An Act for vesting certain undivided Parts or Shares, devised by the Will of Hannah Bedford, Widow, of and in several Estates in the Counties of Cornwall and Devon, in Trustees, to be sold, and for investing the clear Purchase Monies, under the Direction of the High Court of Chancery, in other Estates, to be settled in lieu thereof and to the [23d May 1806.] same Uses.

HEREAS Hannah Bedford, of Launceston, in the County of Will of Han-Cornwall, Widow, duly made and published her last Will nah Bedsord. and Testament in Writing, bearing Date the Twenty-eighth dated April Day of April, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-eight, and 28, 1788. thereby, after reciting that she was seised of an absolute Estate of In-[Loc. & Per.] heritance

heritance in Fee-simple, of and in one undivided third Part of several Manors or Lordships, or reputed Manors or Lordships, Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, and Parts and Shares of Manors or Lordships, or reputed Manors or Lordships, Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, with their and every of their Rights, Members, and Appurtenances, situate, lying, and being in the County of Cornwall, and County of Devon; or one of them, theretofore the Lands and Inheritance of Northmore Herles her deceased Brother; and also of and in an undivided third Part of divers other Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, situate in and about Lostwithiel, in the said County of Cornwall, which were the Lands and Inheritance of her deceased Father; she the said Testatrix gave and devised one-sixth Part or Share of and in the said third Part, the same respectively into six equal Parts to be divided, and of the Reversions, Remainders, Rents, Issues, and Profits thereof respectively, unto her Nephew Samuel Pierce, his Heirs and Assigns for ever, to the Use of her Nephew Humphry Lawrence and his Assigns, for his Life, with Remainder to the Use of the said Samuel Pierce and his Assigns, during the Life of the said Humphry Lawrence, in Trust, to preserve the contingent Uses and Estates therein-after limited; and from and after the Death of the said Humphry Lawrence, leaving any Child or Children of his Body then living, then to the Use of such Child (if but one), and of all and every the Children (if more than one), of the Body of the said Humphry Lawrence lawfully begotten, in Tail general, with Cross-remainders between them and their respective Issue, in like Manner in common, in Tail-general; and in case there should be no such Child or Children of the Body of the said Humphry Lawrence, or there being such, all of them should happen to die without Issue of their Bodies, then to the Use of the said Testatrix's Nephews and Nieces Charles Pierce, the faid Samuel Pierce, Elizabeth Kendall Pierce, Charlotte Pierce, and Mary Pierce, equally as Tenants in common, and of their several and respective Heirs and Assigns for ever: And whereas the said Testatrix, Hannah Bedford, died in the Year One thousand seven hundred and eighty-eight without altering or revoking her said Will: And whereas the said Humpbry Lawrence is in Possession and in the Receipt of the Rents and Profits of the said devised sixth Part of a third Part of and in the said Estates, in the said Counties of Cornwall and Devon, as Tenant for Life thereof, under the Limitations contained in the said Will: And whereas the said Humphry Lawrence hath Issue Four Children; namely, Charlotte Lawrence, Harriet Elizabeth Lawrence, Christopher Morsbead Lawrence, and Northmore Herle Pierce Lawrence, all Infants: Indenture of And whereas by Indentures of Lease and Release, dated respectively the Third and Fourth Days of March One thousand eight hundred Release, dat- and six, the said Charles Pierce, Elizabeth Kendall- Pierce, Charlotte Pierce, and Mary Pierce, being Four of the Five Devisees in Fee of 18c6, recited. the ultimate Remainder or Reversion in Fee-simple, of and in the said sixth Part of one-third Part of the said Estates, in the Counties of Corn-

wall and Devon, did, in consideration of the Sum of Ten Pound's to. each of them paid by the said Samuel Pierce, the other of the said Five Devisees in Remainder, grant, release, and convey all their sourfifth Parts of the said sixth Part of an undivided third Part of the same Estate's, unto and to the Use of the said Samuel Pierce, and his Heirs and Assigns for ever, to and for his and their own Use and Benefit, so that the said Samuel Pierce is now solely seised of the said pltimate Remainder or Reversion in Fee-simple, of the whole of the said devised sixth Part of an undivided third Part of the said Estates, in the Counties of Cornwall and Devon, expectant on the Death and Failure of Issue; of the said Humpbry Lawrence as aforesaid: And whereas the said Estates, of which a sixth Part of a third Part is so devised by the said Will of the said Hannah Bedford as aforesaid, consist of several Messuages, Farms, and Lands, Tin Mines, and Tin Works, Part let to Tenants at several Rents. amounting to, or producing the clear yearly Sum of One thousand, six hundred and thirty. Pounds and Seven-pence, and the remaining Part being in Hand, all which Premises are particularly mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Act: And whereas great Inconvenience arises to the said Humphry Lawrence, the Tenant for Lise, and may arise to the Parties interested in Remainder, under the Limitations in the said recited Will, by reason, of the said Estates being held by several Persons in undivided Shares; and the said Humpbry Lawrence and Samuel Pierce apprehend, that much Benefit and Advantage would arise to all Parties interested in the said devised sixth Part of an undivided third Part of the said Estates, if the same sixth Part of a third Part were vested in Trustees to be sold, and the clear Purchase Monies to be invested under the Direction of the High Court of Chancery, in the Purchase of another real Estate, to be settled in lieu thereof, and to the same Uses; and they are therefore desirous that such Sale and Investment may take Place: But in as much as by reason of the Limitations contained in the said Will of the said Hannah Bedford, the Purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament: Therefore your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the said Humpbry Lawrence, on behalf of himself and his said sour infant Children, and the said Samuel Pierce, do most humbly beseech your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted, by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same. deceased Brother of the said Testatrix Hannah Bedford; and all that the aforesaid one undivided sixth Part of one-third Part, so as aforesaid devised by the same Will, of and in the aforesaid other Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, situate in and about Lostwithiel in the said County of Cornwall, which were the Lands and Inheritance of the said deceased Father of the said Testatrix, all which Premises are particularly mentioned and described in the said Schedule to this Act, with their and every of their Rights, Members, Easements, and Appurtenances, and the Reversion and Reversions, Remainder and Remainders, Rents, Issues, and Profits thereof, shall, from and immediately after the passing of this Act, be settled upon and vested in, and the same are hereby from thenceforth settled upon and vested in the said Samuel Pierce and Thomas Pearse of Launceston aforesaid, Gentlemen, and their Heirs, to the Use of them the said Samuel Pierce and Thomas Pearse, their Heirs and Assigns for ever, freed and absolutely acquitted, exonerated, exempted, and discharged of and from all and every of the Uses Trusts, Estates, Powers, Provisos, Limitations, and Directions, in and by the said Will of the said Hannah Bedford limited, expressed, and declared of and concerning the same; but nevertheless upon the several Trusts, and to and sor the several Ends, Intents, and Purposes hereinaster expressed and declared; (that is to say) upon Trust, that they the said Samuel Pierce and Thomas Pearse, and the Survivor of them, and the Heirs and Assigns of such Survivor, shall and do, at any Time or Times, with the Consent and Approbation of the said Humphry Lawrence, to be testified by some Writing signed by him, and if he shall be dead, then by and for the proper Authority of the same Trustees respectively, sell and dispose of the said undivided Parts or Shares hereby settled and vested as aforesaid; of and in the aforesaid Manors or Lordships, or reputed Manors or Lordships, Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, and Parts and Shares of Manors or Lordships, or reputed Manors or Lordships, Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments hereinbefore described, with their and every of their Rights, Members, Easements, and Appurtenances, and the Feesimple thereof, either entirely or in Parcels, and by public Sale, or by private Contract, unto any Person or Persons who shall be willing to become the Purchaser or Purchasers of the same Premises, for the best Price or Prices that can be reasonably obtained or gotten for the fame; and upon Payment of the Monies for which the same Premises, or any Part or Parts thereof shall be sold, in Manner hereinafter mentioned, into the Bank of England, shall and do convey and assure the same unto and to the Use of the Purchaser or Purchasers thereof, and his, her, or their Heirs and Assigns respectively, or as he, she, or they shall direct or appoint, freed and discharged, and acquitted, exempted, and exonerated as aforesaid.

Application of the Mo-ney, &c.

II. And be it further enacted, That all and every the Sum and Sums of Money which shall arise from any Sale or Sales made in pursuance

of this Act, shall be paid by the Purchaser or Purchasers into the Bank of England, in the Name and with the Privity of the Accountant. General of the High Court of Chancery, to be placed to his Account there, ex parte the Purchasers of the Estates of the said Hannah Bedford, Widow, deceased, pursuant to the Method prescribed by the Act of the Twelfth Year of the Reign of King George the First, Chapter the Thirty-second, and the General Orders of the said Court, and without Fee or Reward, according to the Act of the Twelfth Year of King George the Second, Chapter the Twenty-fourth; and all the said Monies so paid into the Bank, shall, upon Petition to the High Court of Chancery in a summary Way by the said Humpbry Lawrence, or the Person or Persons for the Time being entitled to the Rents and Profits of the Estates to be purchased, be laid out and invested in the Purchase or Purchases of Freehold Messuages, Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments in England, and of Copyhold Lands and Hereditaments which may lie contiguous thereto, and be convenient to be held therewith, all which Premises so to be purchased, shall be conveyed, settled, and assured to, upon, and for, and under and subject to such and so many of the Uses, Intents, and Purposes, Powers, Provisos and Declarations, in and by the said Will of the said Hannah Bedford deceased, limited, and declared, of and concerning the said sixth Part ot an undivided third Part, hereby settled and vested as aforesaid. of and in the said Manors or Lordships, or reputed Manors or Lordships, Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, and Parts and Shares of Manors or Lordships, or reputed Manors or Lordships, Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments in the said Counties of Cornwall and Devon, as shall be then subsisting and capable of taking Effect.

III. And be it further enacted, That all Monies which shall be paid Until such into the Bank, in the Name of the said Accountant-General, in the Manner hereinbefore directed, shall in the mean Time, and until the same shall be invested in Purchases under the Directions of this Act, be from time to time laid out by the said Accountant-General in the out in the Purchase of Navy or Victualling, or Transport Bills, or Exchequer Bills; and the Interest arising from the Money so laid out in the said Victualling Navy or Victualling, or Transport Bills, or Exchequer Bills, and the Money received for the same, as they shall respectively be paid off by Government, shall be laid out in the Name of the said Account-General in the Purchase of other Navy or Victualling, or Transport Bills. or Exchequer Bills; all which said Navy and Victualling Bills, and Transport and Exchequer Bills, shall be deposited in the Bank, in the Name of the said Accountant-General, and shall there remain until the same shall, upon Petition to be preferred in a summary Way by the said Humphry Lawrence, or such other Person or Persons as aforesaid, be ordered to be sold by the Accountant-General for completing the Purchase or Purchases hereby authorized to be made as aforesaid, ni such Manner as the said Court of Chancery shall think just and [Loc. & Per.] meet;

meet; and if the Money arising by the Sale of any such Navy, Victualing, Transport, or Exchequer Bills, which shall have been purchased as aforesaid, shall exceed the amount of the original Purchase Money so laid out as aforesaid, then and in that case only the Surplus which shall remain, shall be paid to such Person or Persons respectively as would have been entitled to receive the Rents and Profits of the Lands hereby directed to be purchased, in case the same had been purchased pursuant to this Act, or to the Representative of such Perfon or Persons.

with the Receipt of the Cashier of the sufficient Discharge to the Purchaser for the Purchase Money.

IV. And be it further enacted, That the Certificate or Certificates. of the said Accountant-General, together with the Receipt or Receipts ant-General, of one of the Cashiers of the Bank, to be thereto annexed and therewith filed in the proper Office of the said Court of Chancery, of the Payment into the Bank of England by the Purchaser or Purchasers of Bank, to be a any of the Hereditaments hereby authorized to be sold, of his or their Purchase Monies respectively, or of any Part or Parts thereof, shall from time to time be a good and effectual Discharge to such Purchaser or Purchasers, and to his or their respective Heirs, Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, for the said Purchase Monies, or so much thereof: for which such Certificates and Receipts shall be respectively given; and after filing such Certificates and Receipts as aforesaid, such Purchaser or Purchasers shall be absolutely acquitted and discharged of and from the said Monies, and shall not be answerable or accountable for any Loss, Misapplication, or Non-application therof.

By whom Rents are to be received, until Sale is effected.

V. And be it surther enacted, That in the mean time, and until such Sales shall be made as aforesaid, of the Hereditaments hereby authorized to be fold, they the said Samuel Pierce and Thomas Pearle, and the Survivor of them, and his Heirs, shall permit and suffer the Rents and Profits of the same Hereditaments to be had, received, and taken, by such Person or Persons as would respectively have been entitled to have, hold, receive, and enjoy the same, in case this Act had not been made.

General Saving of Rights.

VI. Saving always to the King's most Excellent Majesty, his Heirs, and Successors, and to all and every other Perlon and Persons, Bodies Politic and Corporate, his, her, and their Heirs, Successors, Executors, and Assigns, (other than and except the said Humphry Lawrence, and all and every the Child and Children of him the said Humphry Lawrence, and the Heirs of the Body and respective Bodies of fuch Child and Children respectively, and the said Samuel Pierce, and his Heirs and Assigns) all such Estate, Right, Title, Interest, Claims, and Demands whatsoever, of, in, to, or out of the said Premises hereby vested in trust to be sold as aforesaid, or any Part thereof, as they, every, or any of them had before the passing of this Act, or could or might have had, held, or enjoyed in case this Act had not been made.

VII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be printed This Act may by the Printer to the King's most Excellent Majesty, and a Copy be given in thereof, so printed, shall be admitted as Evidence thereof by all Evidence. Judges, Justices, and others.
