An Act for erecting and maintaining a Harbour, and Works connected therewith, at Dunure, in the County of Ayr. [6th May 1811.]

THEREAS a safe and commodious Harbour on that Part of the Coast of Scotland which lies w and County of Ayr, would be highly useful to an extensive District of Country: And whereas Thomas Kennedy of Dunure, Esquire, is possessed of a considerable Tract of Land on the said Coast, and has expended a considerable Sum of Money in the Construction of a Harbour upon his Property at Dunure, lying within the faid Parish, and in a Situation peculiarly advantageous: And whereas the said Thomas Kennedy has already in Part constructed the said Harbour and other Works therewith connected, and is desirous to complete the same at his private Expence: And whereas it is expedient, in order to indemnify the faid Thomas Kennedy, and his Heirs, Successors, and Assignees for the Sums of Money already laid out upon the said Works, and the further Sums necessary to complete the same, that the said Thomas Kennedy and his foresaids, should be empowered to levy certain Rates and Harbour Dues upon such Vessels as may use the said Harbour, and upon all Commodities shipped or landed at the same; and that other Powers should be granted for the Management and Support thereof, but such cannot be obtained without the Aid and Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty, that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by 7 X [Loc. & Per.]

to be constructed at Dunure.

Harbour, &c. the Authority of the same, That the said Thomas Kennedy, and his Heirs, Successors, and Assignees, shalf be and hereby are authorized and empowered to put this Act in Execution; and that from and after the passing of this Act it shall be lawful for the said Thomas Kennedy and his foresaids to complete a Harbour at Dunure, in the Parish of Maybole and County of Ayr, with Piers and Quays, and other Works therewith connected, and also from Time to Time to alter and improve the same in such Manner as he or they shall judge fit for the Purposes aforesaid.

Sum to be expended.

II. And be it enacted, That the said Thomas Kennedy and his foresaids shall, and he and they are hereby obliged and required, within Three Years after the passing of this Act, to lay out and expend the Sum of Seven thousand Pounds, including what has already been expended by the faid Thomas Kennedy in constructing the said Harbour and the other Works therewith connected, and within Five Years after the passing of this Act shall cause an Account of the Expenditure of such Sum of Money in Manner as aforesaid, to be duly verified upon Oath before the Sheriff Depute, or his Substitute, for the said County of Ayr, which Account, together with a Certificate of Verification thereon, shall be thereafter duly recorded by the Sheriff-Clerk in the Registry of Probative Writs for the faid County.

Boundaries of

III. And be it enacted, That the Boundary of the said Harbour to the Harbour. which this Act refers, shall be deemed, and is hereby declared to be for the Purposes of this Act, the Line of Low Water Mark, extending from the Rocks under the Castle of Dunure to those Rocks which project into the Sea at and a little beyond the March between the Lands of Dunure and Dunduff, and that Portion of the Line of Road from Maybole to Ayr passing by the Harbour, which shall be intersected by Two Lines produced at Right Angles from the Line of Low Water Mark, at the aforesaid Rocks respectively, to the said Road, and each of the said Lines respectively.

Power to appoint Officers, &c.

IV. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the faid Thomas Kennedy and his foresaids to appoint, during his or their Pleasure; such Harbour Masters, Collectors of Dues, and other Officers, as may be requisite for carrying into Effect the Purposes and Provisions of this Act.

Tonnage Duty.

Power to take V. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Thomas Kennedy and his foresaids to levy, for their own Behoof, upon all Vessels which shall enter and use the aforesaid Harbour, or shall come within or off the same, so as to receive Protection or Accommodation therefrom. any Sums not exceeding the several Rates and Duties herein-after specified; videlicet,

Tonnage Duty.

For every Vessel, if under the Burden of Fisteen Tons, the Sum of Two-pence per Ton; if of the Burden of Fifteen Tons or upwards, and under Twenty-five Tons, the Sum of Two-pence Halfpenny per Ton; if of the Burden of Twenty-five Tons or upwards, and under Forty-five Tons, the Sum of Three-pence per Ton; if of the Burden of Forty-five Tons or upwards, and under Sixty Tons, the Sum of Four-pence per Ton; if of the Burden of Sixty Tons or upwards, and under Seventy-

nve

fivé Tons, the Sum of Four-pence Halfpenny per Ton; and if of the Burden of Seventy five Tons or upwards, and under One hundred Tons, the Sum of Five-pence per Ton; and if of the Burden of One hundred. Tons or upwards, and under One hundred and fifty Tons, the Sum of Sixpence per Ton; and if of the Burden of One hundred and fifty Tons and upwards; and under Two hundred Tons, the Sum of Seven-pence per Ton; and if of the Burden of Two hundred Tons or upwards, and under Three hundred Tons, the Sum of Eight-pence per Ton; and if of the Burden of Three hundred Tons or upwards, and under Four hundied Tons, the Sum of Nine-pence per Ton; and if of the Burden of Four hundred Tons or upwards, the Sum of Ten-pence per Ton.

VI. And be it enacted, That the Commander of every Vessel chargeable How Tonwith the Tonnage Duty by this Act imposed, shall produce to the said nage Duty to Thomas Kennedy and his foresaids the Custom House Register of the Burbained. den of Tonnage of such Vessel; and on Failure or Delay so to do, or in case the same shall prove unsatisfactory, it is hereby declared lawful for the faid Thomas Kennedy and his foresaids to admeasure the said Vessel, according to an Act passed in the Twenty-sixth Year of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for the further Increase and Encouragement of Shipping and Navigation.

VII. And be it enacted, That if any Person or Persons shall obstruct Penalty on or prevent the Admeasurement of any Vessel in Manner aforesaid, such Persons ob-Person or Persons shall be liable individually in a Penalty not exceeding, Measurement Ten Pounds.

of Vessels.

VIII. And be it enacted, That besides the Tonnage Duty on Vessels Rates upon entering and using the said Harbour, there shall be paid to the said Goods. Thomas Kennedy and his foresaids, on all Commodities which shall be there exported or imported in the said Vessels, the several Rates specified In the Schedule annexed to this Act.

IX. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Thomas To fix Rates Kennedy and his foresaids to fix such reasonable Rates upon Commodities not specified in the Schedule as he and his foresaids shall think sit, provided no such Rate exceed the One-eighth Part of the Freight of such Commodities.

X. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Thomas Rates may be Kennedy and his foresaids, from Time to Time to vary the Rates and altered. Duties to be levied under this 'Act, provided they in no Case exceed the Maximum of Rates and Duties by this Act authorized.

XI. And be it enacted, That no Collector of His Majesty's Customs, Custom or other Officer of Revenue at the said Harbour, shall permit any Vessel House Officer chargeable with Rates and Duties under this Act, to be entered Inwards, charge any Outwards, or Coastwise, or any Commodities to be landed from or put Vessel before on board of such Vessel, until he shall have received from the proper Dutics paid. Officer a Certificate of all fuch Rates and Duties having been paid in full.

XII. And be it enacted, That in cafe of Refusal or Neglect to pay Manner of the Rates and Duties by this Act granted, it shall be lawful for the said recovering

Thomas Kennedy and his foresaids, to detain any Vessel, and all Commodities on board thereof, for which such Rates and Duties shall not have been paid, until the same be fully paid: And provided such Payment shall not be made within Five Days from the Detention of fuch Vessel, it is hereby declared lawful for the said Thomas Kennedy and his foresaids, to cause any Part or Parts of such Vessel and Commodities to be appraised by Two or more sworn Appraisers, or other sufficient Persons not interested therein, and forthwith to sell so much of the same as will be sufficient to discharge all such Rates and Duties so due and payable on such Vessel and Commodities so sold, and all Expences incurred on Account of or attending fuch Sale; and in the Event of there being any Overplus, that the fame shall be paid to the Person or Persons owning or having Charge of the faid Vessel and Commodities on Demand; and in case any Vessel or Vessels shall unwarrantably depart from the said Harbour before Payment has been made of the several Rates and Duties above mentioned, it is hereby further provided, that the Owner or Owners and Master or Malters of the said Vessels shall be liable in a Sum equal to Double the laid Rates and Duties, and may be sued for Payment of the same.

Exemption His Majesty's Service.

XIII. And be it enacted, That all Vessels belonging to or employed in the for Vessels in Service of His Majesty, or His Heirs and Successors, or in the Service of the Customs or Excise, or Post Office, using the said Harbour, and all Naval and Ordnance Stores, and other Matters imported into or exported from the said Harbour, for the Use of the Navy or Army, shall be exempted from Payment of all Rates and Duties hereby granted.

Further Allowances for Goods'remaining upon a certain Time.

XIV. And be it enacted, That if any Commodity shall remain upon any Wharf or other Place belonging to the said Harbour, for a longer Period than Twenty-four Hours from the Time such Commodity shall have been Wharfs above placed upon the said Wharf or other Place, then and in every such Case it shall be lawful for the said Thomas Kennedy and his foresaids, to levy a Sum not exceeding One Half of the Rates and Duties by this Act imposed upon the said Commodities, and that over and above the said Rates and Duties; and it shall be lawful to exact the said additional Rates and Duties for each and every additional and successive Period of Twentyfour Hours, during which the said Commodity shall remain on the said Wharf or other Place.

Masters of Veffels anfwerable for Damage done by their Crews, &c.

XV. And be it enacted, That the Master and Owner of every Vessel using the said Harbour, shall be, and hereby are made answerable for Damage done by them, or by fuch Vessel, or by the Mariners, or by others on board the same, to any of the Works, Machinery, or Tackle, connected with the said Harbour, or other Vessels lying therein, with full Costs of Suit; and it shall be lawful to detain such Vessel until sufficient Security be granted for Reparation and Payment of the same.

Masters may XVI. And be it further enacted, That in case the Master or Masters, recover from Owner or Owners, of any Ship or Vessel as a foresaid, shall be compelled their Crews. to pay any Penalty, or to make Satisfaction for any Damage or Trespass by reason of any such Damage or Mischief done or committed by his or their Mariners, Boatmen, Servants, or other Persons, employed by them. or any of them, such Mariners, Boatmen, Servants, or other Persons, and each and every of them shall be liable to pay such Penalty or Damage,

with the Costs thereof, ito fuch Master or Masters. Owner or Owners, and in case of Non-payment thereof, upon Demand and Oath made by such Master or Masters, Owner or Owners, of the Payment nade by him, her, or them, of such Penalty or Satisfaction for Damages, and that therefame, or the Costs thereof, have, or hathmore been repaid to him; her, or them, by such Mariners, Boatmen, Servants, or other Persons or any of them, although demanded, (such Oath to be made before any One Justice of the Peace of the County where such Penalty and Sasisfaction shall have been incurred, or paid, or where such Mariner, Boatman, Servant, or other Person can be found), the Amount thereof shall be recovered as any other Penalty is hereby directed to be recovered.

XVII. And be it enacted, That if any Person shall throw into the To prevent said Harbour, or other Place connected therewith, Ballast, Stones, Shingle, Ballast, &c. Rubbish, or any the like Things, such Person shall, for every such being thrown Offence, be liable in a Penalty not exceeding Ten Pounds over and above &c. all Costs of Suit, and Costs of removing all such Ballast, Stones, Shingle, and Rubbish, which shall in all Cases be deposited in a convenient Place, as appointed for that Purpose, by the said Thomas Kennedy and his foresaids.

XVIII. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Thomas Bye Laws. Kennedy, and his foresaids, from Time to Time, to establish such Bye-Laws, Rules, and Regulations, as he or they shall deem expedient or: useful for the good Government of the said Harbour, and all Persons: using and frequenting the same, and connected therewith, and the Inhabitants of the Town of Dunure now building: Provided always, that no fuch Bye-Law, Rule, or Regulation, be any wife repugnant to the Laws of that Part of the United Kingdom called Scotland: And provided always, that no fuch Bye-Law, Rule, or Regulation, shall be binding and authoritative, until it shall have been printed and published on Two: successive Market Days at the Market Cross of the Town of Ayr, and affixed to some conspicuous Place near the said Harbour and Town for the Space of Fourteen Days; but that so soon as the said Bye-Laws, Rules, and Regulations shall have been so published and affixed, they shall be equally binding and authoritative with any Provision of this Act.

XIX. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That it shall be Penalty. lawful for the said Thomas Kennedy, and his foresaids, to enforce the said Bye-Laws, by inslicting a Penalty, provided such Penalty exceed in no Case the Sum of Ten Pounds.

XX. And be it enacted, That all Causes or Matters which shall arise Jurisdiction. out of, or be in any Degree connected with, or dependent upon, the Provisions of this Act, or the Bye-Laws, Rules, or Regulations, made in pursuance of the Power thereby granted, shall be heard and determined by, and all Penalties by this Act imposed, shall be recovered in a summary Way, before any One or more of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the County of Ayr; and the said Justice or Justices is and are hereby empowered and required to award such Damages and give such Judgements and Decrees on the Causes and Matters so brought before him or them, as to him or them shall seem most agreeable to the true Intent and Meaning of this Act, and the Bye-Laws, Rules, and Regulations, which [Loc. & Per.]

may, from Time to Time, be made in pursuance thereof: And it is hereby further provided, that it shall be lawful for the said Justice or Justices, to commit any Person who shall fail to obey the said Judgements and Decrees to the common Prison of the Town of Ayr, there to be kept in Confinement for such Time as such Justice or Justices shall direct, not exceeding the Term of Three Months.

Appeal.

XXI. And be it enacted, That it shall be competent to all and every Person or Perfons conceiving himself, herself, or themselves aggrieved by any of the faid Bye-Laws and Regulations, or by any of the aforesaid Judgements or Decrees of the said Justice or Justices, made or given in pursuance or in Execution of this Act, to appeal to the general Quarter Sessions of the Peace, to be holden in and for the County of Ayr, next enfuing, after the aforefaid Judgements and Decrees shall have been pronounced: Provided always, that a Notice of Twenty Days at the least, of such Appeal, on the Part of the Appellant to the Party appealed against, shall intervene between the Date of fuch Judgement or Decree and the said Quarter Sessions; and where fuch Notice cannot intervene, in every such Case the said Appeal shall stand over until the next Quarter Sessions, and shall not be competent at any subsequent Meeting of the General or Adjourned Quarter Sessions. Testimony of XXII. And be it enacted, That in all Causes and Matters which shall be heard and determined relative to this Act, and connected therewith, the Testimony of all such Persons as shall act officially under the Appointment of the faid Thomas Kennedy, and his foresaids, shall be received as legal Evidence in the Determination of all such Causes and Matters.

XXIII. And be it enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Publick Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.
