## Cap. 36.

An Act to amend an Act made in the Paliament of Ireland, in the Twenty-sixth Year of His present Majesty, for making and repairing Public Roads in the County of Dublin, with respect to the Roads within those Parts of the Baronies of Uppercross and Newcastle, which are situate on the South-East Side of the great Turnpike Road leading from Dublin to Cork, by Rathcoole and Naas. [6th May 1811.]

THEREAS from the Manner of raising the Money heretofore presented by the Grand Jury of the County of Dublin, to be raised upon the Baronies of Uppercross and Newcastle, in the County of Dublin, for the making and repairing of the Roads in the said Baronies, pursuant to an Act of the Parliament of Ireland, made in the Twenty-sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An 26 G. 52. Att for making, widening, and repairing Public Roads in the County of Dub- c. 14. In, and for repealing Parts of several Atts formerly made for that Purpose: there are a great Number of Persons within that Part of the said Baronies situate on the Lest or South-East Side of the great Turnpike Road leading from Dublin to Cork, by Rathcoole and Nans, who occupy Houses, and keep Horses and Carriages, and use the said Roads in the Part of the said Baronies, and who notwithstanding do not contribute to the Expence of making or repairing the same, which is not just or reasonable; For Remedy whereof, may it please Your Majesty, That it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and Grand Jury by the Authority of the same, That from and after the passing of to present [Loc. & Per.]

Sums to be raised upon Houses.

this Act, it shall and may be lawful to and for the Grand Jury of the County of Dublin at every Easter and Michaelmas Term to present, to be railed upon the several Houses in those Parts of the laid Rayonies of Upper Cross and Nowcestle respectively, which are situate on the Lest or South Haft Side of the great Turnpike Road now leading from Dublin to Cork by Rathcoole and Naas (save as therein after mentioned) and to be paid and payable by the Occupiers of such Houses respectively, any Sum or Sums of Money not exceeding One Shilling for every Pound Sterling of the yearly Value thereof, such yearly Value to be ascertained in Manner hereinafter mentioned, and the same to be applied and expended, exclusively, in the making and repairing of the Roads and Public Footways in those Parts only of the said Baronies respectively which are situate on the Lest or South East Side of the said Turnpike Road, and as the same shall be presented by the said Grand Jury, and according to the Form and Effect of the respective Presentments which shall be passed for that Purpose, the said Sum or Sums so to be presented and levied by virtue of this Act, to be applied to the Purpose aforesaid, in addition to such Sum or Sums of Money as shall or may be presented from Time to Time by the faid Grand Jury for making and repairing Roads and Public Footways in the said Baronies respectively, by virtue of any Act or Acts of Parlian ent now in force.

Valuers to be appointed.

II. And be it further enacted, That in order to ascertain the several Houses which shall be liable to pay and to be assessed under this Act, and in order to ascertain the Value of the same, and at what Rate they shall be so assessed, the Treasurer of the County of Dublin shall issue his Precept or Warrant to the Churchwardens of the several Parishes or Unions, which, or Parts of which, are situate within those Parts of the said Baronies respectively, which are situate on the Lest Side of the said Turnpike Road which are within One Month after the passing of this Act, or as soon after as he shall be thereunto required by any Two Landholders residing within those Parts of the said Baronies respectively which are situate on the Lest Side of the said Turnpike Road, thereby requiring the said Churchwardens in a public Vestry, to be called for that Purpose, within One Month after the Delivery of the said Warrant, to cause Two Persons residing within the said Parish or Union, who respectively occupy a House of at least the yearly Value of Twenty Pounds Irish Currency, or are possessed of a Freehold or Leasehold Estate of at least the yearly Value of Fifty Pounds per Annum Irish Currency, within those Parts of the said Baronies respectively, which are situate on the Lest Side of said Turnpike Road, to be elected and appointed as Valuators, and that such Valuators shall thereupon proceed to value the Houses in said Parish or Union, within those Parts of the said Parishes or Unions, situate on the Lest Side of said Turnpike Road, according to the fair, just and reasonable yearly Value thereof, and shall make out and certity a List of such Valuation to the said Churchwardens, within One Month after such Namination or Appointment, and shall make Oath before any Justice of the Peace of the said County of Dublin, (which Oath any Justice is hereby empowered to administer) that they have made the said Valuation or Applotment fairly and justly, according to the best of their Skill and Judgment, without Favour, Affection or Mal ce to any Person, and which Oath shall be recorded on the Back or at the Bottom of such List, and the said Churchwardens shall thereupon call another Vestry within Fourteen Days after receiving such Valuation

Valuation, for the Purpose of confirming, altering or amending the same, and the Vestry so called is hereby empowered to hear all Parties who shall object to the said Valuation or Applotment, and for that Purpose to adjourn from Time to Time, and to make such Alterations and Amendments as to them shall seem just and reasonable, and then finally to settle and ascertain the same, and the Churchwardens shall then return the said Valuation so confirmed, altered or amended, with the said Warrant annexed thereto, to the Treasurer of the said County, to be kept among the Records thereof, and so from Time to Time, as often as a new or further Valuation may become necessary by the Increase of Houses in those Parts of the said Baronies respectively, as are situate on the Left Side of the said Turnpike Road, the said Treasurer shall on a Requisition to him for that Purpose to be made by any Grand Jury of the County of Dublin, or by the Churchwardens of any of the said Parishes or Unions, or by any Three Landholders residing within those Parts of said Baronies respectively hereinbefore mentioned, issue, his Warrant in like Manner as aforesaid, and the Churchwardens and Valuators shall proceed in like Manner as aforesaid, to value such Houses as may have been built since the former Valuation, and according to which Lists or Valuations so to be made from Time to Time, the said Houses and the Occupiers of such Houses respectively, shall be rated and charged under this Act: Provided always, that in making such Valuation, the faid Valuators shall not value any House which is not of the yearly Value of Five Pounds Irish Currency, nor shall they Value any House at a higher Rent than Fifty Pounds Irish Currency: Provided also, that they do not value any House or Houses situate immediately on the Side of or adjoining to the said Turnpike Road, or any House, the immediate Entrance, Gate or private Avenue leading to which shall be on or immediately adjoining the said Turnpike.

III. And be it further enacted, That the Treasurer of the said County shall, from Time to Time, issue his Warrant for the Purpose of raising the Execuand levying the Money presented under this Act, as he is empowered to Act. do with respect to Money presented under the said recited Act, and that the Money to be presented under this Act, shall and may be levied thereunder in like Manner, and with the like Powers and Remedies for enforcing Payment of the same, as any Money presented under the said recited Act; and that in case the said Treasurer, Churchwardens or Valuators to be appointed as aforesaid, shall neglect, decline or refuse to carry this Act into effect, so far as the same relates to them respectively as aforesaid, the Person or Persons so offending shall be liable to a Penalty of Twenty Pounds Irish Currency, to be recovered by Action of Debt, Bill, Plaint or Information, by any Person who shall sue for the same in any of His Majesty's Courts of Record in Dublin, wherein no Essoin, Protection, Privilege or Wager at Law, or more than one Imparlance shall be granted or allowed.

Enforcing

IV. And whereas, by the said recited Act, it is enacted, that it should Overseers to be lawful for the Grand Jury of the County of Dublin to present for a time not exceeding One Year an Overseer to keep in repair and free Repairs. from Nuisances, any Number of Perches of Road in the said Baronies, not exceeding Six hundred Perches, and to empower such Overseer to expend Six-pence for every Perch if within Six Miles of the Castle of Dublin, or Three-pence if at a greater Distance, to be

expend larger Sums in

expended and accounted for as in the said Act is mentioned, which Allowance has been found insufficient, for Remedy whereof: Be it enacted, That from and after the passing of this Act, it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Grand Jury of the County of Dublin, to present the annual Overseers to expend any Sum of Money not exceeding Two Shillings for every Perch upon the Great Road leading from Dublin to Miltown, the Great Road leading from Dublin to Rathfarnham by Rathmines and Harold's Cross, and the Great Road from Dublin to Crumlin, and to present any Sum or Sums of Money not exceeding Nine-pence for every Perch upon the several other Roads in those Parts of the said Baronies which are situate on the Left Side of the said Turnpike Road: Provided always, that every such Overseer shall expend and account for all such Sum or Sums of Money so presented in like, Manner as in the laid recited Act is mentioned, respecting the expending and accounting for the said Sums of Six-pence and Three-pence respectively.

Powers of former Acts extended to this.

V. And be it further enacted, That all and every Person and Persons who, collectively or individually, shall or may be in any wise concerned or employed from Time to Time in ordering, presenting, valuing, collecting, levying or expending the Money or Cess herein or hereby authorized to be levied, raised and expended, shall have the like Powers and Authority, Benefit, Privileges and Advantages in all respects for that Purpose, as fully to all Intents and Purposes, as are given in and by the said recited Act.

Grand Jury to prefent Colts of passing and executing Act.

VI. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to and for the Grand Jury of the County of Dublin to present from Time to Time such Sum or Sums of Money as they shall think just and reasonable to the County Treasurer, Inspector of County Accounts, and Secretary to the Grand Jury, as Compensation for their Trouble and Loss of Time in carrying this Act into Effect, to be railed and levied off those Parts of the said Baronies respectively which are situate on the Left Side of the said Turnpike Road, also to present in Gales or Sums of One Fourth Part in each presenting Term, to be also raised and levied off the said Parts of the said Baronies on the Lest of the said Turnpike Road respectively, in addition to the Money hereinbefore-mentioned, and which by this Act they are empowered to present the Costs and Expences of obtaining and passing this Act, with lawful Interest for the same, from the Time of advancing the same, so that the whole of such Costs and Expences, and Interest, be paid in Four successive presenting Terms after the passing of this Act, and that the same shall be applotted and levied as any other Money to be presented, raised or levied by virtue of this Act, or the said above-menioned Act could or might be applotted, raised or levied.

Publick Act.

VII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Publick Act, and shall be indicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices and others, without being specially pleaded.
