes of this Act, shall be and the same is and are hereby vested in the said Commissioners; and the said Commissioners are hereby empowered to bring or cause to be brought any Action or Actions, or to prefer or order the preferring of any Bill or Bills of Indictment against any Person or Persons whomsoever who shall injure, damage, or destroy either of such Gaols, or any Part or Parts thereof respectively, or shall injure, damage, destroy, steal, take, or carry away such Timber, Stones, Bricks, Tiles, Slates,

Slates, Planks, Iron, Lead, Glafs, Materials, Articles, Matters or Things or any of them, or any Part or Parts thereof; and in all such Actions and Bills of Indictment, it shall be deemed and taken to be sufficient to state generally that the Article or Articles, Thing or Things, for or on Account of which such Action or Actions shall be brought, or Bill or Bills of Indictment preferred, is or are the Property of *The Commissioners for building a new Gaol for the City of Cork*, without particularly stating or specifying the Name or Names of all or any of the said Commissioners.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That when and as soon as the present Gaol shall be taken or pulled down, and the several Articles and Things of which the same consisted taken away and removed, so much of the Scite thereof as now fronts the main Street of the said City of *Cork*, being in Breadth Thirty-two Feet or thereabouts, and in Depth Thirty-two Feet or thereabouts, shall be laid into and become Part of the said main Street, and shall for ever thereafter be and continue a public and common Highway; and the Remainder of such Scite shall be, and the same is hereby declared to be vested in the said Commissioners in Fee Simple, and shall be by them sold for the best Price that can be reasonably had for the same; and the Conveyance thereof being executed by any Five or more of the said Commissioners, shall be good, valid, and effectual to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever; and the Money arising from such Sale shall be applied by the said Commissioners towards discharging the Costs, Charges, and Expences incurred in obtaining and executing this Act, and carrying the same into Execution.

XIV. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to and for all Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, Corporations Aggregate or Sole, and all Tenants for Life, or in Fee Tail General or Special, or for Years determinable on any Life or Lives, and all Feoffees in Trust, Executors, Administrators, Guardians, Committees of Idiots and Lunatics, and Husbands, and all other Trustees whatsoever, for and on Behalf of any Infants, Females Covert, or Cestuique Trusts, Idiots, Lunatics, or other Persons under any Disability of acting for themselves, and for all and every Person or Persons who are or shall be seised, possessed of, or interested in any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, to treat and agree with the said Commissioners for the absolute Sale thereof, or of any Part thereof, or for their Interest therein, and to convey the same to the said Commissioners for the several Purpose aforesaid; and that all Contracts, Agreements, Sales, and Conveyances which shall be so made, shall be valid and effectual to all Intents and Purposes, any Law, Usage, or other Matter or Thing to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding; and that all such Feoffees in Trust, Executors, Administrators, Guardians, Committees, Husbands, and Trustees, Tenants for Life, or in Fee Tail General or Special, or for Years determinable on any Life or Lives. Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, Aggregate or Sole, and other Persons, are and shall be indemnified for what they do by virtue or in pursuance of this Act.

XV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That if any such Body Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, Tenant or Tenants for Life, or in Fee Tail General or Special, or for Years dererminable on any Life or Lives,

If Commissioners cannot agree with Parties, a Jury may be summoned

OR

or any Trustee or Trustees, or any other Person or Persons interested in any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments to be taken or used by virtue of this Act, shall, upon Notice in Writing signed by the Clerk to the said Commissioners, given to the principal Officer of any such Body Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, or to such Trustee or Trustees, Person or Persons respectively, or left at the last or usual Place or Places of his or their Abode, or with the Tenant or Tenants, Occupier or Occupiers of any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments to be made use of for the Purposes of this Act, for the Space of Twenty-eight Days next after such Notice, neglect or refuse to treat, or shall not agree with the said Commissioners, or by reason of Absence or otherwise shall be prevented from treating, or through Disability by Nonage, Coverture, or other Impediment, cannot treat for himself, herself, or themselves, or make such Agreement or Agreements as shall be necessary for the Purposes aforesaid, or shall not, within the beforementioned Space of Twenty-eight Days, produce and fully disclose the State of the Title to the Premises which they are or shall be in Possession of, and to the Interest which they claim therein, then and in every such Case the said Commissioners shall and they are hereby empowered and required to issue a Warrant under their Hands and Seals, to the Sheriffs of the County of the City of *Cork*, commanding such Sheriffs to impanel, summon, and return a competent Number of substantial Persons qualified to serve on Juries, and the said Sheriffs are hereby required accordingly to impanel, summon, and return Sixty at the least of sufficient and indifferent Men, being Freeholders of the County of the City of *Cork*, or the County of *Cork* or either of them, or partly consisting of both, qualified according to Law, to be returned for Trials of Issues in His Majesty's Courts at *Dublin*, to appear before the said Commissioners at such Time and Place as in such Warrant shall be appointed, such Time not being less than Fourteen nor more than Twenty-eight Days after such Warrant shall be served upon the said Sheriffs, out of which Persons so to be impanelled, summoned, and returned, a Jury of Twelve Persons shall be drawn, by some Person to be by the said Commissioners for that Purpose appointed, in like Manner as Juries for the Trials of Issues joined in His Majesty's Four Courts of *Dublin* are by Law directed to be drawn; and in case a sufficient Number of Persons qualified to serve as Jurymen, shall not appear at the Time and Place so to be appointed as aforesaid or that by means of Challenges or otherwise there shall be a Default of Twelve Jurors for such Trial, the said Sheriffs shall return other honest and indifferent Men of the Standers-by, or that can speedily be procured to attend that Service (being so qualified as aforesaid) to make up the said Jury to the Number of Twelve; and every such Jury and Jurymen, and Person and Persons so impanelled, summoned, and returned as aforesaid, shall be liable and subject to the same Regulations, and to the same Pains and Penalties for Default, as if he and they had been returned for the Trial of any Issue joined in any of His Majesty's Courts at *Dublin*; and all Parties concerned may have their lawful Challenges against any of the said Persons so impanelled, summoned, and returned as aforesaid, but shall not challenge the Array; and the said Commissioners are hereby empowered and required by a Summons or Notice, to be signed by any Five or more of the said Commissioners, either previous to or at the Time of any such Meeting or Meetings, to summon and call before them all and every Person or Persons who shall be thought necessary to be examined as

a Witness or Witnesses touching the Matters in question, and to hear and examine such Witness or Witnesses upon Oath; and the said Commissioners may order and authorize the said Jury, or any Two or more of them, to view the Place or Places, or Matter or Matters in question, which Jury upon their Oaths (which Oaths as well as the Oaths to such Person or Persons as shall be called upon to give Evidence, the said Commissioners are hereby empowered to administer) shall examine, assess, and ascertain the Sum of Money to be paid for the Purchase of such Lands, Tenements, or other Hereditaments, or the Recompence to be made for the Damages that shall or may be sustained as aforesaid, and shall assess separate Damages for the same; and the said Commissioners shall give Judgement for such Purchase Monies, or Recompence so to be assessed by such Jury; which said Verdict, and the Judgement thereupon pronounced as aforesaid, shall be signed by the said Commissioners, and shall be binding and conclusive, to all Intents and Purposes, against all Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, and all Persons whomsoever, and shall be entered in the Rolls Office of His Majesty's High Court of Chancery in *Ireland*, and shall not be removed by *Certiorari* or other Process into any of His Majesty's Courts of Record at *Dublin*, or any other Court; any Law or Statute to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding.

XVI. And be it further enacted, That if the Sheriffs so directed to, summon and return a Jury as aforesaid, or their Deputy or Agent, shall make Default in the Premises, they shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Twenty Pounds nor less than Five Pounds; and if any Person so summoned and returned as aforesaid upon such Jury, shall not appear, or appearing shall refuse to be sworn or to give his Verdict, or in any other Manner wilfully neglect his Duty, contrary to the true Intent of this Act; or if any Person so summoned to give Evidence shall not appear, or appearing shall refuse to be sworn or examined or to give Evidence, every Person so offending shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Ten Pounds.

XVII. And be it further enacted, That all and every Person and Persons who, in any Examination to be taken by virtue of this Act, shall wilfully give false Evidence before the said Commissioners, or before any such Jury, or before any Justice of the Peace acting as such in the Execution of this Act, shall and may be prosecuted for the same; and upon Conviction thereof, shall be liable to the same Pains and Penalties as Persons guilty of wilful and corrupt Perjury are by the Laws in being subject and liable to.

And be it further enacted, That when the said Gaol so to be built and erected for the said County of the City of *Cork*, by virtue of this Act, shall be made fit for the Reception and safe Keeping of such Debtors, Felons, and other Prisoners as may be lawfully confined and imprisoned therein; and on the said Commissioners or their Successors, or any Five or more of them, giving Notice in Writing thereof to the Sheriffs of the said County of the City of *Cork*, it shall and may be lawful for the said Sheriffs, and they are hereby required to remove to such new Gaol all such Debtors, Felons, and other Prisoners as shall be then in Custody; and the Expence of such Removal and Removals from the present Gaol or Prison to the said new Gaol or Prison, shall be allowed and paid to such Sheriffs by the said City of *Cork*; and such Removal or Removals shall not be deemed or taken to be an Escape or Escapes.

And be it further enacted, That all Penalties and Forfeitures by virtue of this Act imposed (the Manner of levying and recovering whereof is not hereby otherwise particularly directed) shall be levied and recovered by Distress and Sale of the Goods and Chattels of the Offender, by Warrant under the Hand and Seal of any Justice of the Peace for the County, City, or Place where the Offence shall happen, which Warrant such Justice is hereby empowered to grant upon the Confession of the Party, or upon the Evidence of any credible Witness upon Oath, and which Oath such Justice is hereby empowered to administer; and the Overplus, if any, of the Money arising by any such Distress and Sale, shall be returned upon Demand to the Owner of such Goods and Chattels, after deducting the Costs and Charges of making the Distress and Sale; and the Penalties and Forfeitures when recovered (if not herein-before directed to be otherwise applied) shall be paid to the Treasurer to the said Commissioners, to be applied towards the Purposes of this Act; and in case sufficient Distress shall not be found, or such Penalties and Forfeitures shall not be paid forthwith, it shall and may be lawful to and for such Justice, and he is hereby authorized and required, by Warrant under his Hand and Seal, to cause the Offender to be committed to the Common Gaol or House of Correction, there to remain, without Bail or Mainprize, for any Time not exceeding Three Calendar Months nor less than Fourteen Days, unless such Penalties and Forfeitures shall be sooner fully paid and satisfied.

XXXVI. And be it further enacted, That in all Cases any Justice of the Peace may act as such in the Execution of the Powers herein contained, notwithstanding his being a Commissioner, except in Cases where he shall be personally interested.

Provided always, and be it enacted, That if any Person or Persons shall think himself, herself, or themselves aggrieved by any Thing done in pursuance of this Act, such Person or Persons may appeal to the Justices of the Peace at the First General Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be holden for the said County, City, or Place within which the Matter of Appeal shall arise, next after the Expiration of Four Calendar Months from the Time such Matter of Appeal shall have arisen, the Person or Persons appealing having first given Ten Days Notice at least of his, her, or their Intention to bring such Appeal and of the Matter thereof, to the Treasurer or Clerk to the said Commissioners; and the Justices in such Sessions are hereby authorized and required to hear and determine the Matter of such Appeal in a summary way, and to make such Determination therein as they shall judge proper; and such Determination shall be final, binding, and conclusive to all Parties, to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever.

XXXVIII. And be it further enacted, That where any Distress shall be made for any Sum of Money to be levied by virtue of this Act, the Distress itself shall not be deemed unlawful, nor the Party or Parties making the  
same



same be deemed a Trespasser or Trespassers on Account of any Defect or want of Form in the Summons, Conviction, Warrant of Distress, or other Proceedings relating thereto; nor shall the Party or Parties distraining be deemed a Trespasser or Trespassers, *ab initio*, on Account of any Irregularity which shall be afterwards done by the Party or Parties so distraining; but the Person or Persons aggrieved by such Irregularity, shall and may recover full Satisfaction for the special Damage in an Action upon the Case.

XXXIX. And be it further enacted, That no Order, Verdict, Assessment, Judgement, or other Proceedings made touching or concerning any of the Matters aforesaid, or touching or concerning the Conviction of any Offender or Offenders against this Act, shall be quashed or vacated for want of Form only, or be removed or removable by *Certiorari*, or any other Writ or Process whatsoever, into any of His Majesty's Courts of Record at *Dublin*; any Law or Statute to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding.

XL. And be it further enacted, That no Plaintiff or Plaintiffs shall recover in any Action to be commenced against any Person or Persons for any Thing done in pursuance of this Act, unless Notice in Writing shall have been given to the Defendant or Defendants Twenty-one Days before such Action shall be commenced, of such intended Action, signed by the Attorney for the Plaintiff or Plaintiffs, specifying the Cause of such Action; nor shall the Plaintiff or Plaintiffs recover in such Action, if Tender of sufficient Amends hath been made to him, her, or them, or his, her, or their Attorney, by or on Behalf of the Defendant or Defendants before such Action brought; and in case no such Tender shall have been made, it shall and may be lawful to and for the Defendant or Defendants in any such Action, by Leave of the Court after such Action shall have been brought, at any Time before issue joined, to pay into Court such Sum of Money as he, she, or they shall think fit, whereupon such Proceedings, Order, and Judgement, shall be made and given in and by such Court, as in other Actions where the Defendant is allowed to pay Money into Court.

XLI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That no Action or Suit shall be commenced against any Person or Persons for any Thing done in pursuance of this Act, after Six Calendar Months next after the Fact committed; and every such Action or Suit shall be brought and tried in the County of *Cork*, or in the County of the City of *Cork*, and not elsewhere; and if any such Action or Suit shall be brought before Twenty-one Days Notice shall have been given, or after a sufficient Satisfaction made or tendered as aforesaid, or after the Time limited for bringing the same as aforesaid, or shall be brought in any other County than as aforesaid, then the Jury shall find for the Defendant or Defendants; and upon such Verdict, or if the Plaintiff or Plaintiffs shall be nonsuited, or discontinue his, her, or their Action or Suit, after the Defendant or Defendants shall have appeared, or if upon Demurrer Judgement shall be given against the Plaintiff or Plaintiffs, then the Defendant or Defendants shall recover double Costs, and have such Remedy for recovering the same, as any Defendant hath for Costs of Suit in other Cases by Law.

Limitation of Actions.

Public Act.

XLII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.

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
