An Act for enlarging the Powers of an Act of His present Majesty for re-building the Parish Church of East Grinstead, in the County of Sussex.

[8th March, 1811.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the Thirtieth Year of the Reign 30 Geo. 3. of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for re-building the 6.7. Parish Church of East Grinstead, in the County of Sussex: And whereas the Trustees, acting in the Execution of the said Act, have made great Progress in re-building the said Church, and have borrowed the Sum of Four Thousand Pounds upon the Credit of the Rates or Assessments, by the said Act authorised to be made and assessed upon the Person or Persons inhabiting, holding, or occupying any Land, House, Shop, Warehouse, Vault, Mill, or other Tenement within the said Parish of East Grinstead; which said Sum of Four Thousand Pounds, (being the whole Sum the Trustees were by the said Act enabled to raise,) has been expended towards re-building the said Church, but on account of the advanced Price of Labour and Materials, the Trustees have not been enabled to complete the re-building of the said Church and the Tower thereof; and by an Estimate made by several experienced Surveyors, the Trustees find that it will require the further Sum of Four Thousand Pounds and upwards, to finish, complete, and re-build the same, which Sum the Trustees are satisfied they can raise upon the Credit of the said Rates or Assessments, by the said recited Act authorised to be made and assessed as aforesaid, if they were empowered so to do, and the Powers of the said recited Act were enlarged, altered, and amended for that Purpose; May it therefore please [Loc. & Per.]

Your Majesty, That it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assem-Church to be bled, and by the Authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Trustees, or any Five or more of them, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to finish, complete, and re-build the said Church, and the Tower thereof; and for that Purpose to raise the further Sum of Four thousand Pounds, upon the Credit of the said Rates or Assessments, by the said recited Act authorised to be made and assessed, by any of the Ways and Means in the said Act directed, and thereout to defray the Expence of finishing, completing, and re-building the said Church and Tower, and the Costs, Charges, and Expences of procuring, obtaining, and passing this Act; and that the said recited Act, and all the Clauses, Powers, Authorities, Provisions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Matters and Things, in the said Act contained, shall be, and continue in full Force and Effect, in as full, ample, and beneficial a Manner, to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever, as if the same were repeated and re-enacted in this Act; save and except so much of the said recited Act as exempts the Annuities purchased, in pursuance thereof, from the Payment of any Parliamentary Tax; which Exemption shall be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Expences how to be defrayed.

II. And be it further enacted, That all the Costs, Charges, and Expences incident to and attending the procuring, obtaining, and passing this Act, shall be borne, paid, and discharged out of the first Monies raised, or to be raised, under and by virtue of the said recited Act, or this Act.

Public Act.

III. And be it surther enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.
