An A& for allowing further Time for the Completion of the Docks, Entrances, and other Works and Buildings belonging to the London Dock Company.

[20th May 1812.]

HEREAS the Time limited for the Completion of the Docks,
Basons, Entrances, and other Works and David London Dock Company, under an Act passed in the Fortieth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for making 40G.3.c.47. Wet Docks, Basons, Cuts, and other Works, for the greater Accommodation and Security of Shipping, Commerce, and Revenue, within the Port of London; and other Acts passed to amend and extend the Powers of the said Act; and which Period was extended by an Act passed in the Fortyfifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Act to alter 45 G. 3. c. 58. and amend an AEt passed in the Fortieth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for making Wet Docks, Basons, Cuts, and other Works, for the greater Accommodation and Security of the Shipping, Commerce, and Revenue within the Port of London, and for extending the Powers and Provisions of the said As, will expire on the Twentieth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and twelve: And whereas the greater Part of the Docks, Basons, Entrances, Wharfs, and other Works and Buildings authorized to be erecled, made, and built by the said London Dock Company, have been long completed, and in Use; but the whole of the Entrances, Works, and Buildings, authorized to be erected and made, cannot be completed within the said Period; and it is therefore necessary that such Period should [Loc. & Per.] be

continued and extended to 20th June 1814.

be extended, to enable the said Company to complete the same, for the Use of the Public: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the Period limited by the said last-recited Act of the Forty-fifth Year aforesaid, for the Completion of the Docks, Basons, Entrances, Cuts, Quays, and Wharfs, and other Works and Buildings authorized to be made, erected, and built by the said London Dock Company under the said Acts, shall be and the same is hereby extended to the Twentieth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and sourteen: And that all Powers, Authorities, Provisions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Clauses, Matters, and Things in relation to the making, erecting, building, and completing all such Docks, Basons, Entrances, Works, and other Buildings, contained in any Act made and now in force relating to the Completion thereof, shall be and remain and continue in full Force and Effect, for the Purposes of the several Acts relating to the Docks, Basons, Entrances, Works, and Buildings of the said London Dock Company, and the Completion thereof, during such further Period as aforesaid, as fully in all Respects and to all Intents and Purposes as if such extended Period had been given by the said recited Act of the Forty-fifth Year aforesaid, and as if such Powers, Authorities, Provisions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Claims, Matters, and Things had been specially and particularly re-enacted in and made Part of this Act.

Public Act.

II. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.
