An Act for altering and enlarging the Powers of an Act of His present Majesty, for paving, cleansing, lighting, and watching the Parish of Saint Michael, in the Liberties of the City of Limerick, and adjoining the said City, and for preventing and removing Nuisances therein.

[21st May 1811.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the Forty-seventh Year of the 47 G.3. Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for paving, cleansing, lighting, and watching the Parish of Saint Michael, in the Liberties of the City of Limerick, and adjoining the said City, and for preventing and removing Nuisances therein: And whereas there is no Provision contained in the said recited Act for enabling the Parishioners of the faid Parish of Saint Michael by public Cess, Tax, or Applotment, to contribute to the Support and Maintenance of the Goal, House of Industry, and the Fever Hospital, established in the said City, otherwise than by an acreable Assessment, which would not be sufficient thereunto: And whereas it would materially contribute to the Support and Maintenance of the faid Goal, House of Industry, and the Fever Hospital, established in the said City, if the Tax or Cess authorized by the said recited Act of the Fortyseventh Year of His present Majesty was increased, and Part thereof made applicable to the above Purposes, were levied and raised on the Parishioners of the said Parish of Saint Michael's; and if the Power sand Provisions contained in the said recited Act were now altered, amended, and enlarged, [Loc. & Per.] 23 Z

Powers of former Act of 47 G. 3. extended to this.

Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Comfent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the said recited Act of the Forty-seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, and all and every the Claustes, Powers, Exemptions, Rules, Remedies, Regulations, Penalties, Forseitures, Articles, Matters, and Things whatsoever, therein contained, (save and except such Parts of the same as are hereby varied, altered, or repealed), shall be, and the same is and are hereby declared to be in full Force and Effect, and shall be as good, valid, and effectual, for carrying this Act into Execution, in as sull, ample, and beneficial a Manner, to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever, as if the same had been repeated and reenacted in the Body of this Act.

Part of former Act of 47 G. 3. repealed.

II. And be it further enacted, That so much of the said recited Act of the Forty seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, as directs, That the said Commissioners should, and they were thereby required, after the annual Value of the several Houses, Buildings, Tenements, and Hereditaments, situate and being within the said Parish, should have been ascertained in Manner ascertaid, to rate, asses, and charge all such Houses. Buildings, Tenements, and Hereditaments, situate within the said Parish, with an annual Rate or Assessment, not exceeding the Sum of Two Shillings and Sixpence in the Pound, according to the annual Value thereof, shall be, and the same is hereby repealed, and declared to be null and void to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever.

III. And be it further enacted, That the faid Commissioners acting in Execution of the said recited Act of the Forth-seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty shall, and they are hereby required, after the annual Value of the several Houses, Buildings, Tenements, and Hereditaments, situate and being within the said Parish, shall have been ascertained in Manner directed by the said Act, to rate, assess, and charge all such Houses, Buildings, Tenements, and Hereditaments, situate within the said Parish, with an annual Rate or Assessment, not exceeding the Sum of Three Shillings in the Pound, according to the annual Value thereof.

IV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, so as to enable the said Commissioners to rate or assess any Person or Persons for, or in respect of, any Store or other Building, not being a Dwelling House, and inhabited, with any Charge or Sum exceeding Four-pence in the Pound in any One Year, in respect of any such Store or Building on the fair Valuation thereof, or to rate or assess any Person for, or in respect of, any Field, Park, Meadow, Garden, or Building, used for Grazing or Tillage, or for, or in respect of, any Building Ground not inclosed and built upon.

V. And be it further enacted, That each and every Rate and Assessment ordered and directed to be levied, assessed, and collected, by and under the Authority of the said recited Act of the Forty-seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, shall and may be levied, assessed, and collected by such Ways and Means, and under such Restrictions and Regulations as the same are therein directed to be levied, assessed, and collected, until

until new Rates are made, levied, and affessed by virtue of this Act, any Thing herein contained to the contrary thereof notwithstanding.

VI. And be it further enacted, That the First of the said Rates and Assessments herein authorized to be made, shall commence on the Twenty. ninth Day of September next after the passing of this Act, and shall be made for Six Months only, and thereaftetr he said Rates and Assessments shall be paid. made for Twelve Calendar Months, commencing on the Twenty-fifth Day of March in each and every Year, and the Money fo rated and affested, shall, from Time to Time, be paid by Two equal Payments; (that is to fay), on the Twenty-ninth Day of September and the Twenty-fifth Day of March, or as foon after as the faid Commissioners shall direct and appoint, to fuch Person or Persons as the said Commissioners shall nominate or appoint to be Collector or Collectors of the fame.

Provided always, and be it enacted, That nothing herein contained Limitation shall extend, or be construed to extend, so as to enable the said Commisfioners to rate or affess any Person or Persons by virtue of the said recited Act of the Forty-seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, or of this Act, for or in Respect of any Houses, Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments whatfoever, the annual Value whereof shall be less than the Sum of Ten Pounds.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That for the Purposes of contributing Commission. to the Support and Maintenance of the faid Gaol, House of Industry, and Fever Hospital, established in the said City of Limerick, the said Commisstioners acting in Execution of the said recited Act of the Forty-seventh Monies out of Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, and this Act shall, and they Rates for are hereby directed and required in the first Place, by and out of the Support of Rates or Assessments levied and collected by virtue of the same Act, to &c. -pay, or cause to be paid, on or before the First Day of February next, after the passing of this Act, the Sum of Two hundred and fifty Pounds of lawful Money of Ireland unto the Treasurer or Treasurers, Collector or Collectors of, or other the Person or Persons duly authorized to receive the Taxes and Contributions, for the Support and Maintenance of the said Gaol, House of Industry, and Fever Hospital, and for the Purposes of contributing to the further Support and Maintenance of fuch Gaol, House of Industry, and Fever Hospital, the said Commissioners shall, and they are hereby directed and required yearly and every Year, to levy and raise by and out of the said Rates or Assessments to be levied and collected by virtue of this Act, the clear yearly Sum of Five hundred Pounds of like lawful Money, and to order their Treasurer or Collector for the Time being, to pay the same to the Person or Persons duly authorized to receive the Taxes and Contributions for the Support and Maintenance of the said Gaol, House of Industry, and Fever Hospital.

And be it further enacted, That the Treasurer or Treasurers, Collector Treasurer reor Collectors for the Time being, acting in Execution of the said recited Act quired to pay of the Forty-seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, is and are hereby directed and required to pay the faid yearly Sum of Five hundred Pounds unto the Treasurer or Treasurers, Collector or Collectors of, or other the Perions for the Time being, duly authorized to receive the Taxes and Contributions for the Support and Maintenance of the said Gaol,

Power to Person authorized on Behalf of Gaol, House of Industry, &c. to recover in case of Non-payment.

X. And be it further enacted. That if the said Half-yearly Payments so to be made as aforesaid, or any Part thereof, shall be in Arrear or unpaid for the Space of Twenty-one Days after the same shall have become payable as aforefaid, it shall and may be lawful to and for the Person or Persons for the Time being duly authorized to receive the same, for the Support and Maintenance of the said Gaol, House of Industry, and Fever Hospital, to sue the said Commissioners for such Sum or Sums so become due and payable, in any of His Majesty's Courts of Law, and to recover the same, together with Six Pounds per Centum Interest thereon, to the Time of the Termination of such Suit or Action: Provided always, that it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Commissioners, or any Five of them, or any Person deputed by them, or any Five of them, to demand an Account of, or enquire into the Apportionment, Distribution, or Expenditure of the Sum or Sums hereby levied or to be levied, and of every Part thereof, before any Judge of Assize for the County of the City of Limerick, which Judge of Assize is hereby empowered and required to examine such Accounts, and to ascertain that the said Sums and every Part thereof have been applied to the Purposes of this Act and to none other; and also to direct that any Sum or Sums received by the Person or Persons authorized to receive the same, that shall have been applied to any other Purpose than what is contained in this Act, shall be by such Person or Persons repaid to the faid Commissioners within such Time as the Judge of Assize shall direct and appoint.

Costs of Act.

XI. And be it further enacted, That all the Costs, Charges, and Expences, incident to and attending the obtaining and passing of this Act, shall be paid by the said Commissioners by and out of the Monies levied and collected, or to be levied and collected by virtue of the said recited Act of the Forty-seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, or of this Act.

Public Act.

XII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others.
