# GEORGII III. REGIS.

An Act for making and maintaining a Road from the first small Bridge or Culvert which crosses the present Turnpike Road from Cheltenham to Gloucester, on the Gloucester Side of Staverton Bridge, to join the same Turnpike Road in the Town of Cheltenham in the County of Gloucester.

[28th April 1809.]

HEREAS the making and maintaining of a Carriage and Turnpike Road from the first small Bridge or Culvert which crosses the present Turnpike Road in the Parish of Churchdown, leading from Cheltenham to Gloucester, on the Gloucester. Side of Staverton Bridge, through the several Parishes, Hamlets, Tythings, and Places of Churchdown, Staverton, Boddington, Arle, Alstone, and Cheltenham, all in the County of Gloucester, to join the same Turnpike Road from Cheltenham to Gloucester at or nearly opposite to a certain Public House in the Town of Cheltenham called the Fleece, would be of great Benefit and Advantage to the Inhabitants of the adjacent Country, and would open a much shorter and better Communication between the City of Gloucester and Cheltenham, and would also be of great public Utility; but the same cannot be effected without the Aid of Parliament; may it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the Honourable Thomas Howard commonly Trustees. called Lord Viscount Andover, James Agg, James Arkell, Samuel Arkell, John Arkell, the Honourable George Cranfield Berkeley Member of Parliament, John Brown, Thomas Packer Butt, William Humphris Barrett, [Loc. & Per.]

On the Death II. And be it further enacted, That when and as often as any Trustee shall die or resuse to act, it shall be lawful for the surviving or remaining Trustees, or any Five or more of them, by Writing under their Hands, to elect one other Person to be a Trustee in the Room of such Trustee so deceased or refusing to act, and Notice of the Time and Place of Meeting for every such Election shall be given by the Clerk or Clerks to the said Trustees, by affixing such Notice in Writing upon all the Turnpike Gates then erected in or upon the said Road, and also by inserting the same in some public Newspaper printed or circulated in the Parishes through which

which the faid Road passes, at least Ten Days before every such Meeting; and all Persons who shall be so elected shall have the same Powers and Authorities for putting this Act in Execution as if they had been respectively named Trustees in and by this Act.

III. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That no Person shall Qualification be capable of acting as a Trustee in the Execution of this Act, unless he Chall in his own Right, or in Right of his Wife, be in the actual Possession or Receipt of the Rents and Profits of Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, of the clear yearly Value of Fifty Pounds above all Reprizes', or shall be Heir Apparent of a Person possessed of an Estate in such Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments as aforesaid, of the clear yearly Value of One hundred Pounds above Reprizes, or shall be possessed of or entitled to a Personal Estate of One thousand Pounds, nor (except in administering the Oath herein-after mentioned) until he shall have taken and subscribed before any One or more of the said Trustees an Oath in the Words or to the Effect following; that is to fay,

And if any Person not being so qualified shall presume to act as such Trustee contrary to the true Intent and Meaning of this Act, every such not being Person shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay the Sum of Fifty qualified. Pounds to any Person or Persons who shall sue for the same, to be recovered with full Costs of Suit in any of His Majesty's Courts of Record at Westminster, by Action of Debt or on the Case, or by Bill, Plaint, Suit, or Information, wherein no Essoin, Protection, or Wager of Law, or more than One Imparlance shall be allowed, and every Person so prosecuted shall prove that he is qualified as aforefaid, or otherwise shall pay the said Penalty without any other Proof or Evidence on the Part of the Profecution than that fuch Person hath acted as a Trustee in the Execution of this Act; and that no Trustee shall be capable of acting in the Execution of any of the Powers hereby granted during the Time he shall hold any Place of Profit under this Act, nor shall any Victualler or Rétailer of Ale, Beer, or Spirituous Liquors, or any Menial Servant of any Trustee, be capable of holding any Place of Profit under this Act.

IV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That any Mortgagee Mortgagees or Assignee of any Mortgage or other Security, or any Lender of Money may act. upon the Credit of the Tolls granted by this Act, or receiving Interest thereout for the same, shall not on that Account be deemed disqualified or rendered incapable of acting as a Trustee in the Execution of this Act: Provided also, that all such Trustees as are Justices of the Peace for the said County of Gloucester, may act as Justices of the Peace in the Execution of this

Act, notwithstanding they be Trustees, except in Matters in which they shall be personally interested.

Trustees may fue and be fued in the Clerk, &c.

V. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees may sue and be fued for or concerning any Thing which shall have been done by virtue Name of their or in pursuance of this Act in the Name or Names of their Clerk or Clerks for the Time being, and that no Action or Suit which shall be brought or commenced by the Direction of or against the said Trustees by virtue of this Act in the Name or Names of their Clerk or Clerks. shall abate or be discontinued by the Death or Removal of any such Clerk or Clerks, or by the Act of fuch Clerk or Clerks, without the Consent of the said Trustees or any Five or more of them, but that the Clerk or Clerks for the Time being to the said Trustees shall be deemed Plaintiff or Plaintiffs, Defendant or Defendants, as the Case may be, in every such Action: Provided always, that all and every such Clerk or Clerks in whose Name or Names any Action or Suit shall be commenced, prosecuted, or defended in pursuance of this Act, shall be fully reimbursed and paid out of the Money which shall be collected by virtue of this Act, all such Costs, Charges, Damages and Expences, as by the Event or in consequence of any such Action or Proceeding he or they shall pay, bear, expend, or be put unto or become chargeable with by reason of his or their being so made Plaintiff or Plaintiffs, Defendant or Defendants as aforefaid.

VI. And be it further enacted, That the faid Trustees or any Five or Place of Meet- more of them shall meet together at the Townhall in Cheltenham aforesaid, on the Second Monday next after the Day on which this Act shall receive the Royal Assent, or as soon after as conveniently may be, at Eleven of the Clock in the Forenoon, and proceed to put this Act in Execution, and shall then adjourn themselves, and from Time to Time afterwards meet at and again adjourn to fuch Place near to the said Road as they the said Trustees or any Five or more of them shall think proper; and if at any such Meeting there shall not appear a sufficient Number of Trustees to act or to adjourn to another Day (Two Trustees being hereby declared and deemed sufficient for the Purpose of Adjournment only) or in case the Trustees at any Time assembled shall omit or neglect to adjourn themselves, the Clerk or Clerks to the said Trustees shall from Time to Time in either of such Cases, by Notice in Writing to be affixed and inserted in Manner aforesaid at least Seven Days before the next Meeting, appoint the Trustees to meet at the Place at which the last Meeting was held or was appointed to have been held on fuch Days as shall be specified in such Notice; and in case the Clerk or Clerks to the said Trustees shall refuse or neglect to give Notice, or shall by any Means be prevented from giving Notice as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for any Five or more of the said Trustees, although not assembled at a Meeting, at any Time or Times after the Space of Ten Days after such Refusal, Neglect, or Prevention of such Clerk or Clerks, by Notice in Writing under their Hands to be affixed and inferted in Manner aforesaid, to appoint the Trustees to meet at some House near to the said Road upon that Day Fortnight next after the Date of such last-mentioned Notice; but no Business shall be done or proceeded upon by the said Trustees at any Meeting to be held under this Act before the Hour of Eleven in the Forenoon, and no Adjournment shall be made or any Meeting

Meeting appointed to be held at any Time later than Three of the Clock in the Afternoon of the Day on which such Meeting shall be appointed to be held; and the said Trustees at all their Meetings shall defray their own Expences, and all Orders and Determinations of the said Trustees in the Execution of this Act shall be made at Meetings to be held in pursuance of this Act and not otherwise (except as herein particularly mentioned); and no Order or Determination shall be made unless a Majority of the Trustees present at a Meeting shall concur therein, nor shall any such Order or Determination be revoked or altered at any subsequent Meeting unless Nine Trustees shall be present, or unless the Person or Persons applying to revoke or alter any fuch Order shall give Notice thereof in Writing to the Clerk or Clerks to the faid Trustees, and for want of such Clerk or Clerks to the Person or Persons acting as Treasurer or Treasurers to the said Trustees, to be by him or them affixed and inserted in Manner herein-before mentioned, at least Ten Days previous to any Meeting.

VII. And be it further enacted, That if after any Adjournment of any Meetings on Emergencies. Meeting of the said Trustees it shall be thought necessary that an earlier Day of Meeting should be appointed than the Day appointed by such Adjournment, in that Case the Clerk or Clerks to the said Trustees, upon an Order in Writing figned by Three or more of the acting Trustees, mentioning the Time, Place, and Purpose of such Meeting, shall forthwith give Notice thereof in the Manner before directed, and of the Time and Place which shall be mentioned in the Order of the said Trustees (such Time not being less than Seven Days after such Notice) and such earlier Meeting shall and may be held accordingly; and all the Proceedings of the Trustees at all such Meetings shall be as valid and effectual as they would have been in case such Meetings had been held in pursuance of Adjournment.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees or any Five or Trustees to more of them shall and may at their First or any subsequent Meeting by appoint Offi-Writing under their Hands elect and appoint a Clerk or Clerks, Treasurer or Treasurers, Receiver or Receivers, Collector or Collectors of the Tolls by this Act granted, and shall take such Security from such Treasurer or Treasurers, Receiver or Receivers, Collector or Collectors, for the due Execution of his or their Office or Offices, as the said Trustees or any Five or more of them shall think fit, and shall also elect and appoint a Surveyor or Surveyors and fuch other Officers as the faid Trustees or any Five or more of them shall think proper, and also may from Time to Time remove such Clerks, Treasurers, Collectors, Receivers, Surveyors, and other Officers or any of them as they the faid Trustees or any Five or more of them shall see Occasion, and appoint others in the Room of such of them as shall be so removed, or as shall die, resign, or become incapable of performing their Duty; and the faid Trustees or any Five or more of them shall and may, out of the Money to be raised and received by virtue of this Act, give such Salaries or make such Allowances to the Clerks, Treasurers, Receivers, Collectors, Surveyors, or other Officers so appointed, for and in consideration of the Care and Pains respectively taken in the Execution of their respective Offices, and to such other Persons as shall be affishing in and about the Execution of this Act, as to them the said Trustees or any Five or more of them shall seem proper; who are to and all such Officers and other Persons shall upon their respective Oaths, account, etc.

if thereupon required by the faid Trustees or any Five or more of them (which Oaths any One of the said Trustees is hereby empowered to administer) from Time to Time, and as often as such Officers and other Persons shall be called upon for that Purpose, produce and give up to the said Trustees full, true, and perfect Accounts in Writing under their respective Hands of all Monies which shall have been by them respectively had, received, or collected, and how, to whom, and for what Purposes such Monies and every Part thereof shall have been paid, disposed of, or applied, together with proper Receipts and Vouchers for such Payments, and shall and are hereby respectively required to pay all such Monies as shall appear to be in their respective Hands to the said Trustees or any Five or more of them, or to fuch Person or Persons, or for such Uses and Purposes as they shall direct and appoint; and if such Officer or other Person (being required so to do) shall refuse or neglect to render and give up or to verify upon Oath fuch Account or Accounts as aforefaid, or to produce or deliver up to the faid Trustees or any Five or more of them the Receipts and Vouchers relating to the same, or to pay as aforesaid any Sum or Sums of Money which shall appear to remain in his or their Hands, or shall not deliver to the said Trustees or any Five or more of them, within Ten Days after having been thereunto required by any Five or more of the faid Trustees, all the Books, Papers, and Writings in his or their Custody or Power relating to the Execution of this Act, then and in any of the said Cases any One or more of the Justices of the Peace for the County, City, Town, or Place wherein fuch Officer or Person shall be and reside, shall (upon Complaint of any Five or more of the faid Trustees) make Enquiry concerning such Default either by Consession of the Party or by the Testimony of one or more credible Witness or Witnesse upon Oath, which Oath such Justice or Justices is and are hereby empowered and required to administer without Fee or Reward; and if any fuch Officer or Person shall be convicted of any of the Offences aforefaid, such Justice or Justices shall and may commit such Officer or other Person so convicted to the Common Gaol for such County, Borough, City, Town, or Place, there to remain without Bail or Mainprize until fuch Officer or other Person shall give and make a true and perfect Account, and verify the same as aforesaid, and make such Payment as aforesaid, or until he shall have compounded with the said Trustees or any Five or more of them for the same, and shall have paid such Composition Money to the said Trustees or to their Treasurer or Treasurers (which Composition the said Trustees or any Five or more of them are hereby empowered to make) or until such Officer or other Person shall have delivered up fuch Books, Papers, and Writings as aforefaid, or given Satisfaction in respect thereof to the said Trustees or any Five or more of them; but no Officer or other Person who shall be committed for any of the Offences aforesaid shall be detained in Prison any greater Length of Time than Six Calendar Months.

Trustees may appoint temporary Collectors and remove those discharged.

IX. And be it further enacted, That when and as often as any Collector or Receiver of the Tolls shall die, neglect, or be incapable of performing his Duty, or shall abscond or absent himself, it shall be lawful for any Three or more of the said Trustees, although not assembled at a Meeting of the said Trustees to be appointed by virtue of this Act, to discharge such Collector or Receiver so neglecting or incapable of performing his Duty, or absconding or absenting himself, and to nominate

and appoint a proper Person to be a Collector or Receiver of the said Tolls, to continue until the then next Meeting of the said Trustees, in the stead of such Collector or Receiver as shall so die or be discharged; and fuch Person so nominated and appointed shall have the like Power and Authority and be answerable and accountable in the same Manner in all Respects as the Person who shall so die or be discharged would have had or have been subject to, and that if any Collector or Receiver of the faid Tolls who shall be discharged from his Office by virtue of this Act, or the Wife or Widow or any of the Children, Family, or other Representative of any Collector or Receiver who shall die or be discharged, or any other Person or Persons shall refuse to deliver up the Possession of any Toll House or Building to be erected or set up by virtue of this Act for the Space of Four Days after Demand thereof made and Notice in Writing given for that Purpose by any Three or more of the said Trustees (although not assembled at any Meeting) or by their Clerk or Clerks, Treasurer or Treasurers, then and in any or either of the said Cases it shall be lawful for any Justice or Justices of the Peace for the County of Gloucester by Warrant under his Hand and Seal or their Hands and Seals to order any Constable or other Peace Officer for the same County, with such Assistance as shall be necessary, to enter such House or Building in the Day-time, and to remove the Person or Persons who shall be found therein, together with his, her, or their Goods out of the same, and to put the said Trustees or any Three or more of them, or such new appointed Collector or Receiver, into the Possession thereof.

X. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees or any Five or Trustees may more of them shall and may from Time to Time cause to be erected and erect foll Houses, &c. fet up fuch and so many Turnpikes or Toll Gates in, upon, across, or on the Side or Sides of any Part or Parts of the said Road, and across any Lane or Way leading into, from, or out of the same, and also a Toll House to each Gate or Turnpike with suitable Outbuildings thereto, and also may for that Purpose inclose from the said Road or from the adjoining Grounds, not being a Yard, Garden, Orchard, Park, Paddock, planted Walk, or Avenue to an House, or any inclosed Ground planted or fet apart as a Nursery for Trees, or planted with ornamental Trees, fufficient Ground, not exceeding in the whole Two Perches, and may cause any such Turnpikes, Toll Gates, Toll Houses, or other Buildings, from Time to Time to be taken down, removed, or altered, as they or any Five or more of them shall judge proper.

XI. And be it further enacted, That the Tolls following shall and may and take be demanded and taken before any Horse, Cattle, or Carriage shall be Tolls. permitted to pass through any such Turnpikes or Toll Gates respectively; (that is to fay),

For every Horse, Mare, Gelding, Mule, Ass, Ox, Bullock, or other Tolls. Beast of Draught, drawing in any Carriage, the Sum of Sixpence: For every Horse, Mare, Gelding, Mule or Ass, not drawing, the Sum of Two-pence:

For every Drove of Oxen, Cows, or Neat Cattle, the Sum of One Shilling per Score; and so in proportion for any greater or lesser Number:

For every Drove of Calves, Hogs, Sheep, or Lambs, the Sum of Sixpence

pence per Score; and so in proportion for any greater or lesser Number:

For every Four-wheeled Carriage in any Manner fixed to any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other Carriage drawing, the Sum of One Shilling: For every Two-wheeled Carriage having any Person therein, or being laden in any Manner, fixed to any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other Carriage drawing, the Sum of One Shilling; and unladen or empty, · the Sum of Sixpence:

Which said respective Sums of Money shall be demanded and taken in the Name of or as a Toll; and if any Person or Persons subject to the Payment of any of the said Tolls shall after Demand thereof made, whether immediately on the same becoming due or at any Time after, neglect or refuse to pay the same or any Part thereof, it shall be lawful for the Person or Persons appointed as aforesaid to collect such Tolls by himself or themselves, or taking such Assistance as he or they shall think necessary, to seize and distrain any Coach, Chaise, or other such like Carriage or Hearse, Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such like Carriage, and the Horses drawing the same, and any Horse, Beast, or other Cattle not drawing, upon which any Toll is by this Act imposed respectively, together with their Saddles, Bridles, Gears, Harness, or Accoutrements, or any other of the Goods or Chattels of the Person or Persons so neglecting or refusing to pay fuch Tolls; and if fuch Tolls and the reasonable Charges of such Seizure and Distress shall not be paid within the Space of Four Days next after fuch Seizure and Distress made, the Person or Persons so seizing and distraining shall and may sell the Coach, Chaise, or other such like Carriage or Hearse, Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such like Carriage, and the Horses, Beast, or other Cattle so seized and distrained, or any of them, or any Part of such Saddles, Bridles, Gears, Harness, or Accoutrements, returning the Overplus (if any) and what shall remain unfold upon De-mand to the Owner thereof, after fuch Tolls and all reasonable Charges shall have been deducted and paid; and that all the Tolls to be collected or levied by virtue of this Act shall be and are hereby vested in the said Trustees, and shall be applied and may be assigned in such Manner as herein-after mentioned.

XII. Provided also, and it is hereby further enacted and declared, That no Person or Persons shall be subject to the Payment of Toll more than once in any One Day (to be computed from Twelve of the Clock at Night to Twelve of the Clock in the succeeding Night) for the Passage of the same Carriage, Horse or Horses, Cattle or Beasts, through all or any of the Turnpikes or Toll Gates to be erected by virtue of this Act; such Person or Persons producing a Ticket, that the Toll has been paid the same Day at some Turnpike or Turnpikes upon some Part of the said Road, and which Ticket the Collectors are hereby required to deliver gratis on the Receipt of such Tolls.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That if any Dispute shall arise respecting the Tolls due or the Charges of keeping any Distress, it shall be cerning Tolls, lawful for the Collector or Person so distraining to retain such Distress, or the Money arising from the Sale thereof (as the Case may happen) till the Amount of the Tolls due and the Charges of the Distress and Sale and of keeping the Distress (as the Case may happen) be ascertained by some Justice of the Peace for the County of Gloucester, who upon Application

made

made to him for that Purpose shall examine the Matter on the Oath of the Parties or other Witness or Witnesses, and shall determine the Amount of the Tolls due, and also assess the Charges of such Distress and Sale, and of the Collector's Attendance for the Purposes aforesaid upon the said Justice, all which Sums so determined or assessed shall be paid to the said Collector before he shall be required to return the said Distress or the Overplus, after the Sale thereof or any Part thereof.

XIV. And be it further enacted, That in case any Dispute, Suit, or Toll Bar Litigation shall arise touching or in anywise relating to the said Tolls, the Keepers competent wit-Person or Persons appointed to collect the same, or any other Person or nesses, Persons acting by or under the Authority of the said Trustees, shall not be incompetent to give Evidence in any fuch Dispute, Suit, or Litigation, by reason of his, her, or their being so appointed to collect the said Tolls, or acting under the Authority of the said Trustees.

XV. And be it further enacted, That the Right and Property of all the Toll Houses Roads, Gates, and Toll Houses, Bridges, Culverts, and other Buildings Trustees. to be made, erected, or provided by virtue of this Act, and of the Stones and Materials for building or repairing the same, and also of all Stones and Materials got or collected for repairing the said Road, shall be and are hereby vested in the said Trustees, and they or any Five or more of them are hereby empowered to bring or cause to be brought any Action or Actions in the Name of their Clerk or Clerks for the Time being, or to prefer or order the preferring of any Indictment or Indictments against any Person or Persons who shall injure the same or disturb them in the Possession thereof.

Provided also, and be it further enacted, That when such Money so agreed or awarded to be paid as last before mentioned, shall be less than Twenty Pounds, then and in all such Cases the same shall be applied to the Use of the Person or Persons who would for the Time being have been entitled to the Rents and Profits of the Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments so purchased, taken, or used for the Purposes of this Act, in such Manner as the said Trustees or any Five or more of them shall think sit; or in case of Insancy or Lunacy then to his, her, or their Guardian or Guardians, Committee or Committees, to and for the Use and Benefit of such Person or Persons so entitled respectively.

XLVII. And

XLVII. And be it further enacted, That in case the Person or Persons to whom any Sum or Sums of Money shall be awarded for the Purchase of making cut any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments to be purchased by virtue of this Act, shall refuse to accept the same, or shall not be able to make a good Title to the Premises, to the Satisfaction of the said Trustees or any Five or more of them, or in case such Person or Persons to whom such Sum or Sums of Money shall be so awarded as aforesaid cannot be found, or if the Person or Persons entitled to such Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, be not known or discovered, then and in every such Case it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, or any Five or more of them, to order the said Sum or Sums of Money so awarded as aforesaid, to be paid into the Bank of England, in the Name and with the Privity of the Accountant General of the faid Court of Chancery, to be placed to his Account to the Credit of the Parties interested in the said Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments subject to the [describing them], subject to the Order, Controul, and Disposition of the Court of faid Court of Chancery; which said Court, on the Application of any Chancery, on Person or Persons making Claim to such Sum or Sums of Money, or any Motion or Petation. Part thereof, by Motion or Petition, shall be and is hereby empowered in a fummary Way of Proceeding or otherwife, as to the same Court shall feem meet, to order the same to be laid out and invested in the Public Funds, and to order Distribution thereof, or Payment of the Dividends thereof, according to the respective Estate or Estates, Title or Interest of the Person or Persons making claim thereunto, and to make such other Order in the Premises as to the said Court shall seem just and reasonable; and the Cashier or Cashiers of the Bank of England who shall receive Juch Sum or Sums of Money, is and are hereby required to give a Receipt or Receipts for such Sum or Sums of Money, mentioning and specifying for what and for whose Use the same is or are received, to such Person or Persons as shall pay any such Sum or Sums of Money into the Bank as aforesaid.

XLVIII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That where any Respecting Question shall arise touching the Title of any Person to any Money to be Titles. paid into the Bank of England, in the Name and with the Privity of the Accountant General of the faid Court of Chancery, in pursuance of this Act, for the Purchase of any Lands or Hereditaments, or of any Estate, Right, or Interest in any Lands or Hereditaments to be purchased in purfuance thereof, or to any Bank Annuities to be purchased with any such Money, or to the Dividends or Interest of any such Bank Annuities, the Person or Persons who shall have been in Possession of such Lands or Hereditaments at the Time of such Purchase, and all Persons claiming under fuch Person or Persons, or under the Possession of such Person or Persons, shall be deemed and taken to have been lawfully entitled to such. Lands or Hereditaments, according to such Possession, until the contrary shall be shewn to the Satisfaction of the said Court of Chancery; and the Dividends or Interest of the Bank Annuities to be purchased with such Money, and also the Capital of such Bank Annuities, shall be paid, applied, and disposed of accordingly, unless it shall be made appear to the said Court that such Possession was a wrongful Possession, and that some other Person or Persons was or were lawfully entitled to such Lands or Hereditaments, or to some Estate or Interest therein.

The Court of Chancery may direct the Payment of Expences.

XLIX. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That where by reason of any Disability or Incapacity of the Person or Persons or Corporation entitled to any Lands or Hereditaments to be purchased under the Authority of this Act, the Purchase Money for the same shall be required to be paid into the said Court, and to be applied in the Purchase of other Lands or Hereditaments to be settled to the like Uses in pursuance of this Act, it shall be lawful for the said Court to order the Expences of all Purchases from Time to Time to be made in pursuance of this Act, or so much of such Expences as the Court shall deem reasonable, together with the necessary Costs and Charges of obtaining such Order, to be paid by the said Trustees or any Five or more of them, who shall from Time to Time pay such Sums of Money for such Purposes as the said Court shall direct.

Persons liable to repair Roads, etc. to continue so.

And be it further enacted, That all and every Person and Persons who by Law are obliged to do Statute Work on any of the Highways in the several Parishes, Townships, Hamlets, or Places through which the said intended new Turnpike Road shall pass, shall be liable to personn their respective Works thereon in such and the like Manner in every respect as they are liable to personn the same on any other common Highway within such Parish, Township, Hamlet, District, or Place respectively.

Parish Surveyors to deliver in Lists of Statute Work.

LI. And be it further enacted, That the respective Surveyors of the Highways for the several Parishes, Townships, Hamlets, or Places in which any Part of the said new Turnpike Road shall lie, shall Twice in every Year, within Four Days after Demand shall have been made from them respectively, in Writing by any Surveyor or Surveyors to be appointed by virtue of this Act, deliver to such Turnpike Surveyor or Surveyors an exact Account or List in Writing under their Hands of the Christian and Surname of every Person who within their respective Parishes, Townships, Hamlets, and Places is liable to do Statute Work, and shall distinguish in such Account or List what Statute Work each of the said Persons is liable to do and perform; and the Statute Work shall be done by a'l such Perfons on such Parts of the said Road hereby authorized to be made and repaired, as are within the said respective Parishes, Townships, Hamlets, and Places, in such Manner and at such Times as any Two Justices of the Peace for the District or Division of the said County in which the respective Parts of the said Road may be situate, upon Application being made to them by the said Trustees or any Two or more of them, or by their Clerk or Clerks, or Surveyor or Surveyors, shall direct; and the said Surveyors of the Highways for such Parishes, Townships, and Places respectively, within Ten Days after Notice shall have been given to him or them by fuch Clerk or Clerks, or Turnpike Surveyor or Surveyors, of the Time or Times when and how many of fuch Perfons are to do fuch Work upon any Part or Parts of the said new Turnpike Road, shall give Notice thereof to the Persons directed to perform the same, and if any Surveyor for any fuch Parish, Township, Hamlet or Place, shall neglect or refuse to deliver in such Account or List to such Turnpike Surveyor or Surveyors, or shall be guilty of any Fraud therein, or shall refuse or neglect to summon such Persons to do their Statute Work as aforesaid, every such Parish Surveyor shall for every such Neglect or Refusal sorfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Five Pounds.

LII. Provided

LII: And be it further enacted, That all and every Person and Persons Penalty on not performwho shall neglect or refuse to do such Work as aforesaid after Notice in ing statute Writing shall have been given to or left for him, her, or them at his, Work. her, or their last or usual Place or Places of Abode for that Purpose, by the Surveyor or Surveyors to the said Trustees, shall for every Day of his, her, or their Default, or the Default of any Labourer or Labourers, Team or Teams, Draught or Draughts, Horse or Horses, Beast or Beasts to be provided by him, her, or them, be subject and liable to such Penalties and Forfeitures as Persons neglecting or refusing to do Statute Work on any public Highway are or may be by any Law or Statute subjected; and every Person who shall according to such Notice as aforesaid come as a Labourer, or with any Team, Draught, or Plough, to work on the faid new Turnpike Road, and shall be found negligent or idle by the said Turnpike Surveyor or Surveyors, where the Work is to be done, such Surveyor or Surveyors may and is and are hereby required to discharge fuch Person or Persons, and it shall be considered as if such Person or Persons, or fuch Team, Draught, or Plough had not come or been sent to work; and every fuch Labourer or Person, or the Owner of such Team, Draught, or Plough, shall be liable to the respective Forfeitures before mentioned; and all Persons duly performing such Day's Work on the said new Turnpike Road shall not be liable to do any other Statute Work thereon.

'LIII. And, for preventing Differences between the said Trustees and Justices to the Surveyors of the Highways for the Time being of the several Parishes, determine Statute Work. Townships, Hamlets, or Places through which the said new Turnpike Road hereby directed to be made or repaired shall lead, touching what Part of the Statute Work in any such Parish, Township, Hamlet, or Place ought to be done on the said new Turnpike Road; be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for any Two or more of the Justices of the Peace at any Special Session to be holden for the Division or Hundred, Divisions or Hundreds wherein fuch Part or Parts of the said new Turnpike Road shall lie, upon Application made to them for that Purpose by the said Trustees or any Five or more of them, to adjudge and determine what Part and Proportion of the Statute Work shall be done on the said new Turnpike Road, by and in each and every of the Parishes, Townships, Hamlets, or Places aforefaid.

LIV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That it shall be law-Trustees may ful for the said Trustees, or any Five or more of them, to compound and for statute agree by the Year or otherwise with the Possessors, Occupiers, Grantees, Work-Feoffees, and Committees of Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments which are or shall be liable to, or chargeable with, the Repair of any Part of the faid new Turnpike Road, or of any Bridge, Arch; or Sewer, or with any Person or Persons for the Persormance of his, her, or their Statute Work thereon; and also that it shall be lawful for the Surveyor or Surveyors of the Highways of any of the faid Parishes, Townships, Hamlets, or Places, by and with the Consent and Approbation of a Majority of the Inhabitants of such Parishes, Townships, Hamlets, or Places first obtained at any Vestry or other public Meeting of such Inhabitants, to compound and agree by the Year or otherwise with the said Trustees, or any Five or more of them, for and in lieu of the Statute Work to be performed by such Inhabitants upon any Part or Parts of the said new Turnpike

Read; all which Composition Money shall be from Time to Time paid in advance, and shall be applied in the Repair of the said new Turnpike Road; and all such Surveyors shall be reimbursed the Money so by them paid in such Manner as Surveyors of the Highways are by Law to be reimbursed the Monies by them expended in buying Materials for repairing the Highways.

Trustees may contract for Repairs.

Contracts to be binding.

LV. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees or any Five or more of them, or such Person or Persons as they shall for that Purpose authorize or appoint, are hereby empowered to contract with any Person or Persons for making, altering, turning, widening, or repairing the said new Turnpike Road, or any Part thereof, and for erecting Mile and Direction Stones or other Posts thereon, or for doing any other Work to be performed in the Execution of this Act in such Manner and for such Sum or Sums of Money as the faid Trustees or any Five or more of them shall think proper; and that all Contracts and Agreements in Writing entered into pursuant to any Order of the said Trusteee, or any Five or more of them, by their Clerk or Clerks, Treasurer or Treasurers, Surveyor or Surveyors, or other Officer, with any Workmen or other Per-Ion or Persons, relating to any Matter or Thing to be done by virtue of this Act, shall be binding upon all such Parties and Persons as shall sign the same, his, her, and their Executors and Administrators; and that Actions and Suits shall and may be maintained thereon by the said Trustees or any Five or more of them, or by their Clerk or Clerks, Treafurer or Treasurers, and in his or their Name or Names respectively, and Damages and Costs recovered against the Party or Person, Parties or Bersons failing in the Performance of such Contracts or Agreements respectively; and such Sum of Money as shall and may be requisite for making or repairing the taid new Turnpike Road, or any other Matter or Thing to be done by virtue of this Act, and which by such Contracts or Agreements respectively the Parties ought to have done, shall be the Mcasure of the Damages to be recovered in any Action or Suit against any fuch Party or Person, Parties or Persons, so as aforesaid making Default in fulfilling his, her, or their Contract or Agreement, any Law or Usage to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding.

Serpent, or other Firework on any Part or Parts of fuch Road; or if any Person shall leave any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such Carriage, in, upon, or on the Side of any Part of such Road, longer than may be necessary for loading or unloading the same, either with or without any Horse or Beast of Draught harnessed or yoked thereto, or shall lay any Piece of Timber, or any Stones, Hay, Straw, Dung, Manure, Soil, Rubbish, or other Matter or Thing whatfoever, on any Part of fuch Road or on the Side or Sides thereof, to the Prejudice thereof, or to the Prejudice or Annoyance of Persons travelling thereon; every Person so offending shall, for every such Offence, forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Forty Shillings.

LVIII. And be it further enacted, That all Penalties, Forfeitures, and Penalties, Fines by this Act inflicted or authorized to be imposed, if the Manner of wied and aplevying and recovering thereof is not herein otherwise directed, shall upon plied. LX. LXI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That when any Diftress shall be made for any Sum or Sums of Money, by virtue of this want of Ferm. Act, the Distress itself shall not be deemed unlawful, nor the Party or Parties making the same be deemed a Trespasser or Trespassers, on account of any Defect or Want of Form in the Summons, Conviction, Warrant of Distress, or other Proceedings relating thereto; nor shall the Party or Parties distraining be deemed a Trespasser or Trespassers, ab initio, on account of any Irregularity which shall be afterwards done by the Party or Parties distraining, but the Person or Persons aggrieved by such Irregularity shall and may recover Satisfaction for the special Damage in an Action upon the Case.

Limitation of Actions.

LXII. And whereas Offences may be committed against this Act by For securing Persons unknown to the Collectors, Surveyors, or other Officers appointed Offenders, to carry this Act into Execution; be it therefore further enacted, That it shall be lawful for any one or more of the said Trustees, or their Clerk or Clerks, or the Collectors, Surveyors, or other Officers respectively, and such other Person or Persons as he or they shall call to his or their Assistance, without any other Warrant or other Authority than this Act, to seize and detain any fuch unknown Person or Persons, who shall commit any fuch Offence or Offences, and take him, her, or them, before any Justice of the Peace for the County of Gloucester; and such Justice is hereby empowered and directed to proceed immediately to the hearing and determining. of the Complaint, or to oblige such Person or Persons, so offending, to give Security for his, her, or their Appearance at the next Petty Session. to be holden within and for the said County, to answer the said Complaint; and the Justices present at such Petty Session, or any Two or more of them, are hereby authorized and required to hear and determine. the Matter of the said Complaint in a summary way, and upon Conviction of the Offender or Offenders, either by the Justice before whom he, she, or they shall be first taken, or by the Justices at such Session as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for such Justice or Justices respectively to commit him, her, or them to the Common Gaol or House of Correction of the same County, there to remain for any Time not exceeding Twenty-one. And be it further enacted, That the several and respective Persons who have subscribed Money for or towards the making of the said new Turnpike Road, shall and they are hereby required to pay the Sum or Sums of Money so subscribed within or at such Time or Times, and in such Parts and Proportions as the faid Trustees, or any Five or more of them shall from Time to Time order and direct, and the same shall be paid to fuch Person or Persons as the said Trustees or any Five or more of them shall by any Writing under their Hands authorize to receive the same; and if any Person or Persons shall neglect or refuse to pay the same, or any Part thereof as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, or any Five or more of them, to fue for and recover the same in the Name of the said Trustees, or any Five or more of them, or in the Name of their Clerk or Clerks, Treasurer or Treasurers, in any of His Majesty's Courts of Record, by Action of Debt or on the Case, or by Bill, Plaint, Suit, or Information, wherein no Essoign, Protection, or Wager of Law, or more than one Imparlance shall be allowed.

Public Act.

LXVII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.

Commencement and Continuance of this Act.

LXVIII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence upon and have Continuance from the Day on which the same shall receive the Royal Assent, and shall continue in force for and during the Term of Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
