An Act for erecting a New Market Place in the Town or Borough and Manor of Gosport in the County of Southampton.

[15th June 1811.]

HEREAS several Persons Inhabitants of the Town or Borough and Manor of Gosport, in the County of Southamoton. have and Manor of Gosport, in the County of Southampton, have purchased of the Lord Bishop of Winchester the present Market House, Shambles, Fish Cross, and other Buildings thereto adjoining, and all the Tolls and Profits thereof; and the whole and sole Right of keeping and holding of Two Fairs Yearly, the one on the Fourth Day of May, and the other on the Tenth Day of Ottober, with the Tolls thereof: And whereas the said Market House and Buildings being situated in one of the principal Streets of the said Town, the Passage along the same on Market Days is greatly obstructed: And whereas the said Inhabitants have purchased, under the Provisions of an Act passed in the Forty-second Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Ast for consolidating the Provisions of the several Atts passed for the Redemption and Sale of the Land Tax into one Att, and for making further Provision for the Redemption and Sale thereof, and for removing Doubts respecting the Right of Persons claiming to vote at Elections for Knights of the Shire, and other Members to serve in Parliament, in respect of Messuages, Lands or Tenements, the Land-tax upon which shall have been redeemed or purchased of the said Lord Bishop Two Pieces or Parcels of Waste Ground within the said Town or Borough and Manor, on Loc. & Per.

which they have begun to erect a New Market House, Shambles, Fish Stalls and other requisite Conveniencies: And whereas it would be attended with great Benefit and Convenience to the Inhabitants of the said Town or Borough and Manor and to the said several Persons if the Shares in the old and New Market Houses and Buildings were vested in them, and if Power was given to sell the old Market House and Premises as aforesaid, to build the intended Market House, Shambles, and Conveniencies, and raise Money for that Purpose, and if proper Rules and Regulations were atablished for governing, regulating and managing the same; but as the same cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament, May it therefore please your Majesty, That it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That for the better carrying this Act into Execution the following Persons, videlicet, George Porter Esquire, Samuel Jellicoe the Reverend Richard Bingham, Robert Curry, Samuel Jellicoe the Younger, John Goodeve, Joseph Goodeve, Benjamin Goodeve, Thomas Andrews Minchin, Robert Forbes, John Whitcomb, William Page, James Neale, Richard White, Richard White the Younger, Thomas Fotherley, Tristram Harper, Edward Paddon, William Midlane, Samuel Joseph, Matthias March, Thomas Norrish, Thomas Paul, James White, John Devereux, John Richards, Gay Shute, William Chase, George Harries, John Lucas, Henry Hicks, James Stening, Jane Robey Eldridge, Nathaniel Portlock, Joseph Moses, John Helby, Alexander Hart, Isaac Spires, William Mondey, John Taylor, James Westmore, Matthew Carter, George Dunn, Joseph Larcom, John Rood, Thomas Bryett, Thomas Blake Barrow, David Compigne, John Carter, Henry Whitear, John Baker, William Burney, Isaac Legg, Jacob Legg, and John Valentine, being the surviving original Proprietors who advanced the Money for making and completing the said New Market Place, together with such other Person or Persons who are or shall be entitled to one or more Share or Shares therein, shall hold a General Meeting at the New Market House aforesaid, on the Third Monday next after the passing of this Act, and one General Meeting shall be held by them, their Successors and Assigns on the First Monday in the Month of July in every Year, at or after the Hour of Fleven in the Forenoon, at the Market House aforesaid, Trustees to be or some other convenient Place within the said Town of Gosport; at which said first General Meeting, and at every future General Annual Meeting, the Proprietors assembled shall choose Fifteen Persons, being respectively Proprietors of one or more Share or Shares in the said Undertaking, to be Trustees for managing the Affairs of the said Proprietors in such Manner as is herein directed; but if at any Time it shall appear to any Seven or more of such Proprietors that for the more effectually putting this Act in Execution, an occasional General Meeting of Proprietors is necessary to be held, it shall be lawful for such Seven or more of them, by Notice to be affixed on the Door of the Chapel of Gosport aforesaid, during the Time of Divine Service, in the Mornings of Two Sundays, at least, before such intended General Meeting, also on the Door of the said Market House, and by such other Means as the said Proprietors at any General Meeting shall direct, and also specifying in every such Notice the Reason for and Intention of such Meetings respectively, to call a Meeting of the Proprietors

Powers by this Act given, with respect to the Matters so specified only; and at all such General Meetings (whether the same shall be Annual or Proprietors Special) every Proprietor shall have one Vote for each Share such Pro-to vote by prietor shall respectively possess, which Vote may be given by him or her, themselves or by his or her Proxy or Proxies duly constituted under his or her Hand, and that no one Proprietor shall vote in respect of more than Three Proxies at any one Time from Three individual Proprietors for the Number of their respective Shares; and the Majority of such Votes shall be binding upon all the said Proprietors: and at every such Meeting a Chairman shall be chosen, who in case of an Equality of Votes upon any Question (including the Chairman's Vote or Votes) shall have a further or casting Vote: Provided always, that no Person who shall be possessed of any less Interest than one whole Share of One hundred Pounds each in the said Undertaking, shall be entitled to vote at any Meeting or Meetings held by virtue of this Act, either in Person or by Proxy, or to hold and vote as Proxy for any other Person, or in any Manner to act or vote, or interfere in the Management of the said Undertaking as a Proprietor thereof, for any of the Purposes of this Act; nor shall any Person having less than a whole Share, be allowed to empower any Person having any joint Interest in a Share, to vote or act as a Proprietor in respect of the whole Share.

II. And be it further enacted, That no one Trustee to be elected by Chairman virtue of this Act, although he may be a Proprietor of several Shares in Trustees to the said Gosport New Market, shall have more than one Vote at any casting vote. Meeting of the Trustees of the said Marker, except the Chairman, who shall have the casting Vote in case of a Division of equal Numbers; although he may have given one Vote before; and at every such Meeting the Trustee present, whose Name stands highest upon the List of Trustees, shall be the Chairman; and any Five of the said Trustees met together after Notice given to the whole, shall have Power to act in the same Manner as if the whole were present.

Provided always, and be it further enacted, That in case any Person Trustee cealor Persons who shall have been appointed a Trustee or Trustees under this Act, shall cease to be a Proprietor of one or more Share or Shares in the said Undertaking, such Person or Persons shall from thencesorth be Trustee. incapable of acting as a Trustee or Trustees under this Act. 12 . 14 . 15

And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Pro- A Clerk and prietors at their first General Meeting, or at any future General Meeting, to nominate and appoint a fit and proper Person to be Clerk and Treafurer to the said Proprietors, who shall continue in such Office during his good Behaviour, and also such other Officer and Officers as may be thought necessary for the Purposes of this Act, by Writing under the Hand of the Chairman of such Meeting in the Book of Proceedings, with such Salary or Salaries as the said Proprietors shall think proper; and the said Proprietors shall and are hereby required to take such Security from every such Clerk and Treasurer and other Officers for the due and faithful Execution of his or their Office or Offices, as they shall think necessary and proper, and which said Clerk and Treasurer shall from Time to Time enter all the Proceedings of the said Proprietors and their Trustees in Books to be provided for that Purpose; and which said

Treasurer to be appointed.

Clerk and Treasurer shall keep and enter all Accounts of Monies received and expended on Account of the said Undertaking, in such Books; and shall also from Time to Time receive and collect from the said Proprietors the several calls on account of the said Undertaking, which shall be made by the said Trustees at any General Meeting, and keep a just Account thereof, subject to the Controul of the said Trustees; and at every such General Annual Meeting all the Accounts of the said Clerk and Treasurer with the said Proprietors shall be audited, and if approved of be settled and allowed.

Power to appoint Clerk of Market, and have Weights, &c. for weighing

V. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to appoint an Inspector of Provisions and of Weights and Measures in the said Market, and a Clerk of the said Market, and to erect and appoint a public Weighing House or Place at, in or near the said Market for weighing such Meat, Goods, Articles and Things as shall be bought Articles sold or sold by Weight in the same Market, and to keep good and sufficient Standard Weights, Scales, Steelyards and Measures, and to appoint the Clerk or Clerks of the same Market, or some other Person or Persons to attend the same on every Market Day during the Time the same Market shall be holden, continue and endure, and that all and every the Person or Persons selling Meat or other Things by Weight or Measure in the same Market shall weigh and measure the same in or by the said Weights, Measures, Scales or Steelyards as aforesaid, if required by the Buyer or Buyers thereof to be so weighed or measured, and that in case any Person or Persons shall resuse to weigh and measure as aforesaid, he, she or they shall forfeit and pay for every such Offence any Sum not exceeding Forty Shillings.

Trustees and Clerk and Treasurer and other Officer to be under the Controul of General Meetings.

VI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That such Trustees, and Clerk and Treasurer and other Officers shall from Time to Time, be subject to the Examination and Controul of the annual or occasional General Meetings of the Proprietors as aforesaid, and shall pay due Obedience to all such lawful Orders and Directions in and about the Premises, as they shall from Time to Time receive from the said Proprietors at any such General Meetings.

A Power for Proprietors to raise Money for the Purpoles of the Act.

VII. And to the Endthat the faid Proprietors may been abled to complete, improve, and maintain the said New Market Place and Fish Stalls: Be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Proprietors, their Successors and Assigns, to raise and contribute amongst themselves, or by the Admission of new Proprietors, such Sum or Sums of Money, for making, completing, and maintaining the said New Market Place, and the Shops and other Buildings belonging thereto, and other the Purposes of this Act, as the said Proprietors at any General Meeting shall from Time to Time order and direct, not exceeding in the Aggregate the Sum of Fifteen thousand Pounds; and the Vote of such General Meeting shall be decided by the Majority of Shares, in respect of which any Proprietor present, or by Proxy as aforesaid, shall then and there vote; and the whole Money so raised and contributed being added to the Money already advanced, shall be divided and distinguished into equal Shares of One hundred Pounds each Share; and a sufficient Part of the Money so to be contributed, or which shall be otherwise raised by virtue of this Act, is hereby directed in the first Place to be applied in defraying the Charges and Expences

Expences attending the obtaining and passing this Act, and all the Residue and Remainder of such Money, in the Purchase of the Ground hereinbefore mentioned; for and towards making, completing and maintaining the said New Market Place, and in widening and improving the Avenues leading thereto; and in erecting proper Shops, Sheds, Stalls, Fish Stalls, and such other Buildings and Conveniences, and for other the Purposes of this Act, as any General Meeting may order and direct, and in defraying all other necessary Charges and Expences concerning the same, and for no other Use, Intent or Purpose what soever.

. VIII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the said Trustees Calls to be met together under the Authority of this Act, shall have Power from made, and Time to Time to make such Call and Calls of Money for the Purposes of Penalty and this Act, from the several Proprietors of the said New Market Place Non-payin Proportion to their respective Share or Shares therein, upon any Sum ment. or Sums of Money (not exceeding the Sum of Fifteen thousand Pounds, including the Sum already raised as aforesaid) which shall have been, ordered to be contributed and raised for the Purposes of this Act by any General Meeting of the said Proprietors, as they the said Trustees shall from Time to Time find necessary and wanting, which Money so called for, shall be paid to such Person or Persons and in such Manner as the said Trustees shall order and direct for the Use of the said Undertaking; and if any Person or Persons shall neglect or refuse to pay his, her or their rateable and proportionable Part or Share of the said Money when called for as aforesaid, or any Part thereof, for the Space of One Calendar Month next after Notice thereof in Writing, to be signed by the Clerk and Treasurer, delivered to him, her or them, or left at his, her or their last usual Place or Places of Abode, he, she or they so neglecting or refusing, shall forseit and pay any Sum not exceeding One Moiety of such Call for every Share which he, she or they shall have in the said Undertaking; and in case such Person or Persons shall continue to neglect or refuse to pay his, her or their rateable Call or Calls as aforesaid or any Part thereof, for the Space of Three Calendar Months next after the Time appointed for the Payment thereof, and after such Notice as aforesaid, then and in every such Case he, she or they neglecting or refusing shall forseit for the Use of the said Undertaking his, her or their respective Share or Shares or Interests therein, and all the Profits and Benefits thereof, all which Shares Interests and Profits so forseited shall thereupon merge and become wholly extinct.

IX. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That no Forfeiture Proprietors of any Share or Interest in the said Undertaking shall actually accrue, or not to forfeit the Share merge or become extinct, unless and until the same shall be de- without such clared to be forfeited at the next Meeting of the Trustees, held after such Forfeiture shall happen to be made; and every such Forfeiture shall be an General Indemnification to and for every Proprietor or Proprietors so forfeiting Meeting. against all Action and Actions, Suits or Prosecutions whatsoever, to be commenced or prosecuted for any Breach of Contract or other Agreement betwixt such Proprietor or Proprietors so forfeiting, and the rest of the Proprietors, with regard to carrying on the said New Market Place.

X. And be it further enacted, That it shalk and may be lawful to and for the several Proprietors of the said New Market Place, to sell and dispose of any Share or Shares he, she or they is or are, or shall hereaster be intitled to therein, subject to the Rules and Conditions herein mentioned; and that all such Shares or any Part or Parts of such Shares shall be, and are hereby vested in the several Proprietors before mentioned, and their several and respective Executors, Administrators and Assigns, to their and every of their proper Use and Behoof, in proportion to their several and respective Rights, Titles and Interests in and to the Monies already by each of them respectively heretofore advanced, and which shall hereaster be subscribed and paid at any Time or Times for the Purposes of this Act; and all and every the said Shares or Parts of Shares shall be deemed to be Perfonal Estate, and shall pass as such, and not in the Nature of real Property.

XI. And be it further enacted, That the said Shares shall be sold, assigned and transferred in the following form, to wit,

The Method of transfering Shares in cases of Mar-riages or Death.

XII. And be it further enacted, That before any Person or Persons who shall claim any Part or Share of the Rents and Income of the said New Market Place in right of Marriage, shall be entitled to receive the same, an Assidavit containing a Copy of the Register of such Marriage, shall be made and sworn to by some credible. Person before one of the Judges at Westminster, a Master Extraordinary in Chancery, or one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace, and shall be transmitted to the Clerk of the said Proprietors for the Time being, who shall file and register the same, and make an Entry thereof in a Book, or Books, which shall be kept for that Purpose; and before any Person or Persons, who shall claim any Part or Share in the said New Market Place, or the Rents and Profits thereof, by virtue of any Bequest or Will, or in a Course of Administration, shall be entitled to réceive the same, the Probate Copy of the said Will or the Letters of Administration, in case the Proprietor shall have died intestate, shall be produced and shewn to the Clerk to the said Proprietors, who shall thereupon register the same in a Book to be provided and kept by the said Clerk for that Purpose, and thereupon the Stock of the Proprietor so dying shall be transferred in the Books of the said Proprietors into the Names or Name of his or her Executors or Administrators, to be by such Executors or Administrators transferred and disposed of according to the said Will, or in a due Course of Administration.

And be it further enacted, That all such Messuages, Buildings, Lands, and Grounds, which have already been purchased by the said several original Subscribers to the said New Market Place, or which shall hereaster be purchased under this Act, for any of the Purposes thereof, and also

also all Messuages, Buildings, and Conveniences which have already been erected and made by them for the use of the said New Market Place, or for any of the Purpoles of this Act, or in the making of any Improvement. under the same, or which shall hereafter be erected, or built under this Act for any of the Purpoles thereof, shall be, and the same are hereby vested in the Trustées for the Time being of the said Proprietors; their respective Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns, in trust for the whole of the faid Proprietors.

XIV. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for Buildings the said Proprietors to erect and build, or contract for the erecting and may be erectbuilding any Market House or Market Houses, and also such other ed and alproper and convenient Buildings, Slaughter-houses, Shops, Sheds, Sham-tered. bles, Stalls, Standings and other Conveniences as the said Proprietors shall judge to be suitable or proper for the Use and Convenience of the several Persons attending the said Market, and to alter the same from Time to Time as they shall think fit.

XV. And be it surther enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Power to re-Trustees and they are hereby impowered as soon after the New Market under this Act shall have been built and opened for public Use as a Market, as the same can conveniently be done, to take down and remove the present Market House, Shambles, Fish Cross and other Buildings thereto belonging, and to apply the same or dispose thereof in any Manner for the Purpole of this Act, or to sell the Materials and apply the Produce thereof Winchester as any other Money raised under this Act shall or may be applied; not to be re-Provided always that nothing herein contained shall authorize or em- moved until power the said Trustees to remove or take away any or either of the Three other Co Rooms in the present Market House or Building heretofore and now vided and used by any of the Agents or Persons employed by the Lord Bishop of Leave of Bis-Winchester, until such other Provisions shall be made for the Accommoda- shop givention of the Agents of the said Lord Bishop as shall be approved of by the said Lord Bishop, and Leave in Writing shall have been obtained for removing the said Three Rooms, and then and in such Cases the said Three Rooms may be removed and disposed of as the Market House and other Buildings may be disposed of under this Act; and from and after the Removal of the said Market House, Shambles, Fish Cross and other Buildings, no other Buildings shall be erected on the Scite thereof, but the same shall remain a Highway and Part of the Street of the said Town of Gosport for the Accommodation of the said Town.

Not to pre- XVIII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to prevent or hinder any Person from selling or exposing to Sale any marketable Commodities, Matters or Things whatsoever in his or her own private Dwelling House, or in his or her own Shop, in any Part of the said Town of Gosport.

Proprietors may make Regulations in the Market.

XIX. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Proprietors or their Trustees, at any Meeting to be held in pursuance of this Act, from Time to Time to direct and appoint what particular and respective Parts of the said New Market Place shall be occupied and made use of for exposing to Sale any Commodities, Matters and Things therein, and also from Time to Time to make such Rules, Orders, Regulations and Bye-Laws for the better regulating, cleanling, letting, occupying and using the said Market House, or any Part or Parts thereof, (not repugnant to any Thing in this Act contained, or contrary to any Law or Statute of that Part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called England), as the Nature of each particular Circumstance shall require, with such Penalty for disobeying the same, not exceeding Five Pounds for any one Offence, as they shall think fit; and for fixing and ascertaining the Time or Times at which all or any Goods, Wares, or Commodities shall respectively begin to be offered or exposed to Sale therein, and how long the same shall continue exposed to Sale; and the said Proprietors, or their Trustees shall cause the Time or Times of beginning and concluding every Market to be announced by the ringing of a Bell or otherwise, as they shall think proper; and from Time to Time to alter, vary, revoke or make void any such Rules, Orders, Regulations and Bye-Laws, which Rules, Orders, Regulations and Bye-Laws so as aforesaid to be from Time to Time made shall be printed and affixed on the said Market-House on Four successive Days, and shall be valid and effectual to all Intents and Purposes: Provided always, That all such Rules, Orders, Regulations, and Bye-Laws, and all Convictions for any Penalties or Forfeitures imposed by virtue thereof, shall be liable to appeal to the Justices of the next General Quarter Sessions of the Peace from the said Proprietors in like Manner as is herein-

For every Stall or Shed used by a Butcher for selling Flesh Meat, Market Tolls. being actually his own Property, per Day, One Shilling.

For each Stall or Shed used by a Person for exposing to Sale Cheese, Bacon or pickled Pork, per Day, One Shilling.

For every Basket, Parcel or Quantity of Butter, not exceeding Twelve Pounds, Two Pence.

For Ditto, exceeding Twelve Pounds, and not exceeding One and a Half Dozen Pounds, Three Pence.

For every Basket, Parcel or Quantity of Butter exceeding One and & Half Dozen Pounds, and not exceeding Two Dozen Pounds, Four Pence.

For Ditto, exceeding Two Dozen Pounds, per Dozen, One Penny. For Poultry, including Fowls, Chickens and Ducks, Wild Fowl and Rabbits, not exceeding Half a Dozen, Three Pence.

Ditto, not exceeding One Dozen, Six Pence.

Ditto, not exceeding Two Dozen, Nine Fence.

Ditto, not exceeding Three Dozen, One Shilling.

Ditto, not exceeding Four Dozen, One Shilling and Three Pence-And for every Dozen exceeding Four Dozen, Three Pence.

For every Turkey or Goose, Two Pence.

For every Half Dozen, or under One Dozen of Pigeons, Two Pence. For one Dozen, and not exceeding Two and a half Dozen, Four Pence.

Not exceeding Two Dozen, Six Pence.
